## *A Message from the Pastor*

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I did a few weeks ago, I want to share with you some exciting updates about our new church. The crucifix which hung over the sanctuary for decades was refurbished and recolored with a dark ebony stain, which makes it stand out prominently in the new sanctuary.

The two altars were delivered and installed last Monday. The “altar of repose” is in the back of the sanctuary and is the one on which the tabernacle will be placed directly under the crucifix. The “altar of sacrifice,” the one on which the Eucharist is consecrated at Mass, was placed nearer to the steps. If you’re wondering, the altar of repose weighs about 800 pounds and the larger altar a little over 1,000! Hence, it took 8 strong men to move it into position as seen below!

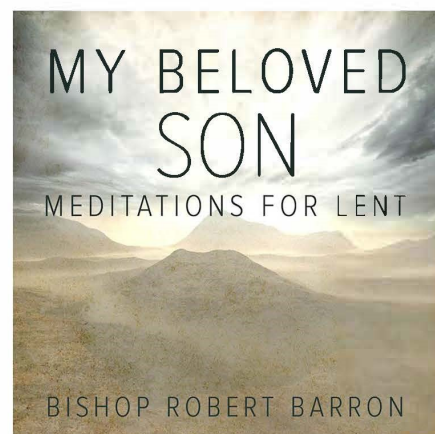

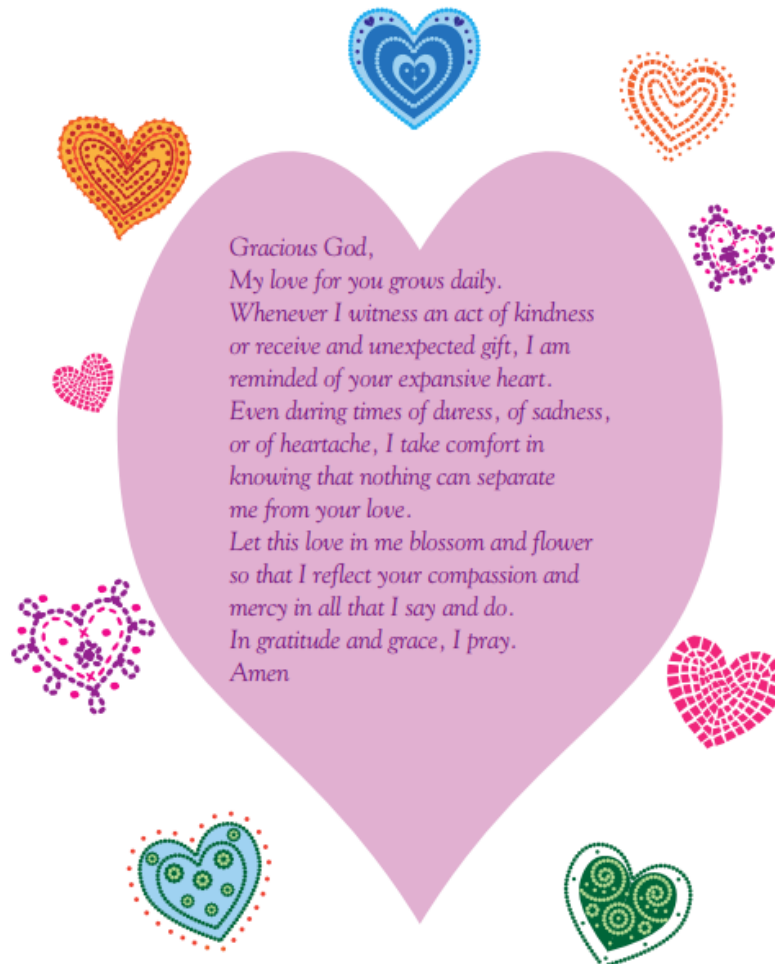

# Breaking Open the Word

**Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?**

**February 20, 2022**

**Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**Lk 6:27-38**

Jesus said to his disciples: "To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. "Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

## Reflection Questions

- How does Jesus say that we should behave with one another?
- Do you often choose to act in these ways? Why or why not?
- This Gospel tells us that God gives us unlimited chances to act in loving ways toward others. We know that God shows mercy to us by forgiving us and by giving us another chance to choose to follow his ways. God wants us to be merciful just as he is merciful. This means that God expects us to give each other unlimited chances. How can you show mercy during this coming week?

**St. Gerard Majella Handkerchiefs**



Only one instance is recorded of St. Gerard curing an expectant mother of her illness while he was alive, but there were many women who claimed that they and their children were granted

graces through the prayers of Gerard. The famous "handkerchief story" goes like this: While he was leaving the house of a family he had gone to visit, he dropped his handkerchief. A young woman retrieved it, but as she handed it to him, Gerard told her mysteriously, "Keep it. One day it will be of service to you." Although puzzled, the woman did keep it. And a few years later, she faced life threatening complications as she was about to give birth to her first child. She remembered the mysterious hanky and the promise, and asked that it be brought to her in her travail. She held it to her womb and immediately the pain ceased and she delivered a normal, healthy child.

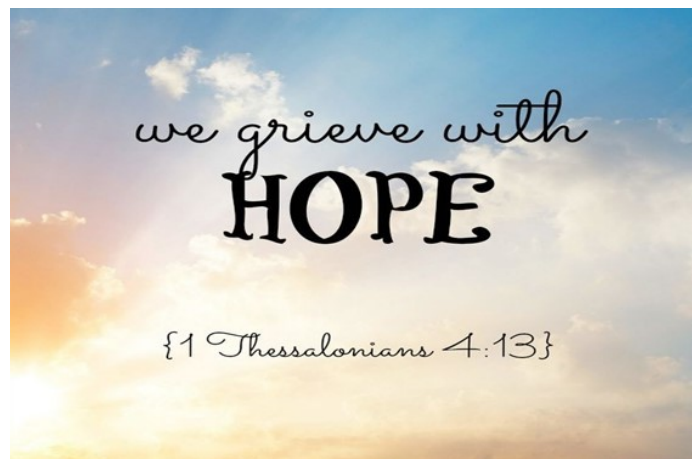

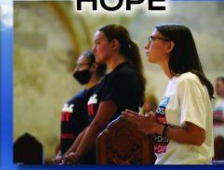
