A Message from the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Gerard's,


We turn the calendar to a new month! As we begin this week, we note several items of importance. First, on Monday, we celebrate the Solemnity of **All Saints' Day**, and on Tuesday, **All Souls' Day**, we are reminded of that sacred Catholic belief in the "Communion of Saints." We draw strength that the Church is a trifold reality – those who have reached the joys of heaven, those on their way to the beatific vision and we who are still on earth striving each day to live virtuous lives. At every Mass, not only is the gathered assembly present, but we are joined also by the "great cloud of witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1) with whom we share a closeness in intercession. As I often tell grieving families during a funeral, some things about our loved ones who have died will move into the past tense – what they did; where they lived; what they liked. But some things will always remain in the present tense – our love, our concern and our prayers for them, and theirs for us. Mass is that paramount moment when we, the Communion of Saints, are joined together in adoration and intercession.

Although the obligation to attend Mass on All Saints' Day is lifted this year because it falls on a Monday, we at St. Gerard's are still marking the day by having Mass at 9:00am and again at 12:00pm. I encourage you to attend. Then, on Tuesday, we commemorate all our beloved dead who have gone home to God. In addition to the regular 9:00am Mass, there will be an additional one at 7:30pm during which we will remember in a special way those from our parish who have died during the past year. This is always a moving time of prayer for families. Whether you have experienced the death of a loved one recently or years ago, this special Mass will be marked by a certain healing grace.

The month of November has traditionally been marked by the Church as a time to intensify our prayer for those who have died. It is a wonderful practice to offer Mass for their happy repose, to pray the rosary or to offer some other penance for them. You can also seek a plenary indulgence – the remission of the effects of sin – for one who has already died as well as for yourself. Whatever we choose to do, we should do something to unite ourselves to those in purgatory who, like us, long for a place of perfect refreshment, light and peace in heaven.

Finally, Tuesday, in addition to being All Souls' Day, is **Election Day**. Since it is neither a presidential or congressional election, many might consider it to be an "off year." However, we should still exercise our great right to vote for our leaders and for propositions that affect the community. Voting is one of the most crucial ways in which we help to shape the course of worldly affairs, hopefully to make them more in line with the Kingdom of God. And, of course, we need to be praying for our elected officials to be given wisdom and charity in their important work.

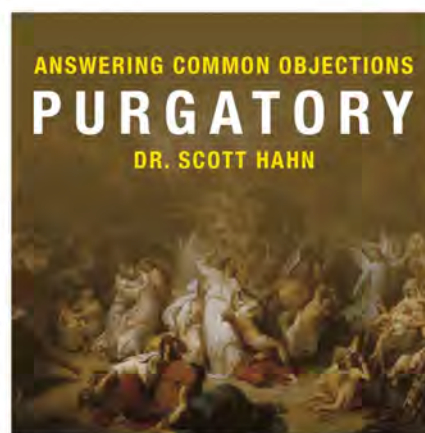

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

November 7, 2021

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 12:38-44

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation." He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

Reflection Questions

- What is the "greater condemnation" the scribes will receive? Why does Jesus reserve it for these particular people?
- According to Jesus, what is the difference between the widow's offering and everyone else's?
- Jesus made the poor widow's gift of a few coins a memorable example of generosity. Even though she gave a lesser amount to the treasury than others, her small donation required a greater sacrifice than the large donations contributed by those who were rich. God wants us to share generously with others, giving not just from our surplus but from our whole self. How can you give of your whole self this upcoming week?

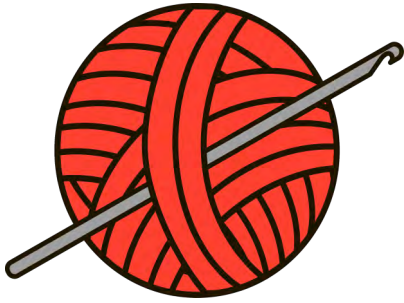
