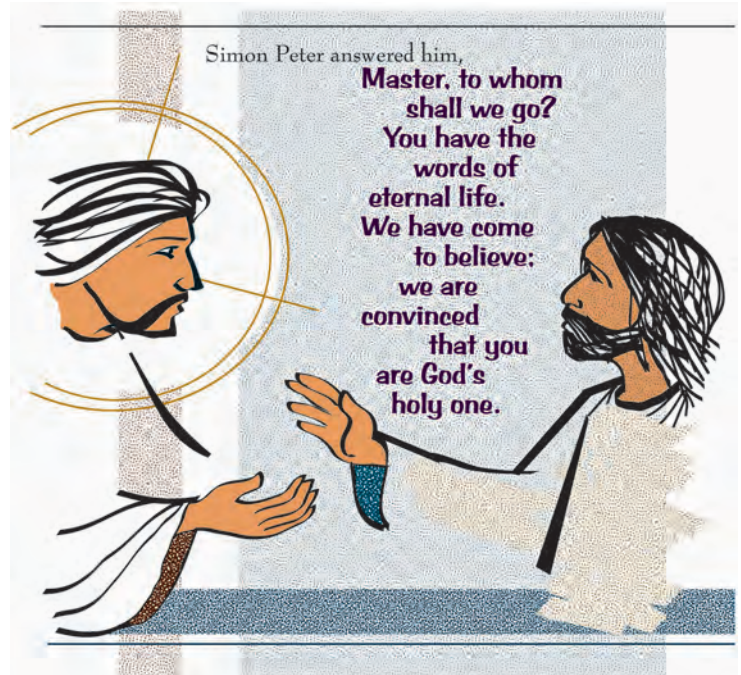

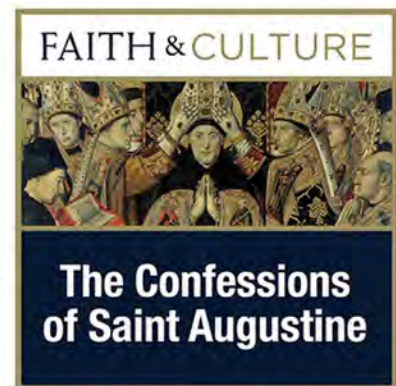

Religious Education

To the faithful families of our Religious Education Program:

Let me begin by thanking all of you for your continued support, patience and understanding during this unprecedented and challenging time. The unexpected severity and longevity of the pandemic created a need to recreate our program last year and continues to impact our plans moving forward. Traditionally our weekly classes for Levels 1-6 have been held at the Boyle Road School. The school is no longer offering use of the classrooms. Although home study was a worthwhile temporary option last year, nothing replaces the benefits and necessity of the group experience! Therefore, all classes will be held here at the church. As you are aware, our main church is under construction and available space is limited on campus. Despite that additional hurdle, last spring we were able to offer an eight-week mini session for Levels 2-6. Based on the success of that endeavor, we have developed our new schedule with a similar format. Classes will meet on site every other week for 75 minutes. Children will begin their session in the parish hall. They will be seated as a class with their catechist. After opening prayer, classes will gather separately in our upstairs meeting rooms. Class will end back in the parish hall including sign out and dismissal. There is a required "at home" assignment for alternating weeks when not on site. Loyola's "Interactive Session Reviews" (quizzes) will be required weekly for at home and on-site completed sessions/chapters. A detailed syllabus will be provided.

Levels 1-3 – Choose one grade-level class during the "Mary" week

Level 1 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

Level 2 meets every other Monday at 5:30 or Tuesday at 4:00

Level 3 meets every other Tuesday at 5:30 or Wednesday at 4:00

Levels 4-6 – Choose one grade-level class during the Joseph week

Level 4 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

Level 5 meets every other Monday at 5:30 or Tuesday at 4:00

Level 6 meets every other Tuesday at 5:30 or Wednesday at 4:00

Confirmation Preparation Program will return to our pre-COVID format. Confirmation classes meet every week. Class begins and ends in the parish hall. Classes will be seated together with their catechist. After opening prayer, classes will gather separately in our upstairs meeting rooms.

Level 7 meets EVERY TUESDAY from 7:00-8:15. Level 8 meets EVERY WEDNESDAY from 7:00-8:15.

Registration Forms are available on our church website and at the parish office. Overall class choice is first come-first served. However, this format offers us tremendous flexibility. After over a year of restrictions, we want to accommodate you to the absolute best of our ability!

Again, thank you for your flexibility and cooperation as we recreate the wheel for this year! Although this format may have its own challenges, we are thrilled to have the children actually here at church! This will enhance the overall catechesis and faith formation of the children and provide beautiful opportunities for prayer and worship!

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

August 29, 2021

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. — So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?” He responded, “Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written:

*This people honors me with their lips,
but their hearts are far from me;
in vain do they worship me,
teaching as doctrines human precepts.*

You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition.” He summoned the crowd again and said to them, “Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. “From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile.”

Reflection Questions

- What did the Pharisees think that Jesus' disciples ought to be doing?
- As part of the religious practice of the Pharisees and of some Jewish people, they washed their hands, purified their food utensils and said prayers while they did this. Some people thought that people who did these things were holier than people who didn't. What did Jesus say was a better indication of a person's holiness than washing one's hands and dishes?
- Jesus taught that the words and attitudes behind our actions are what show us to be holy people. Our religious observances and all our actions should show our total love and obedience to God. How can you be holy this week?

