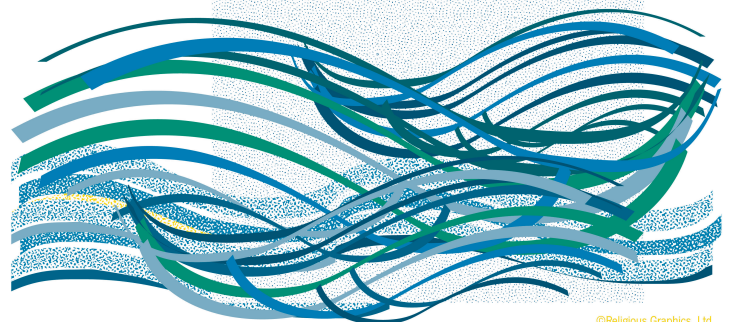

## A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Gerard's,

As I have remarked to you on more than one occasion during my time here as Pastor, a least favorite topic of mine is the discussion of money. I, too, know well the stereotype that all pastors ever talk about is the budget, or the latest fundraiser, or the need for more capital improvements. Admittedly, given our ongoing building project, some of that is true about my time here. But I hope I have been able to make it clear to you what we're doing, how the project is being completed and the reasonable financial means by which we are achieving it. In all of that, I am grateful beyond measure for the generosity of so many who are making these dreams a reality.

I'd like to draw your attention to another way you can demonstrate your generosity to the wider church community. I am sure you are aware of the Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA). It is the annual collection that enables the diocese to do its work of evangelization, education, service to the poor and a variety of other ministries throughout all of Long Island. For a few years of my priestly ministry, I had four jobs simultaneously – directing the program that trained men to be permanent deacons, chaplain at Hofstra University, Vice Rector of our Seminary in Huntington and Associate Director for Interreligious Affairs. None of those ministries is set within a parish, so they have to be funded by the support of the CMA. I have witnessed firsthand the result of having dynamic, vibrant programs for all those who desire to deepen their faith in and their knowledge of our Catholic Faith.

At present, our parish is at only 40% of its CMA goal for 2021. I realize the burdens many continue to shoulder in the wake of the pandemic and the rising rates of inflation. I also remember that we're in the midst of our capital campaign redemption as well as regular weekly offerings. While it may seem overbearing, I simply ask that each one prayerfully considers joining with the 144 families in our parish who have made a pledge or donation to the CMA. While we may not make 100% of our goal, every little bit helps, and we can have a lasting impact on the people of our diocese.

On the next page you'll see information about the CMA and how you can be part of it. Every dollar raised goes exclusively to the manifold ministries overseen by our diocese. Allow me to express my sincere appreciation for the many ways you generously support our diocese and our parish with your time, talent and treasure!

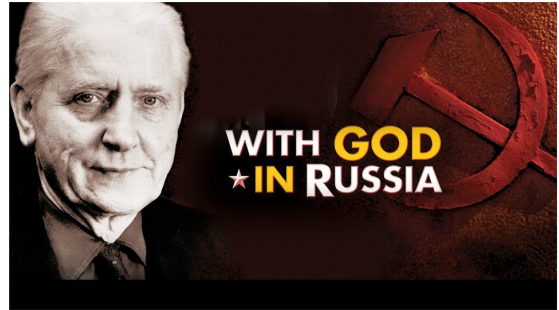

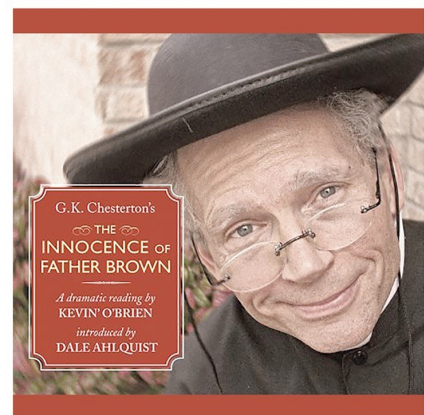
### LEARN THE CONFESSIONS OF ST. AUGUSTINE, SIX-PART SERIES

Levels 1-3 – Choose one grade-level class during the “Mary” week

Level 1 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

Level 2 meets every other Monday at 5:30 or Tuesday at 4:00

Level 3 meets every other Tuesday at 5:30 or Wednesday at 4:00

Levels 4-6 – Choose one grade-level class during the Joseph week

Level 4 meets every other Monday at 4:00 or Wednesday at 5:30

### **Ways to Celebrate Your Values on Halloween**

Your kids can research their favorite saint or the saint they're named after. They could also dress up as their favorite saint for Halloween.

