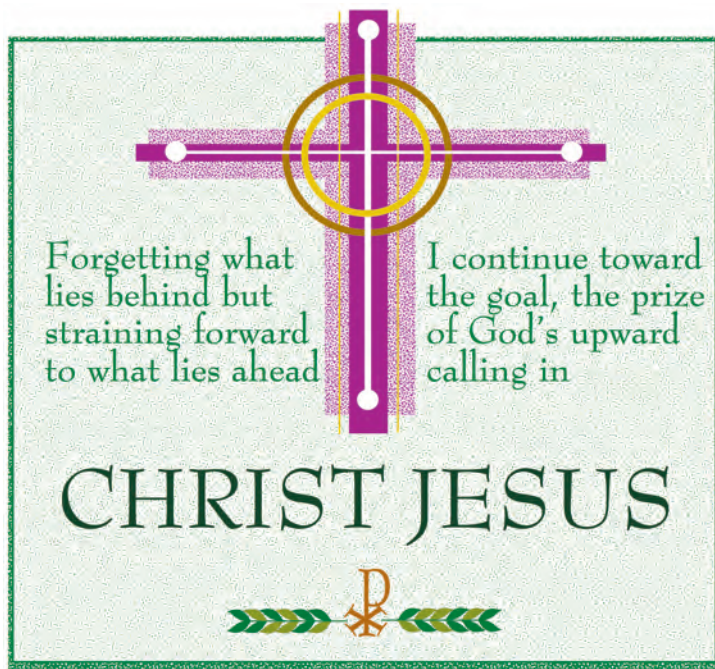

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Gerard's,

The countdown is on! By the time you read the next bulletin, we will be entering into Holy Week ***in our new church!*** To say that this will be a joyful moment in our collective history would be the understatement of the year! Many people have seen the new church – parishioners and guests alike – and they have been astounded by the finished product. Each member of our parish may rightly feel a sense of pride in all the hard work, dedication and steadfastness that has made this dream a reality.


This Thursday evening, we will complete our Lenten Mission series. After the four fantastic guests we've had to lead us in prayer and reflection, you'll be hearing from a familiar voice, yours truly, at our final gathering. I wanted to have this opportunity, only days before the Dedication Mass and the start of Holy Week, to explain what will happen during the Mass on Saturday morning. My topic will be "The Dedication of a Church" – a rare liturgy that few people ever get to see. It is rich in symbolism, all of which points to the Paschal Mystery and our lives in following the Lord Jesus. Please make every effort to join us Thursday at 7pm.

As we approach Holy Week, there is one day, in particular, – the Monday of Holy Week – to which I would like to draw your attention. It has become the custom of our Diocese (as well as Brooklyn and New York City) to make the Sacrament of Confessions available in every church from 3-9pm. We will continue that tradition here at St. Gerard's. I mention this considering today's very powerful scene from the Gospel. It is not uncommon for us to see Jesus encountering sinners. (In fact, with the exception of His Mother, everyone he ever met was a sinner!) But today's scene is especially dramatic because of how the woman, who was caught in sin, is brought in a most humiliating fashion before Jesus by the leaders. Much to the indignation of her accusers, Jesus turns the focus from this woman's misstep to a broader look at sin. No one is immune from sin. Just as all of humanity shares the common trait of sin, so, too, the way God deals with us is also the same: with mercy and compassion. Jesus does not come to condemn, but to redeem. He comes not to heap guilt upon us, but to crucify our sins in His own body so that we might rise to new life now and for eternity. That's the glorious reality of Holy Week – we are redeemed!

I invite everyone to make time for this wonderful sacrament on Monday of Holy Week, or at some other time prior to Easter. It will do more good for you than you'll ever realize. Indeed, nothing is more important than keeping our hearts and minds in union with God through receiving His bountiful mercy.

I look forward to seeing you Thursday evening. May God bless you as, together, we approach the holiest days of the year and the joy of dedicating our new church!

