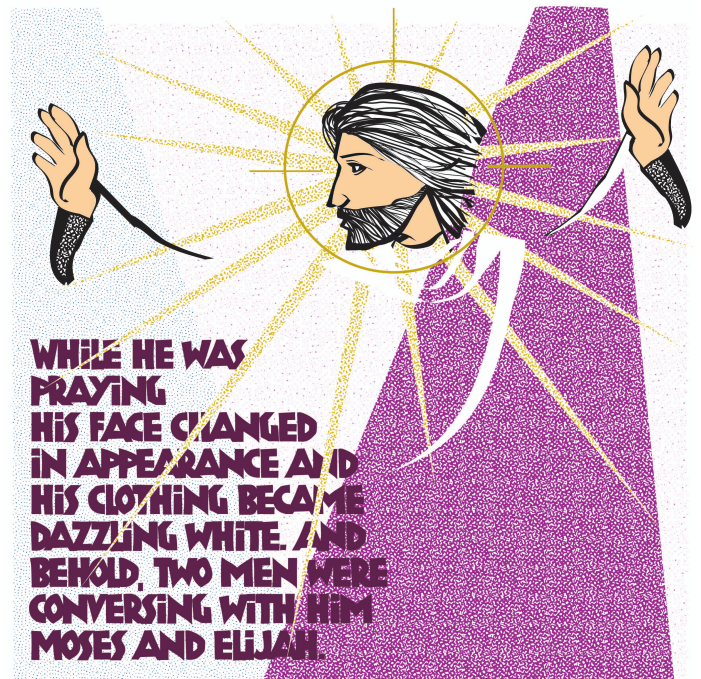

## *A Message from the Pastor*

Dear Friends of St. Gerard's,

As we continue our Lenten Mission, I am happy to welcome Bishop Richard Henning to be with us this Thursday. Bishop Henning is not only a wonderful pastor, but also a dear friend and mentor to me. For three wonderful years, I served with him at our diocese's seminary in Huntington. As Rector, he was charged with reimagining the seminary from being primarily a house of formation for men entering the priesthood into a center for spirituality as the largest Catholic retreat and conference center in the tri-state area. As his Vice Rector, I saw Bishop Henning's creativity, pastoral zeal and love for the scripture come alive on a daily basis.

Bishop Henning attended Chaminade High School in Mineola, New York and counts the Marianists as a major influence in his faith life and commitment to learning. He received a BA and MA in History from St. John's University, Queens New York and received his training for the priesthood at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington New York. He was ordained in 1992 and served for five years as an associate pastor at the Church of St. Peter of Alcantara, Port Washington. In that assignment, he did extensive pastoral work in the large parish school and ministered to the Spanish-speaking Catholics of that peninsula.

In 1997, Bishop McGann assigned then Father Henning to post-graduate studies in Sacred Scripture. He earned a Licentiate in Biblical Theology at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. and a Doctorate in the same field from the University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, Italy. After his studies, Bishop Henning joined the faculty of the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington, where he taught scripture for more than ten years.

In 2012, the Bishops of Rockville Centre, Brooklyn and New York also charged him to establish and lead the Sacred Heart Institute for the ongoing formation of Catholic priests and deacons. Bishop Henning is also noted for his work with international priests serving in the U.S. Most recently, Bishop Henning serves as the Vicar for Clergy in our diocese, working all priests and deacons in a variety of capacities.

As we continue to reflect on Fr. Sureau's amazing message last week, may our hearts be open to pondering anew this week with Bishop Henning what it means to be people of God's holy Word in sacred scripture.

# Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

**March 20, 2022**

**Third Sunday of Lent**

**Luke 13:1-9**

Some people told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did! Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than everyone else who lived in Jerusalem? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!"


And he told them this parable:

"There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.'"

## Reflection Questions

- What did Jesus hear about a group of Galileans? What explanation for the tragedy did Jesus propose? How did Jesus reply to His own question?
- What were Jesus' listeners to learn from the two stories?
- In the parable, what did the man seek from his fig tree? Where was the fig tree?
- What can you do to comfort, help, or encourage someone who is suffering this week?
- What step of repentance would communicate to God your gratitude for second chances?

