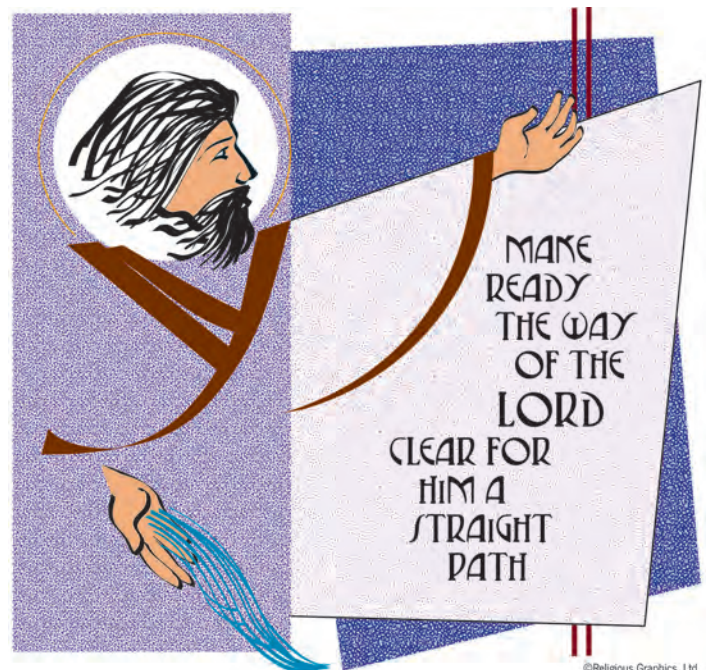

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Gerard's,

Last weekend, at the conclusion of Mass, I shared with you some updates on the church construction project. I must admit that the positive feedback I received after each Mass was very humbling. So many of you have expressed your gratitude to Deacon Frank and me for our hard work on this long-term project. But the truth is that, while this indeed has been a daunting undertaking for the two of us – one which we never anticipated we would ever have in ordained ministry – it is you who deserve the gratitude. Your steadfastness, trust and patience through this three-year journey has been edifying for us. Thank you, again, for being faithful partners in this work of faith.

And to remind you, next weekend – the third in our Advent journey – we will have another opportunity to go into the church and see the extraordinary progress that has been made. If you were able to join us for our first sneak peak in mid-August, you will remember that the space was largely gutted from its original state. The floor, as well as the large storage area that was behind the altar for many years, had been entirely removed. Since then, so much has been completed that I am sure you will be astounded. When we gather, and after you have had a chance to look all around, I would like to discuss with you three topics. First, I will point out the work that has been completed, including some things either that were needed unexpectedly or enhancements we felt were crucial to the overall beauty of the church. Second, I will note those items that still need to be completed. And, finally, I will indicate those aspects of our original design that, at this point, we have decided to remove and the reasons for doing so. Then, given all that information, as a parish family sometime in the Spring, we will be able to have a conversation about if, and how, we might like to add those remaining items. No church – indeed no home or public building for that matter – is ever really done. There is always something more to be added, renovated or improved. I believe firmly, however, that our finished product will be something we all will be proud to call our church and, just as importantly, will be what we can reasonably afford at present.

Finally, this Wednesday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Please be sure to join us for one of the Masses that will be offered. (See the listing of Masses in this bulletin.) There is also information about extended opportunities this month, as we approach Christmas, for the sacrament of Confession. St. John the Baptist, the voice crying out in the wilderness, says to us: "Prepare the way of the Lord." May we harken to that call and open our hearts more widely to the grace this season affords us.

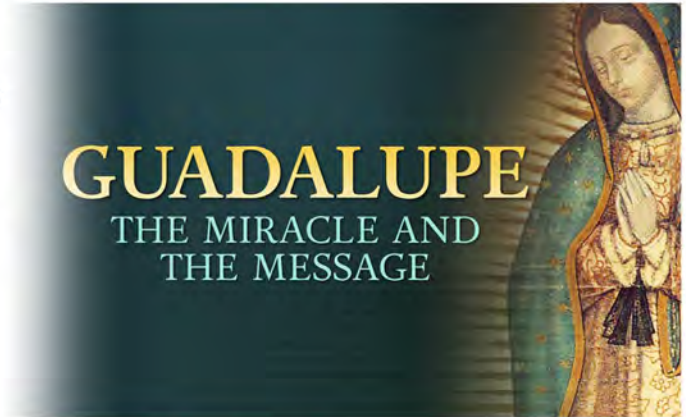

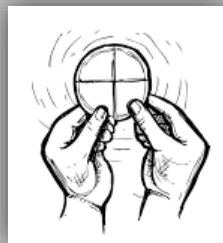

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

December 12, 2021

Third Sunday of Advent

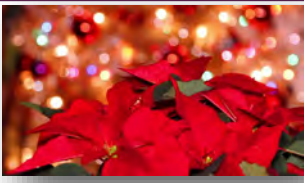
Lk 3: 10-18

The crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" He said to them in reply, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages." Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

Reflection Questions

- Which groups question John? How does John respond?
- How do the actions identified by John point to true repentance?
- John makes specific, concrete suggestions for each of the groups who question him. Our desire to make ready for Jesus will be more sincere if we can identify one specific change we might make in our lives to prepare the way of the Lord. What is one specific change you might make during Advent to prepare for Jesus?
