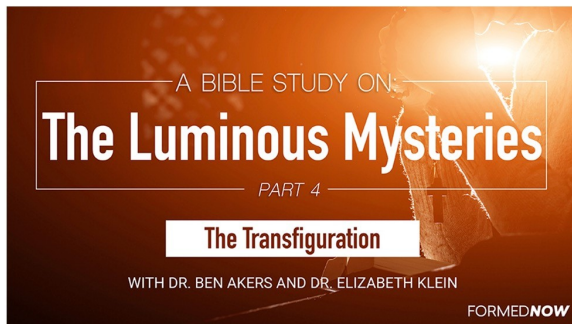

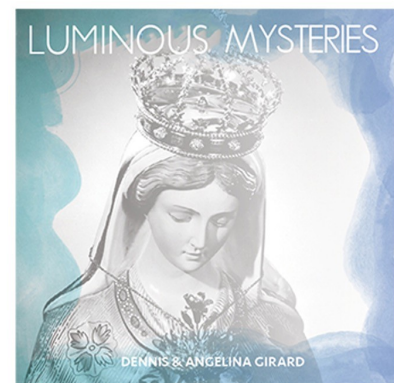
### LEARN A BIBLE STUDY ON THE LUMINOUS MYSTERIES: THE TRANSFIGURATION

## Religious Education

To the faithful families of our Religious Education Program:

Let me begin by thanking all of you for your continued support, patience and understanding during this unprecedented and challenging time. The unexpected severity and longevity of the pandemic created a need to recreate our program last year and continues to impact our plans moving forward. Traditionally our weekly classes for Levels 1-6 have been held at the Boyle Road School. The school is no longer offering use of the classrooms. Although home study was a worthwhile temporary option last year, nothing replaces the benefits and necessity of the group experience! Therefore, all classes will be held here at the church. As you are aware, our main church is under construction and available space is limited on campus. Despite that additional hurdle, last spring we were able to offer an eight-week mini session for Levels 2-6. Based on the success of that endeavor, we have developed our new schedule with a similar format. Classes will meet on site every other week for 75 minutes. Children will begin their session in the parish hall. They will be seated as a class with their catechist. After opening prayer, classes will gather separately in our upstairs meeting rooms. Class will end back in the parish hall including sign out and dismissal. There is a required "at home" assignment for alternating weeks when not on site. Loyola's "Interactive Session Reviews" (quizzes) will be required weekly for at home and on-site completed sessions/chapters. A detailed syllabus will be provided.

Levels 1-3 – Choose one grade-level class during the "Mary" week

Level 1 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

Level 2 meets every other Monday at 5:30 or Tuesday at 4:00

Level 3 meets every other Tuesday at 5:30 or Wednesday at 4:00

Levels 4-6 – Choose one grade-level class during the Joseph week

Level 4 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

Level 5 meets every other Monday at 5:30 or Tuesday at 4:00

Level 6 meets every other Tuesday at 5:30 or Wednesday at 4:00

Confirmation Preparation Program will return to our pre-COVID format. Confirmation classes meet every week. Class begins and ends in the parish hall. Classes will be seated together with their catechist. After opening prayer, classes will gather separately in our upstairs meeting rooms.

Level 7 meets EVERY TUESDAY from 7:00-8:15. Level 8 meets EVERY WEDNESDAY from 7:00-8:15.

**Registration Forms are available on our church website and at the parish office.** Overall class choice is first come-first served. However, this format offers us tremendous flexibility. After over a year of restrictions, we want to accommodate you to the absolute best of our ability!

Again, thank you for your flexibility and cooperation as we recreate the wheel for this year! Although this format may have its own challenges, we are thrilled to have the children actually here at church! This will enhance the overall catechesis and faith formation of the children and provide beautiful opportunities for prayer and worship!

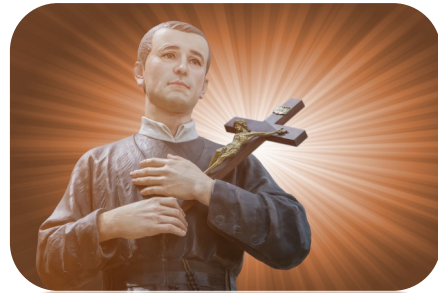

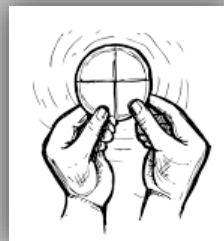

# Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

**August 8, 2021**

**Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**Jn 6:41-51**

The Jews murmured about Jesus because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven," and they said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Stop murmuring among yourselves. No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day. It is written in the prophets: *They shall all be taught by God.* Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

## Reflection Questions

- How do the "Jews" respond to Jesus when he claims to be the bread that came down from heaven?
- What does Jesus say that causes the "Jews" to argue and grumble even more?
- If you had heard Jesus' teaching that day, would you have had a difficult time following Jesus? How would you have responded to this hard teaching?
- When you are tempted to make Jesus something other than who he is, (a provider of free stuff, a teacher who tells us what we want to hear, a king of our own making), remind yourself that Jesus is the King that chose to lay down his life so that we could have eternal life.

Fr. Greg shared last week that all parishioners are invited to bring a rock with them to Mass with their family name written/painted on it that will be placed under where the new altar is going to be built. If you cannot attend that weekend, you can

### **Parts of the Mass**

#### **2. Liturgy of the Word**

Most of the Liturgy of the Word is made up of readings from Scripture. On Sundays and solemnities, there are three Scripture readings. During most of the year, the first reading is from the Old Testament and the second reading is from one of the New Testament letters. During Easter Time, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles which tells the story of the Church in its earliest days. The last reading is always taken from one of the four Gospels. In the Liturgy of the Word, the Church feeds the people of God from the table of his Word (cf. Sacrosanctum Concilium, no. 51). The Scriptures are the word of God, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. In the Scriptures, God speaks to us, leading us along the path to salvation. The Responsorial Psalm is sung between the readings. The psalm helps us to meditate on the word of God. The high point of the Liturgy of the Word is the reading of the Gospel. Because the Gospels tell of the life, ministry, and preaching of Christ, it receives several special signs of honor and reverence. The gathered assembly stands to hear the Gospel and it is introduced by an acclamation of praise. Apart from Lent, that acclamation is "Alleluia," derived from a Hebrew phrase meaning "Praise the Lord!" A deacon (or, if no deacon is present, a priest) reads the Gospel. After the Scripture readings, the celebrant preaches the homily. In the homily, the preacher focuses on the Scripture texts or some other texts from the liturgy, drawing from them lessons that may help us to live better lives, more faithful to Christ's call to grow in holiness. In many Masses, the Profession of Faith then follows the homily, either the Nicene or Apostles' Creed. The Nicene Creed is a statement of faith dating from the fourth century, while the Apostles' Creed is the ancient baptismal creed of the Church in Rome. If baptismal promises are renewed, from a formula based on the Apostles' Creed, this takes the place of the Creed.

The Liturgy of the Word concludes with the Universal Prayer, also called the Prayer of the Faithful. The gathered assembly intercedes with God on behalf of the Church, the world, and themselves, entrusting their needs to the faithful and loving God.
