A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Gerard's,

As we continue our Lenten journey, this coming week's Parish Mission challenges us to consider more deeply our identity as baptized members of the Church. Our presenter on Thursday evening will be Deacon Kevin McCormack. Dedicating his professional career to Catholic education, Deacon McCormack is the Principal of Xaverian High School in Brooklyn, where he has been a teacher and administrator for the last 37 years. He has taught in the Theology Department at Molloy college for over 30 years and the co-host of WABC's "Religion on the Line" for 12 years. He was ordained a deacon for our diocese in 2002 and serves in Our Lady of Peace Parish in Lynbrook. Deacon Kevin has presented parish missions, days of reflections, theological study days and adult education courses throughout the Brooklyn and RVC Dioceses and the Archdioceses of Newark and New York. He and his wife, Regina, live in Lynbrook. They have four adult children.

Like our own deacons, Deacon Kevin has a unique perspective of Baptism as both a minister of the sacrament and a father. He has seen and experienced the extraordinary grace of lives being transformed as souls are grafted onto Christ and become one with the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church. For all the baptized, that moment is one that begins our journey to sainthood!

Speaking of Baptism, you probably know that one of the highlights of the Easter season is celebrating the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. For adults, the process of preparing for these sacraments is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). This program consists of prayer, study and reflection about the teachings of the Church and what it means to be a disciple of Christ. Guided by our deacons, there is a team of parishioners that journeys with candidates to these sacraments.

At the Easter Vigil this year, Paras Bitzarakis will be baptized, confirmed, and receive Holy Communion. She was presented to the Bishop as a catechumen from our parish on the First Sunday of Lent. Last weekend at the noon Mass, Fr. Vitus formally welcomed the candidates for the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist – Nick Martin, Jessica Gomez, Ryan Whitley and Douglas DiPippa – who will be fully initiated into the Catholic Church at the culmination of the Easter season on the great solemnity of Pentecost. Please keep our brothers and sisters in your prayers especially during this Lenten journey.

Please join us Thursday evening at 7pm as we continue to anticipate with joy the great Easter Mysteries and the Dedication of our church!

The Annunciation of the Lord

Feast day March 25

“God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him . . . might have eternal life.” (John 3:16) At the Annunciation, God revealed this good news to Mary. She was the first to hear and to believe that God would do what he promised. Her faith told her that nothing is impossible for God. Mary also heard God’s invitation calling her to be the Virgin Mother of his Son. This call meant that Jesus would be formed in her womb, and she, as his mother, would nourish and care for him.

This call meant that she had a special place in God’s plan for salvation. Mary replied, “I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.” (Luke 1:38) In saying yes, Mary agreed to God’s plan because she wanted what God wanted. She was willing to accept all the joy and pain, all the unexpected events. She was willing to bring Christ to a waiting world.

Let us pray. Lord, fill our hearts with your grace; once, through the message of an angel you revealed to us the incarnation of your Son; now, through his suffering and death lead us to the glory of his resurrection.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

March 27, 2022

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers."' So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began.

(Con't.)

Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.'"

Reflection Questions

- What is this story about? Money? Wild living? Stubbornness? Forgiveness? Anger?
- Have you given up on the loved ones that have separated from you? Are you expectantly waiting for them to come home, or would you prefer they stayed away? What is keeping your attitude from resembling God's when it comes to waiting expectantly for them to return?
- When his son returned home, the father didn't have a lecture or a rebuke ready. He didn't make the son beg or repay him. He simply loved him. If your loved one returned home today, how would you receive them? What would restoration look like in your life?



