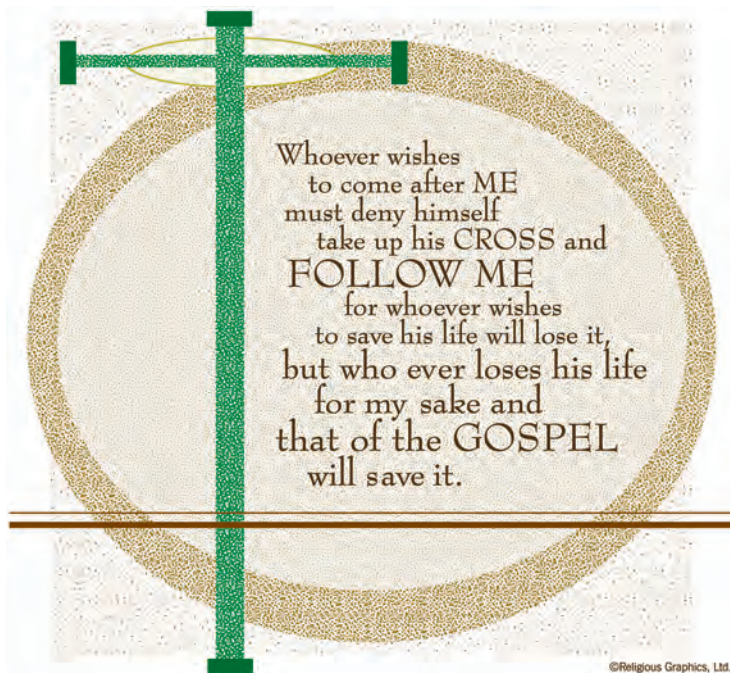

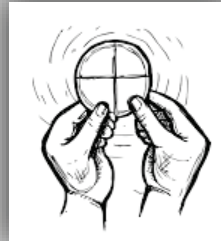

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

September 19, 2021

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 9:30-37

Jesus and his disciples left from there and began a journey through Galilee, but he did not wish anyone to know about it. He was teaching his disciples and telling them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise." But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him. They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

Reflection Questions

- Does it surprise you that the disciples soon after hearing about Jesus' impending death were arguing among themselves about who among them was the greatest?
- How does Jesus use a child to illustrate His point? Elsewhere, Jesus says that people are to be like little children, but here His point is different. How so?
- Based on Jesus' teaching here, what do you understand Jesus' definition of greatness to be? Is it right to strive for this kind of greatness? How can we do so in a humble, God-honoring way?

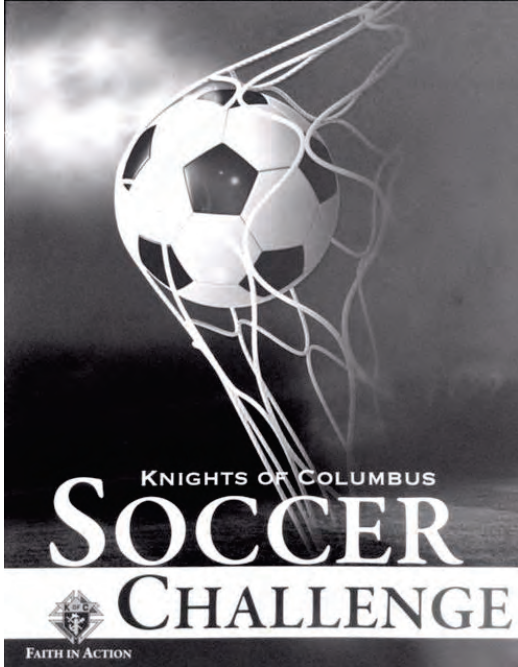

This weekend marks the 20th anniversary of the September 11th terrorist attacks which caused our nation so much sorrow and destruction, yet the pain that is still felt makes it seem like it was only yesterday. Nothing can be done to change the events of that fateful day, so we must remember to keep all the families and friends of those who lost their lives in our prayers. We ask God to help us let go of all bitterness, resentment and hatred, never fighting evil with evil, but to know that the only way to help ourselves or others is to face problems head on and to be able to let go of those things we cannot change. We ask You, gracious Father, to give us limitless patience in all we undertake and to help us know You are always with us, filling us with the peace and joy that comes to us when we share in Your creative process of new life and love. Amen

