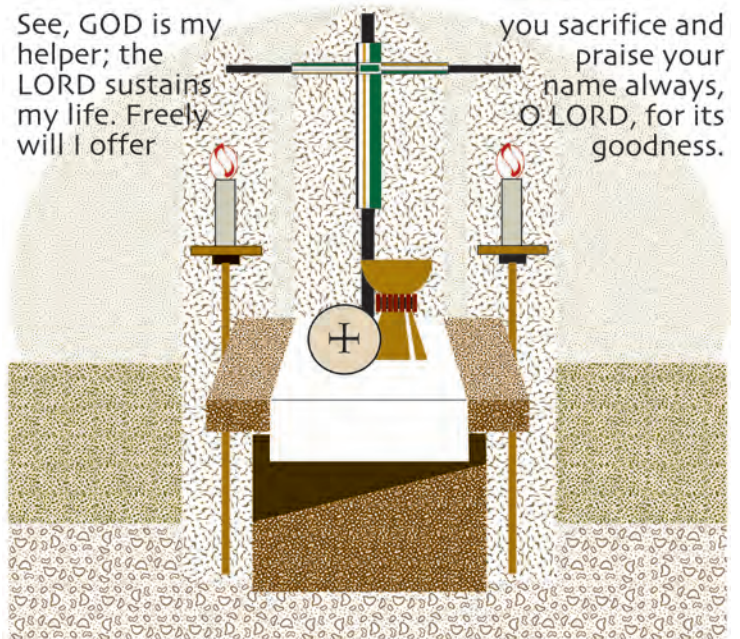

Dear Brothers and Sisters,


When I arrived at our parish three years ago, I immediately observed a vibrant, enthusiastic community. This was evidenced in the many groups that are active in providing services to both our parish and the wider community. From religious instruction to outreach services, there's something seemingly always going here at St. Gerard's! Among the groups that caught my attention quickly was the Knights of Columbus. In each parish where I've served, the Knights have been a staple. (I myself am a fourth degree Knight, having been one of the charter members with my Dad in our home parish's council, Ss. Philip & James.) I know well firsthand how much the KoC does for parishes, often in unseen but critical ways.

Last Wednesday, our KoC council held its annual Installation of Officers. This ceremony is a highlight of the year when those who will provide leadership and their families are recognized for their contribution to our community. Our friend, **Rich Schatzel**, will serve as the Grand Knight for the next two years. He will be assisted by a talented group of officers, all of whom are staunch supporters of our parish and willing servants in a variety of capacities. I am grateful to **Kevin Coco**, the outgoing Grand Knight, whose tenure was marked by historic challenges due to the pandemic. While so many groups were forced to halt operations, the Knights provided critical service in collected needed items for our outreach and helping those in the community most in need. Kevin and his brother Knights stepped up to challenge!

The history of the Knights of Columbus is rich. Founded by Father Michael McGivney in 1882, it was intended to provide assistance to orphans and widows at a time when social services were virtually nonexistent. Today, the fraternal order boasts well over a million members worldwide and its founder was recently beatified by Pope Francis, making Blessed Michael McGivney only step away from sainthood. Often called the "right hand of the Church," the order is always there when needs arise on global and local levels to respond however required.

I encourage the men of our parish to consider prayerfully joining our parish's vibrant council. Their works of service are grounded in the order's hallmarks of unity, charity, fraternity and patriotism. I have no doubt they and their families will be proud of this historic and life-giving organization.

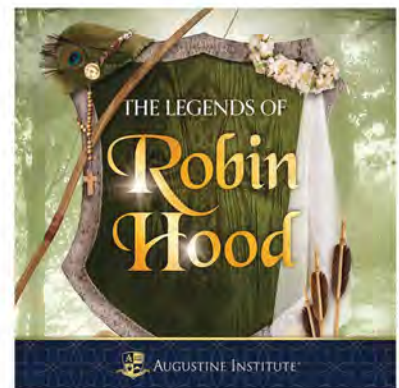

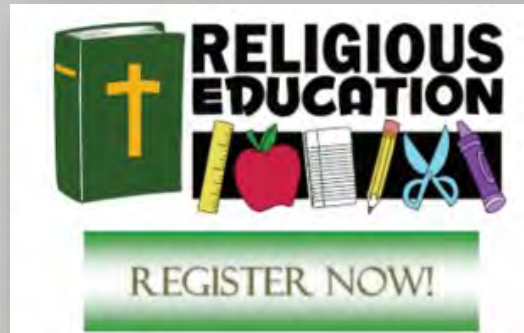

Levels 1-3 – Choose one grade-level class during the “Mary” week

Level 1 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

Level 2 meets every other Monday at 5:30 or Tuesday at 4:00

This will enhance the overall catechesis and faith formation of the children and provide beautiful opportunities for prayer and worship!

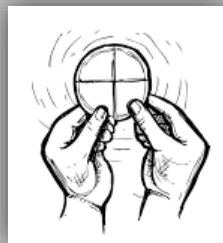

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

September 26, 2021

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward. "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'"

Reflection Questions

- What reply did Jesus give to his disciples about their action? What did Jesus say about this person?
- What did Jesus tell his disciples would make them great? Do you think God cares if people are famous? What will make us great in God's eyes?
- Feelings of fear, anger, envy or jealousy can be perfectly normal and healthy, but they can become obstacles that lead us to sin when they are out of control. Sometimes even our friends can lead us to sin. Does this describe anyone in your life? Is there something or someone in my life that is a source of sin for me? What is something you can do to "cut off" the control that this person, situation or feelings have on your actions?



Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend “SPECIALIZED” training in addition to BASIC training. 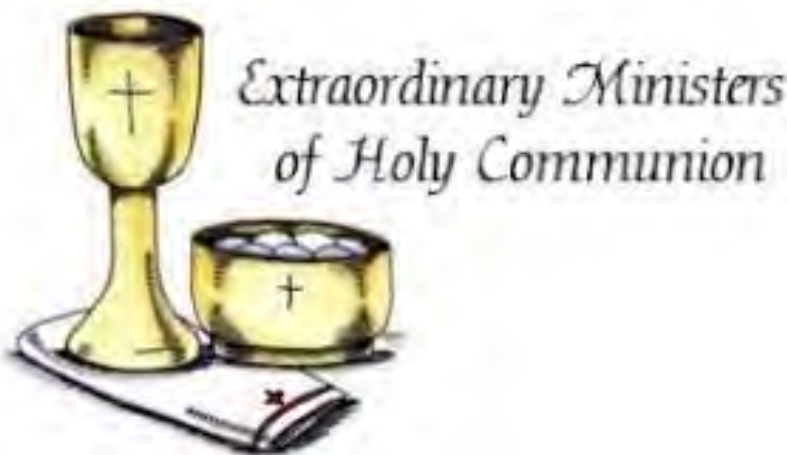

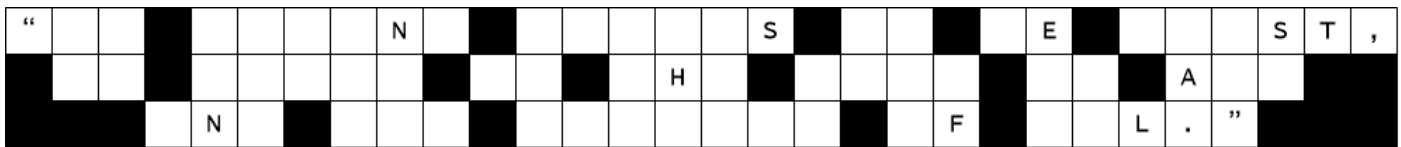