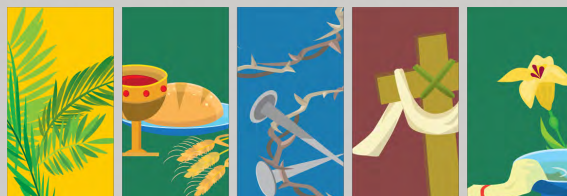

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

April 10, 2022

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Lk 23:1-49

The elders of the people, chief priests and scribes, arose and brought Jesus before Pilate. They brought charges against him, saying, "We found this man misleading our people; he opposes the payment of taxes to Caesar and maintains that he is the Christ, a king." Pilate asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" He said to him in reply, "You say so." Pilate then addressed the chief priests and the crowds, "I find this man not guilty." But they were adamant and said, "He is inciting the people with his teaching throughout all Judea, from Galilee where he began even to here. On hearing this Pilate asked if the man was a Galilean; and upon learning that he was under Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod who was in Jerusalem at that time. Herod was very glad to see Jesus; he had been wanting to see him for a long time, for he had heard about him and had been hoping to see him perform some sign. He questioned him at length, but he gave him no answer. The chief priests and scribes, meanwhile, stood by accusing him harshly. Herod and his soldiers treated him contemptuously and mocked him, and after clothing him in resplendent garb, he sent him back to Pilate. Herod and Pilate became friends that very day, even though they had been enemies formerly. Pilate then summoned the chief priests, the rulers, and the people and said to them, "You brought this man to me and accused him of inciting the people to revolt. I have conducted my investigation in your presence and have not found this man guilty of the charges you have brought against him, nor did Herod, for he sent him back to us. So no capital crime has been committed by him. Therefore I shall have him flogged and then release him." But all together they shouted out, "Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us."— Now Barabbas had been imprisoned for a rebellion that had taken place in the city and for murder. — Again Pilate addressed them, still wishing to release Jesus, but they continued their shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Pilate addressed them a third time, "What evil has this man done? I found him guilty of no capital crime. Therefore I shall have him flogged and then release him." With loud shouts, however, they persisted in calling for his crucifixion, and their voices prevailed. The verdict of Pilate was that their demand should be granted. So he released the man who had been imprisoned for rebellion and murder, for whom they asked, and he handed Jesus over to them to deal with as they wished. As they led him away they took hold of a certain Simon, a Cyrenian, who was coming in from the country; and after laying the cross on him, they made him carry it behind Jesus. A large crowd of people followed Jesus, including many women who mourned and lamented him. Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep instead for yourselves and for your children for indeed, the days are coming when people will say, 'Blessed are the barren,

the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed.' At that time people will say to the mountains, 'Fall upon us!' and to the hills, 'Cover us!' for if these things are done when the wood is green what will happen when it is dry?" Now two others, both criminals, were led away with him to be executed. When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him and the criminals there, one on his right, the other on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." They divided his garments by casting lots. The people stood by and watched; the rulers, meanwhile, sneered at him and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews." Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." It was now about noon and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon because of an eclipse of the sun. Then the veil of the temple was torn down the middle. Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit"; and when he had said this he breathed his last. The centurion who witnessed what had happened glorified God and said, "This man was innocent beyond doubt." When all the people who had gathered for this spectacle saw what had happened, they returned home beating their breasts; but all his acquaintances stood at a distance, including the women who had followed him from Galilee and saw these events.

- What was significant about Jesus' words on the cross?
- Why did Jesus need to die on the cross?
- What difference did Christ's death make in your relationship with God the Father?
- In what ways can you approach God each day this week, to honor the path to the Father He opened for you?