Tell your children that Halloween can be a festive day to kick off the celebration of All Saints Day. We ask the saints—our spiritual ancestors—to pray for us on our own journey to holiness. At breakfast, recite a short litany of family members who have died and whom you remember in your prayers. After each name, have everyone say, “Pray for us.”

Have fun! Make a special meal for dinner. Here's a quick idea for a healthy meal to offset the abundance of candy. Give each child a paper plate. Put out bowls of olives, cucumbers, radishes, raisins, dried apricots or cranberries, cheese sticks, and cold cuts. Have the kids make faces on their plates with the food. # Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

**October 31, 2021**

**Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**Mk 12:28b-34**

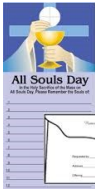
One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: *Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.*

The second is this: *You shall love your neighbor as yourself.* There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices.'" And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

## Reflection Questions

- Why is the focus of the command on loving God from the inner life of heart, soul, and mind?
- Jesus combines the command to love God with loving your neighbor – How does each command relate to the other?
- How might you go about obeying the 1st commandment with all your heart, soul, mind and strength?
- Why is living God's way not a burden but freedom?
- Most of the commandments are stated as something that you should NOT do. How would you re-word the 1st commandment so that it is something you SHOULD do?

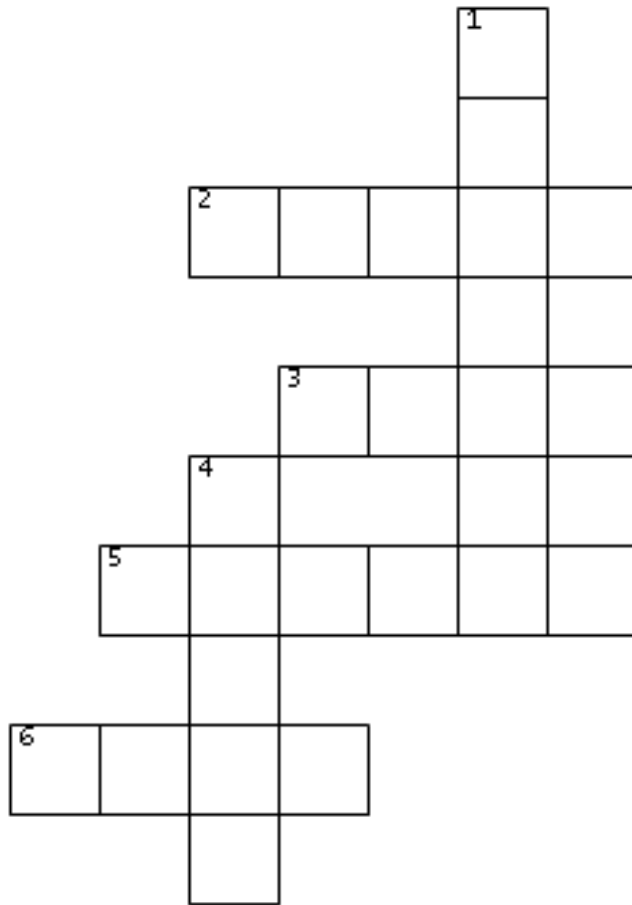
**2021 Thanksgiving Food Drive**

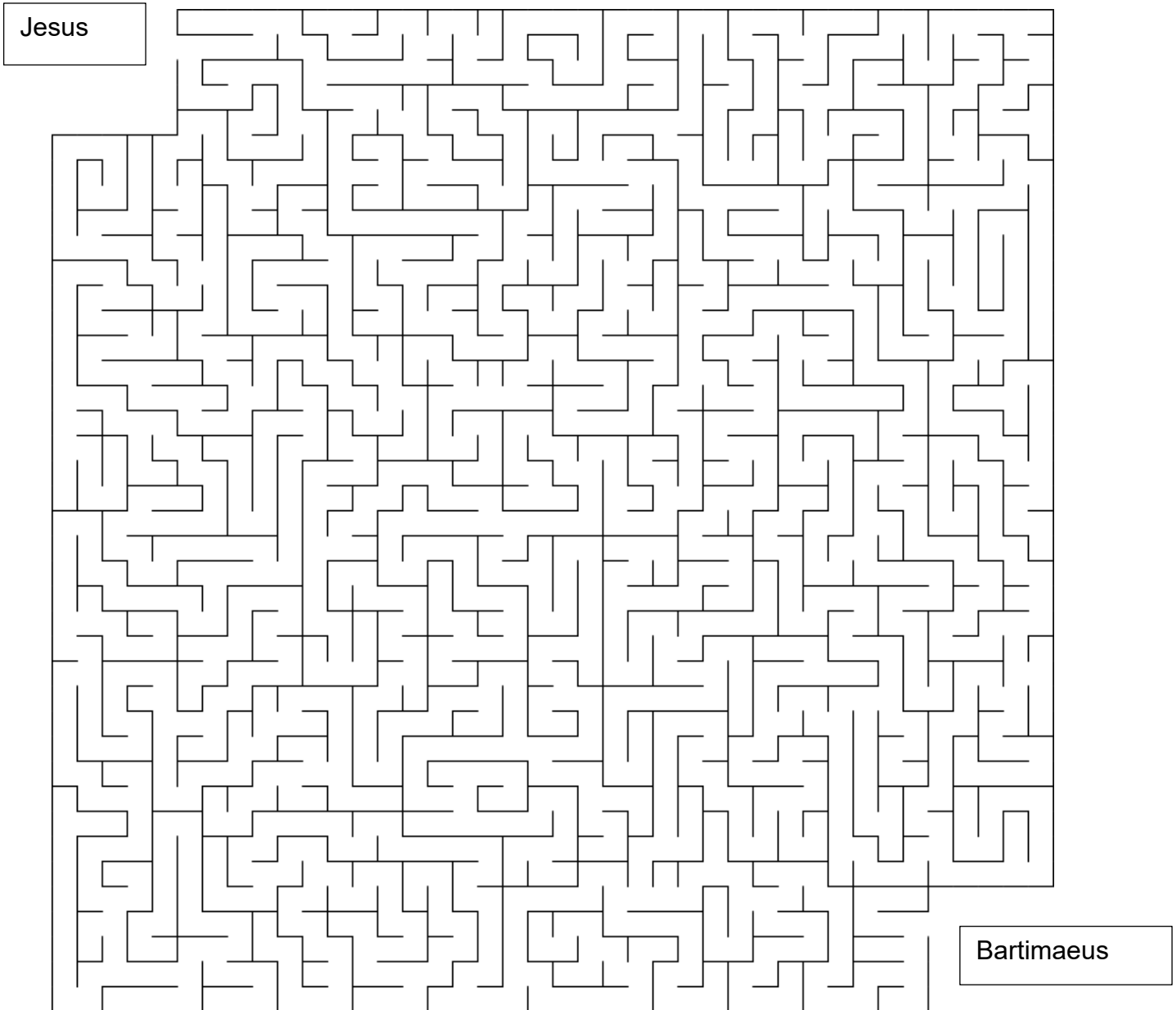

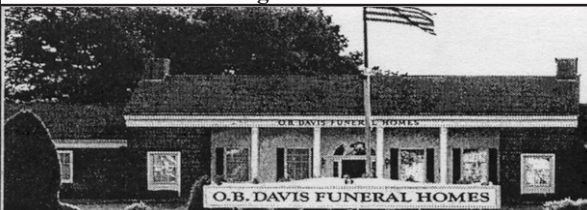