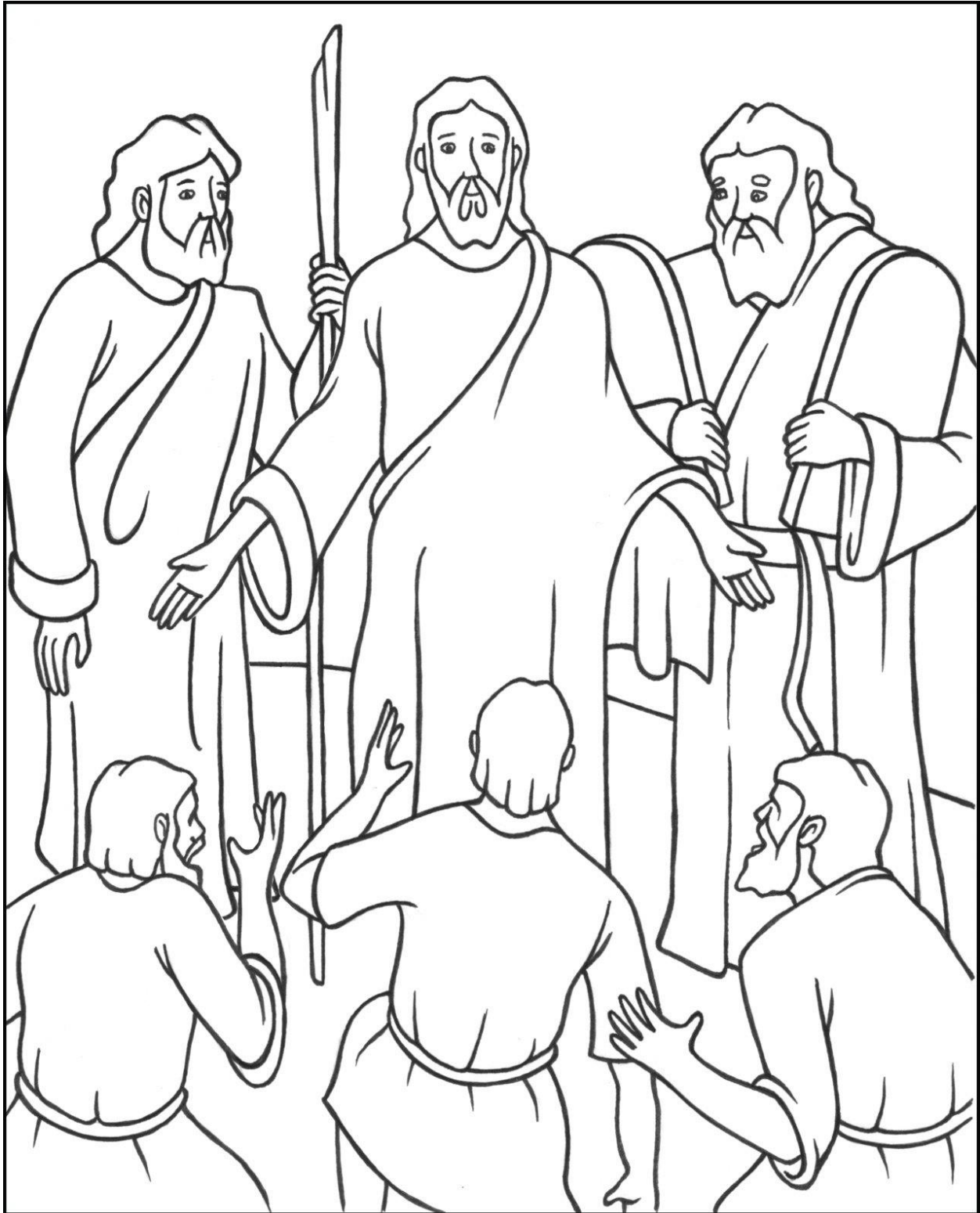
