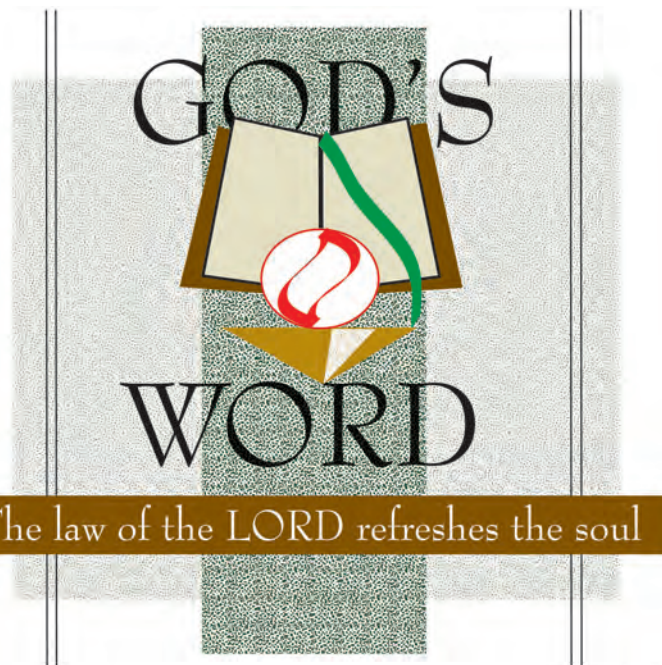

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Gerard's,


This weekend, I would like to draw your attention to three items worth noting. First, the **Mass book for 2022** is now open so that you can request intentions for Mass next year. This is a good opportunity to remind ourselves of the important Catholic tradition of having Mass offered for loved ones and particular intentions. Since the earliest days of Christianity, disciples knew that the Eucharist was efficacious not only for those who receive Holy Communion but also for those for whom the sacrifice of the Mass is offered, whether alive or deceased. Since then, it's been common to have a Mass "said" for someone. This means that the graces of Mass can be attributed the soul of the intended person or to the intention desired. During the intercessions, to differentiate between those who are alive and deceased, our custom here is to say simply the name of a deceased person but to say, "for the intentions of [*name*]" for those who are living. Mass can also be offered for particular needs such as world peace, the end of abortion, for an increase of vocations to the priesthood, etc.

Second, next Saturday we have the annual **Blessing of Animals** on the Great Lawn at noon. The feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of animals and ecology, is October 4th, so it's customary on a day near his feast to hold this event. Not only is it fun to see parishioners' pets of all varieties, it's also an important time for us to consider how we act as the stewards of God's creation. One of the hallmarks of Pope Francis' papacy has been the attention he's drawn to the need for the human family to be mindful of how we care for all aspects of creation. In the book of Genesis, we're told that God set mankind over all the earth and animals in a particular way. Such a gift comes with tremendous responsibility. Each of us is called to do our part to ensure God's creation flourishes and is protected.

Finally, in a few weeks we celebrate **our patronal feast of St. Gerard Majella**. You will see the ad in this weekend's bulletin. Over the past few years, this Mass has attracted not only our parishioners but also many people from all over our diocese who want to come and offer gratitude for answered prayers through the intercession of St. Gerard. It's also an opportunity for those families struggling to have children to pray for healing and strength as they bear their cross. I'm sure many of us know couples in this situation, so perhaps we can gently invite them to this Mass in the hopes of bring peace to a challenging time.

As we enter the fall months, these wonderful traditions remind us of God's closeness to us and our ability to walk with him in faith. Have a wonderful week!

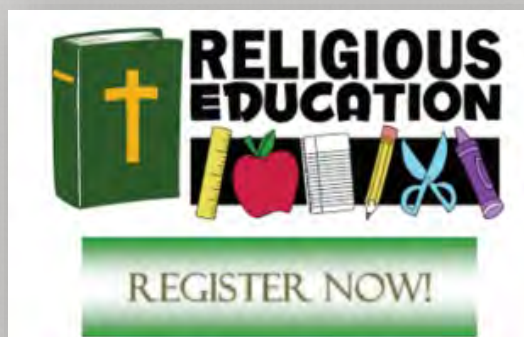

Levels 1-3 – Choose one grade-level class during the “Mary” week

Level 1 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

Level 2 meets every other Monday at 5:30 or Tuesday at 4:00

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

October 3, 2021

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 10:2-16

The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" They were testing him. He said to them in reply, "What did Moses command you?" They replied, "Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her." But Jesus told them, "Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. *For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.* So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery." And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Then he embraced them and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

Reflection Questions

- Why do you think that the Pharisees wanted to test Jesus? What do Jesus' responses to the Pharisees indicate about God's design and plan for marriage?
- How do you think that you as a disciple of Jesus Christ can receive God's kingdom like a child?
- It seems like these two scenes are unrelated, but hearing them together teaches us something very important. God wants to help us honor our commitments to one another. To do this, we must be like children before God, trusting him completely and depending upon his help. The Church teaches us that the Sacrament of Marriage strengthens our commitment and gives married couples the gift of the Holy Spirit to help them honor their promises to one another. How can you honor your commitments this week?