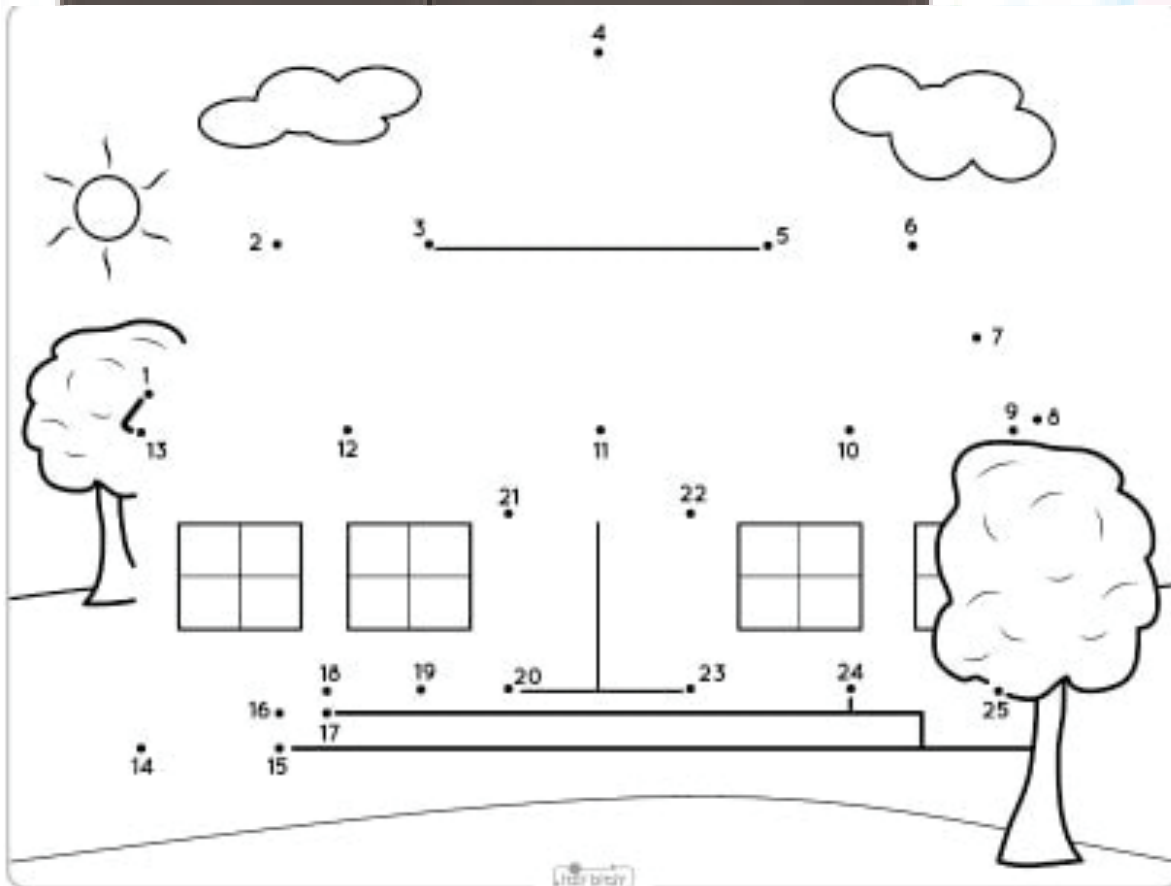
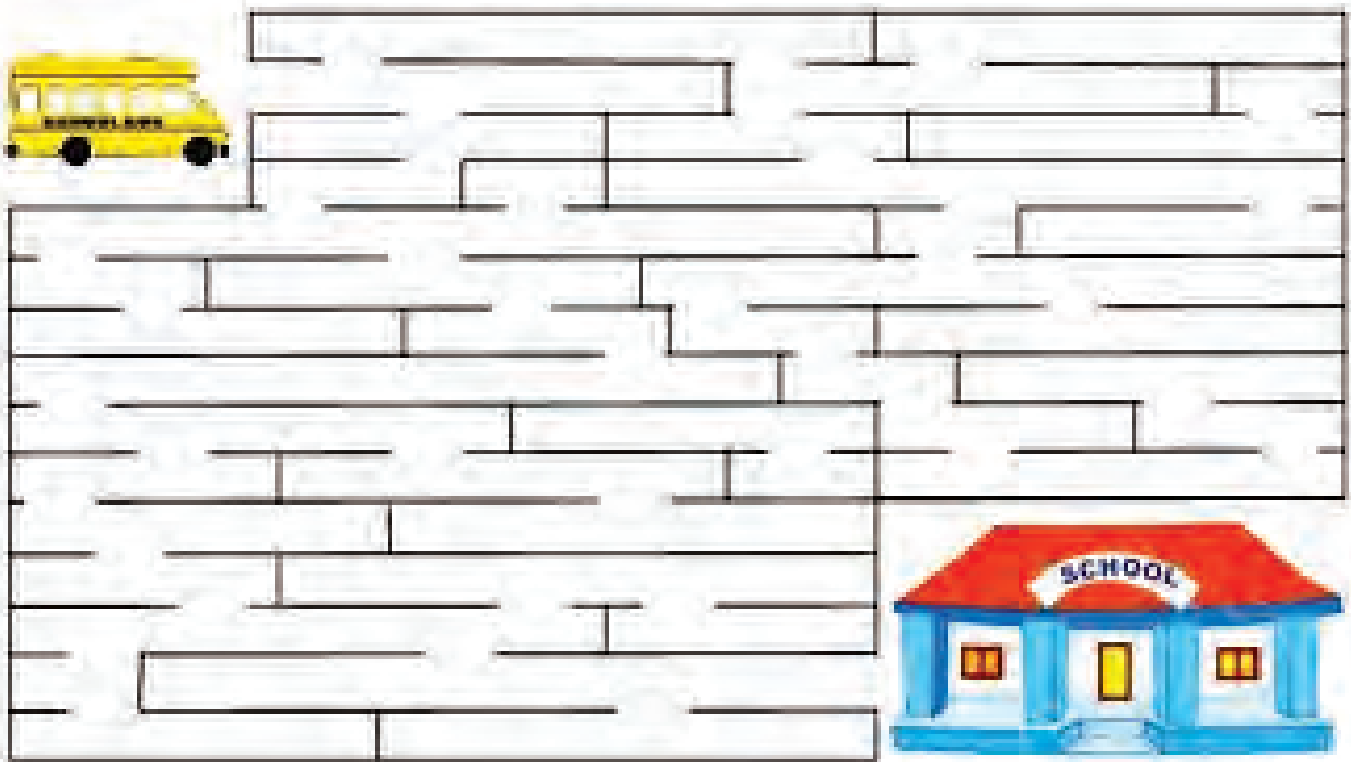

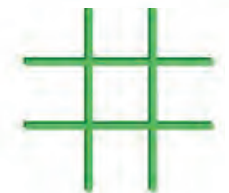
