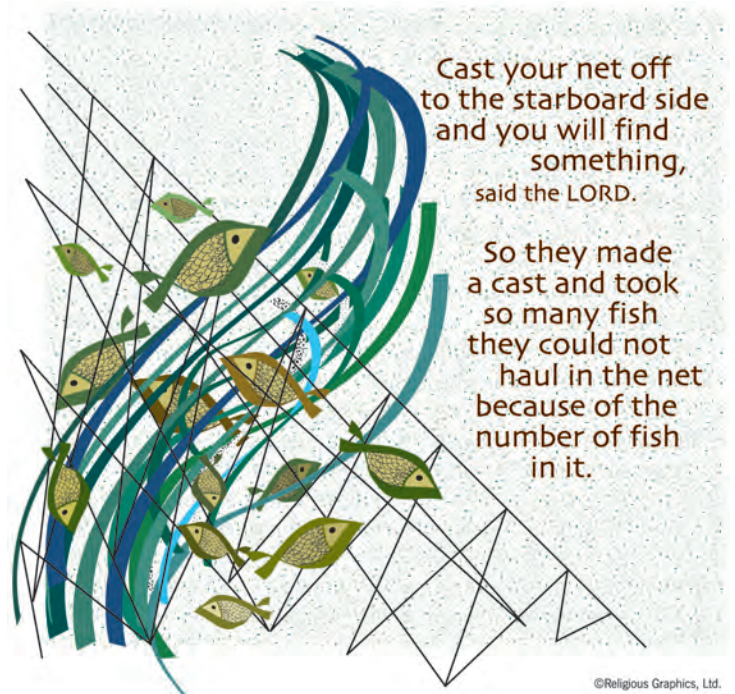

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend, I shared with you the news that Bishop Barres has appointed me to serve as the Pastor of Infant Jesus Parish while remaining Pastor here at St. Gerard's. Realizing there may be a flurry of questions about how all of this will work, allow me to offer some responses to your commonly asked questions.

Q: Why does one priest have to serve as Pastor of two parishes?

A: The hard truth is that we don't have enough priests currently serving in our diocese. Thanks to the many priests from other dioceses – like our own Fr. Vitus – we're able to manage but still not meet all our pastoral needs. As of June, there will be approximately 20 priests who are Pastors of more than one parish. So, this situation is not unique to us.

Q: Does this imply that the two parishes will eventually be merged or consolidated into one parish?

A: Absolutely not! First, merging parishes is a complex process that requires the final approval of the Vatican. It is not taken lightly and requires years of work. Second, both parishes are vibrant and of substantial size with many families and ministries. It would prove very difficult to make the two parishes into one.

Q: Will there be shared ministries or a merging of resources?

A: Both parishes remain independent and separate. I will serve as the Pastor of both but have two sets of Trustees, Parish Councils, Finance Committees, professional staffs, etc. Already among many parishes there are cooperative efforts to meet pastoral needs. That may come into play down the road but, for now, my chief aim is to get to know Infant Jesus better, assess its needs and desires, and then, over the next year, make a separate pastoral plan for each parish. Also, it is important to know that parishes cannot mingle financial resources, so both parishes will retain their own budgets, income sources and expenses.

Q: Will you be leaving St. Gerard's?

A: For the foreseeable future, I will remain living at the rectory of St. Gerard's, along with Fr. Vitus (and Leo!) Throughout the week I will be commuting to Infant Jesus for pastoral and administrative work.

Q: How will you split your time between the two parishes?

A: Over the next two months, I will be working with the clergy and staff at both parishes to determine a plan for my presence at both campuses. I imagine it will look something like this: two days during the week at either parish and then somewhat back-and-forth on the weekends for Masses and other events.

Q: Will you still be saying Mass at St. Gerard's?

A: Yes, I will. But I will also be saying Mass regularly at Infant Jesus. I will coordinate with the other priests about coverage for all the Masses at both parishes, so you'll be seeing other priests regularly for Masses as well.

Q: Does this mean you will be staying at St. Gerard's longer?