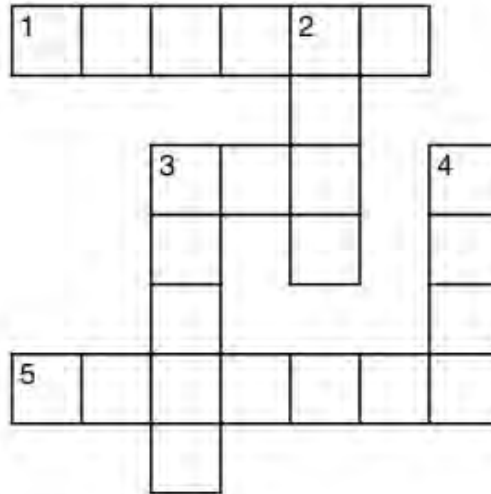

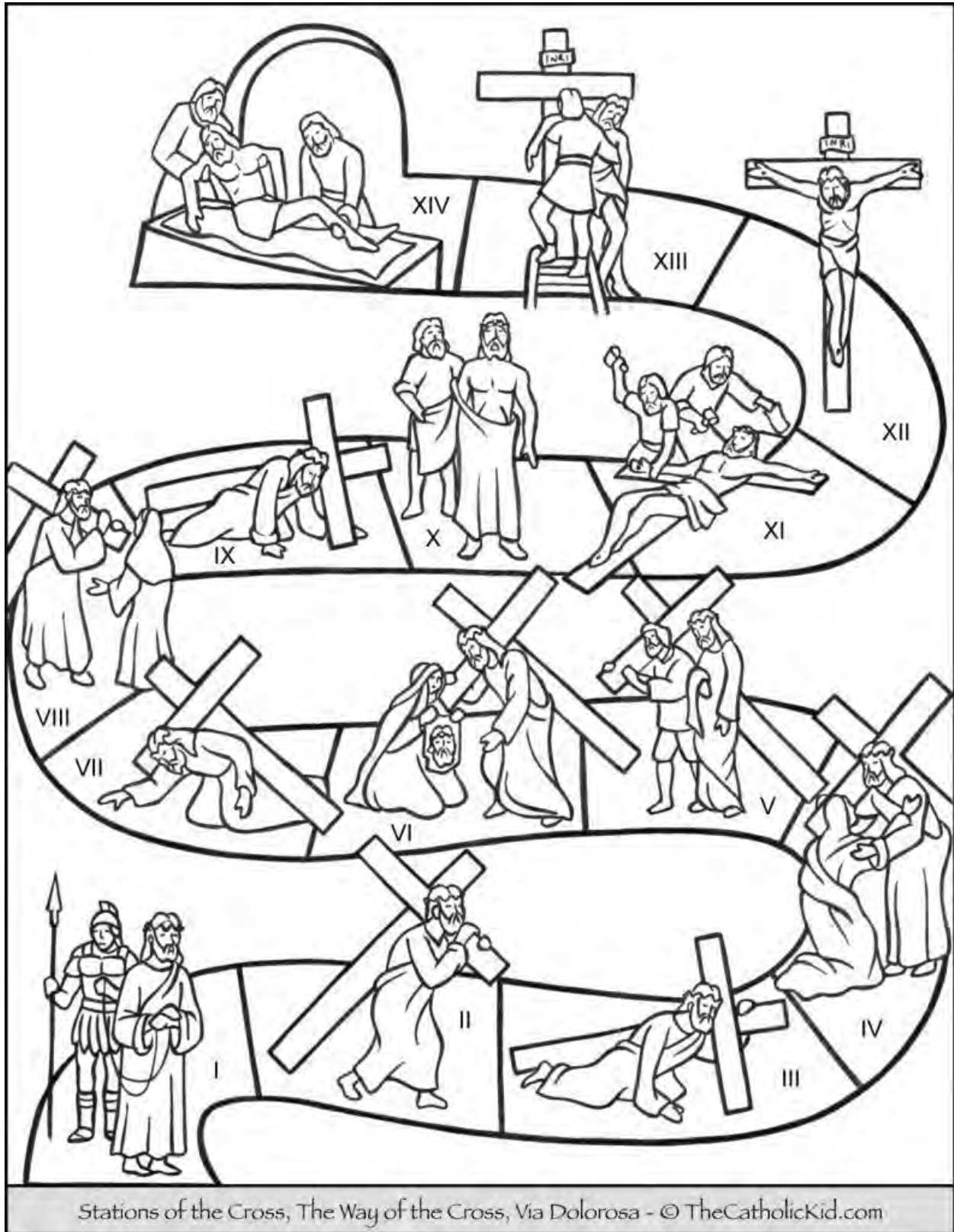