Parts of the Mass

5. Concluding Rite

During the Concluding Rites, announcements may be made (if necessary) after the Prayer after Communion. The celebrant then blesses the people assembled. Sometimes, the blessing is very simple. On special days, the blessing may be more extensive. In every case, the blessing is always trinitarian: "May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit." It is in the triune God and in the sign of the cross that we find our blessing.

After the blessing, the deacon dismisses the people. In fact, the dismissal gives the liturgy its name. The word "Mass" comes from the Latin word, "Missa." At one time, the people were dismissed with the words "Ite, missa est" (literally meaning "Go, she—meaning you, the Church—has been sent"). The word "Missa" is related to the word "missio," the root of the English word "mission." The liturgy does not simply come to an end. Those assembled are sent forth to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world. (USCCB)

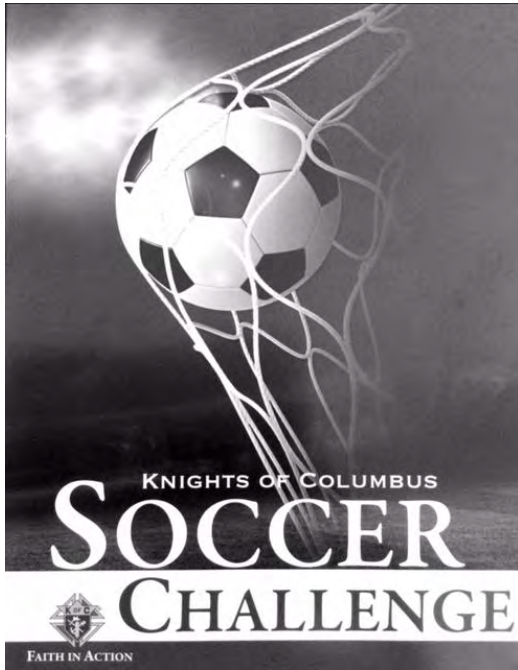

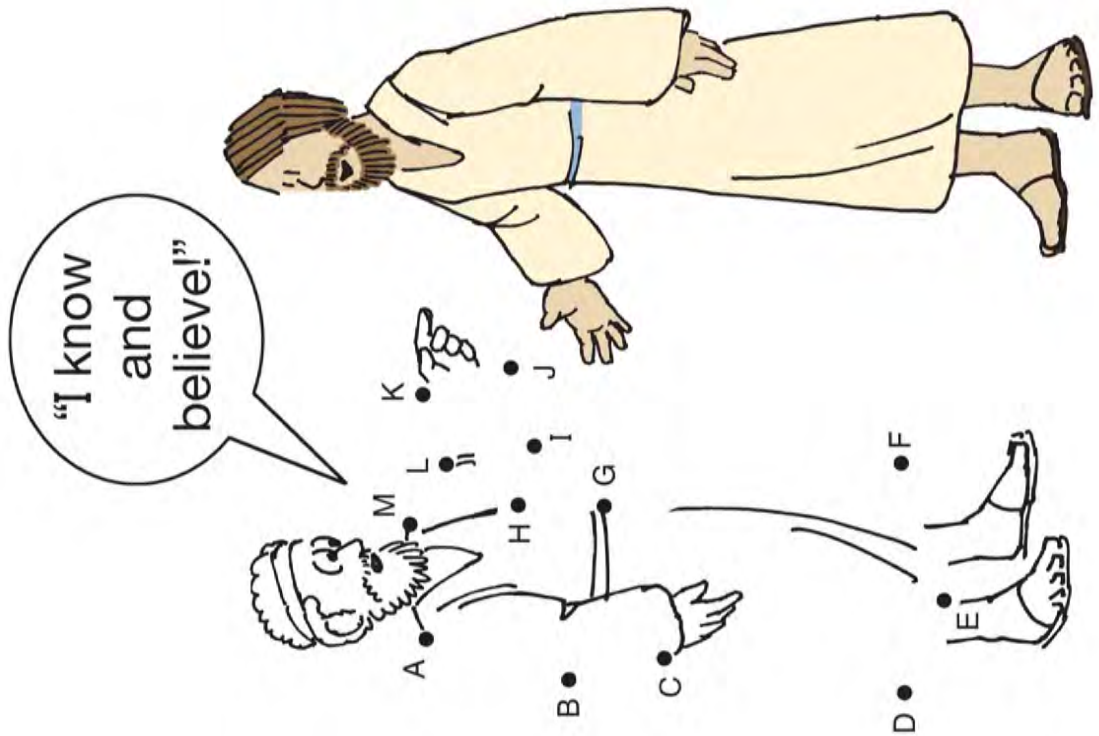

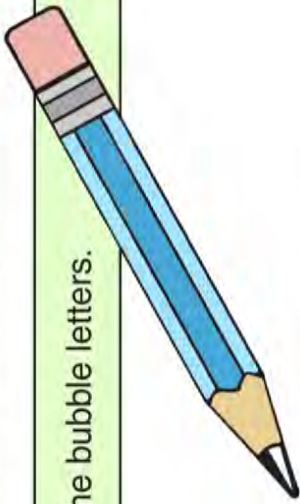