A: Canon law stipulates terms of 6 years for Pastors with one possible renewal. I still have two years left on my term at St. Gerard's so' at that time, a determination will be made about whether or not I remain. I will begin a new six-year term as Pastor of Infant Jesus on June 29th. The two terms are independent of each other.

Q: How do you feel about taking on this new responsibility and the workload that it brings?

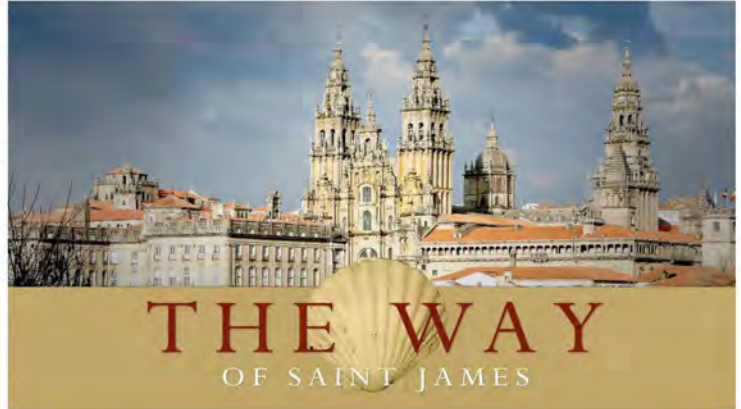
A: Of course, any new assignment brings its challenges. With the building project here coming to a close, I have more time which I can dedicate to shepherding Infant Jesus. I am confident that with good planning the needs of both communities will be met sufficiently.

Saints Phillip and James

Feast day May 3

Philip and James were both apostles, and both served Christ faithfully during the very early days of the Church. Philip seems to have been an enthusiastic person. He was the one who brought his friend Nathanael to Jesus, insisting to Nathanael that he had found the person about whom Moses had written. Some years later it was Philip who made arrangements, with the help of Andrew, to have a group of Greek Gentiles brought to Jesus. Philip the apostle is not to be confused with the deacon Philip of Acts 8, who preached in Samaria and baptized the Ethiopian, although some writers say that they are the same person. Philip also had a practical, down-to-earth mind. He was the apostle who commented that it would take a considerable amount of money to feed a crowd of more than 5,000 hungry men, women, and children. It was Philip who asked to see the Father when Jesus spoke about him at the Last Supper.

James was the son of Alphaeus and seems to have been born in Caesarea. He is mentioned less frequently in the New Testament than Philip is. Sometimes James is called the Less, which might be a hint that he was a short person or else that he was younger than the other apostle named James.

After Jesus’ death James continued to preach the Gospel and is believed to have become the first bishop of Jerusalem. Assuming that James and the first bishop of Jerusalem are one and the same person, then he met his death as a martyr in that city about the year a.d. 62. Tradition identifies James as the author of the epistle associated with his name.

May 8, 2022

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Jn 10:27-30

Jesus said:

Reflection Questions

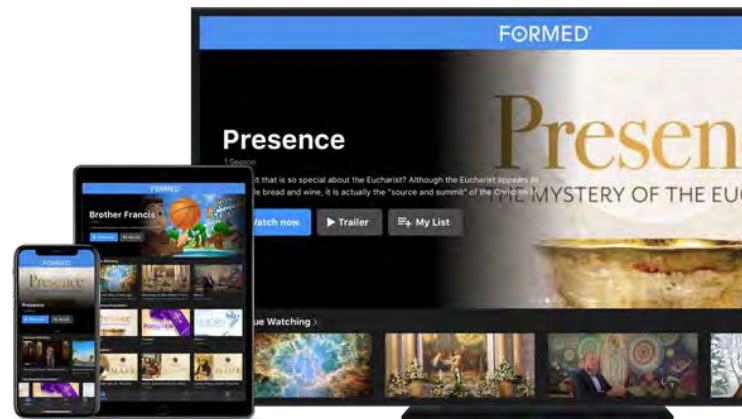

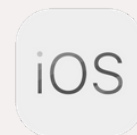