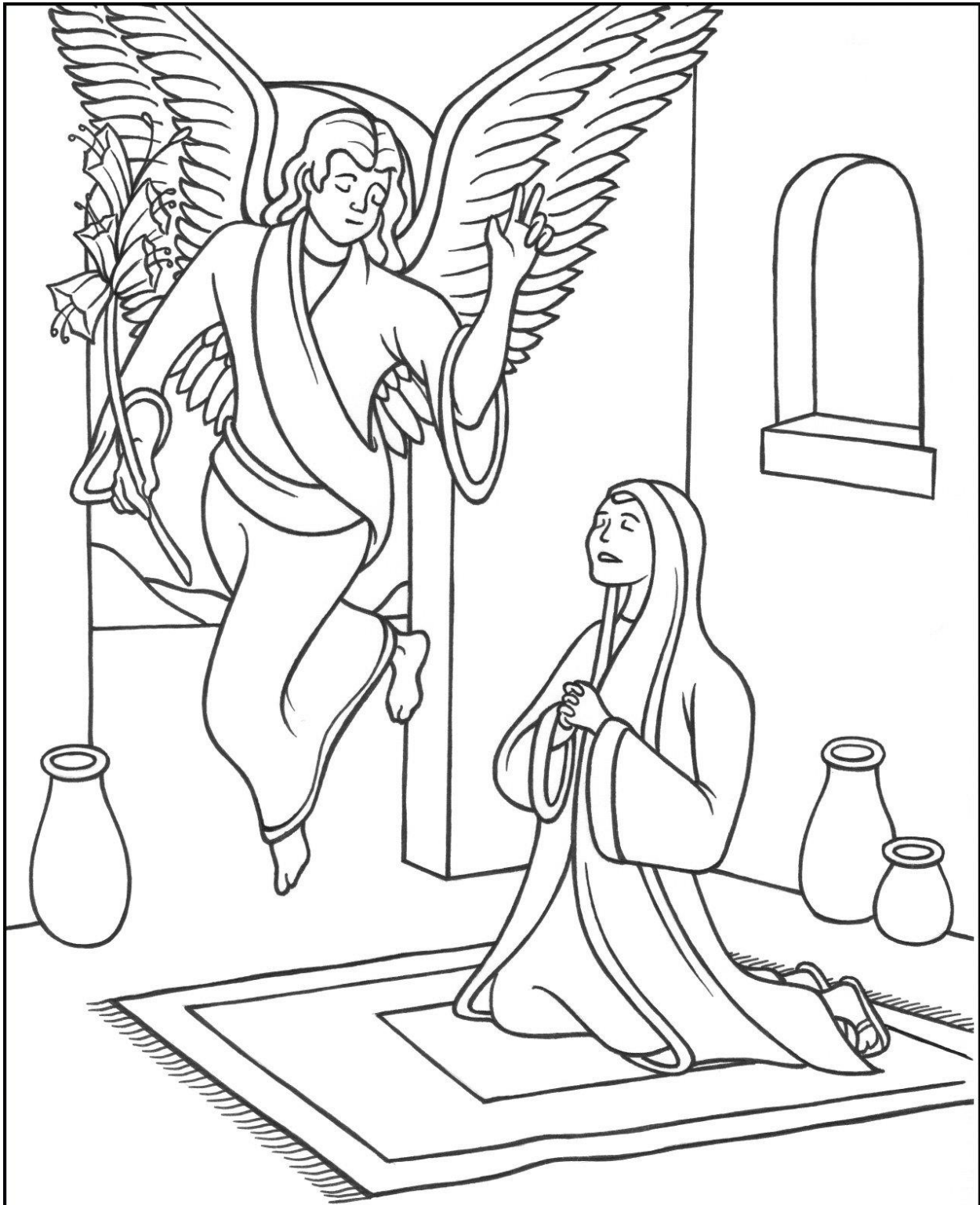

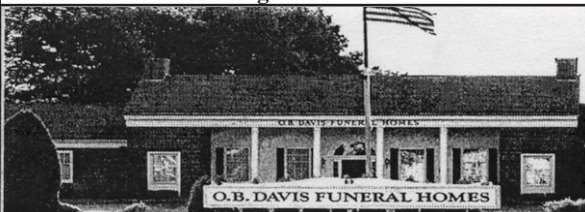
