Religious Education

Religious Education Registration Was Due Sept. 1st

***Forms are still being accepted. Please submit A.S.A.P.**

The following outlines our current plan for the upcoming year:

- Register your child for the next grade level (e.g. if they were in Level 5 for 2019-2020, they should be registered in Level 6 for 2020-2021).
- FIRST TIME REGISTRATIONS MUST INCLUDE A COPY OF THE CHILD'S BAPTISM CERTIFICATE.
- Students transferring to the program MUST INCLUDE COPIES OF SACRAMENTAL CERTIFICATES (Baptism/First Eucharist) and a "Transfer Letter" from the former program.
- All students will begin the 2020-2021 program as "Home Study". Families will be notified by email when textbooks are available for pick-up at the parish. A syllabus will be included indicating each week's lesson and expectations. Loyola Publishing (the publisher of our textbooks) has a wonderful on-line "fun" quiz your children will be directed to complete after each session/chapter.
- Tuition will stay the same again this year and is to be paid at time of registration: \$150 for one child, \$250 for two and \$325 for three or more. This can be done by cash/check or online by debit/credit card. Contact the office if you are experiencing financial difficulty.
- When we have clear direction and can offer a schedule of specific class options, families will be notified by email immediately. You will choose your child's class at that time – "first come, first choice" as always. Because your children will be working on their sessions/chapters according to the syllabus, they will all be at the same point in the textbook whenever we are able to begin classes.
- SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATION GROUPS (Level 2 & Level 8) will be expected to attend on-site classes when permitted.
- CONFIRMATION PROGRAM - When onsite classes begin, Level 7 will meet on Tuesdays 7:00-8:15 and Level 8 will meet on Wednesdays 7:00-8:15.

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

September 20, 2020

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 20: 1-16a

Jesus told his disciples this parable:

"The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying,

Continuation:

'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Reflection Questions

- How would you define the term "grace" in your own words? How is it different than "fair"? What is required of us to receive God's grace?
- Reflect on specific examples of God's grace in your life.
