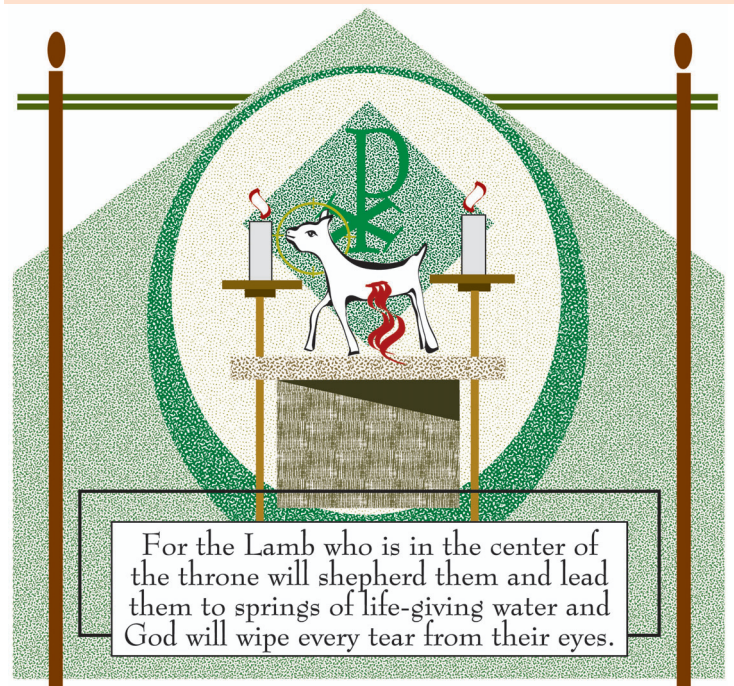

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Gerard's,

When Deacon Frank and I were assigned to this parish four years ago, one of the highest priorities we were charged with was the building project. Now, after four years of consultation, planning meetings, a capital campaign and countless hours spent reviewing plans and executing them, we have arrived at our goal! I think it is fair to say that we're all still basking in the glory of our new church and the renovated campus. But the truth is, there is always another project just around the corner. Homeowners know this well. Just when you finish one renovation or improvement, you already begin to think about the next project that must be tackled. The same is true with a parish.

Over the past year, I have been speaking with our Finance Committee to identify what those next projects might be. Some projects have to do with completing those facets of the new church that we had to omit for cost savings. The others are enhancements to the entire campus or to specific buildings. Rather than having just a few of us identify what that priority list will consist of, we would like to invite the entire parish to discuss proposed capital projects, the importance that we place on them, and how we will raise the needed funds to complete them. Please make every effort to join us for this important conversation at a **Town Hall on Wednesday, May 18th at 7pm in the Parish Hall.**

On another note, there are three ministries I would like to ask for your assistance in growing:

Greeters at Mass. This ministry is separate from the ushers' tasks at Mass. The purpose is to welcome those coming to Mass, distribute bulletins at the conclusion of Mass, and be a resource for basic information about our parish. There will be a meeting for those interested in being part of the "Greeters" this Wednesday, May 11th and 7pm in the church.

Baptism Liturgy Teams. This group will be assigned to our scheduled Baptisms (usually twice a month) to assist the priest or deacon with setting up, welcoming and seating families, gathering necessary paperwork and helping with the overall flow of the liturgy. If you are interested, please contact Jennifer Donnellon (jennifer@stgmajella.org), and we'll be in touch about training.

An Altar Guild. This final ministry is a long-awaited one, as it was based on the completion of our new church. While our faithful custodian, Alfredo, does a wonderful job of keeping our buildings clean, he cannot do it all alone. We are beginning the **St. Zita Ministry!** Their focus is to ensure that the church is kept clean and dignified for the celebration of the sacraments. If you are interested, please let Jennifer Donnellon (jennifer@stgmajella.org) know, and she will contact you.

Thank you for the many ways you support our parish – with daily prayer, financially, by sharing your gifts and by being active in planning our future together. I am grateful for your support and encouragement.

Finally, a very Happy Mothers' Day to all the moms of our parish and those who have been mother figures to so many of us!



May 15, 2022

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Jn 13:31-33a, 34-35

When Judas had left them, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him. If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and God will glorify him at once. My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Reflection Questions

- How had Jesus shown love to his disciples at the Last Supper? How did Jesus say that people would recognize his disciples?
- What did Jesus do after this Last Supper to show love?
- When is it less difficult to show love to you family members and friends? When is it more difficult? When love is difficult, what do we do?
- Jesus didn't just tell us to love one another. He showed us how to love one another. In what ways did Jesus show you how to love?
- When you follow Jesus' example and words, you become a disciple and are able to make a different, more loving world. How can you be the hands and feet of Jesus this coming week?

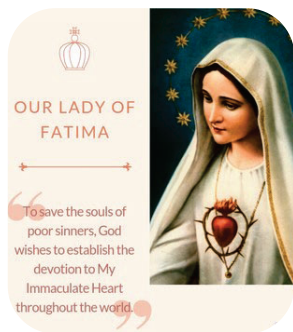

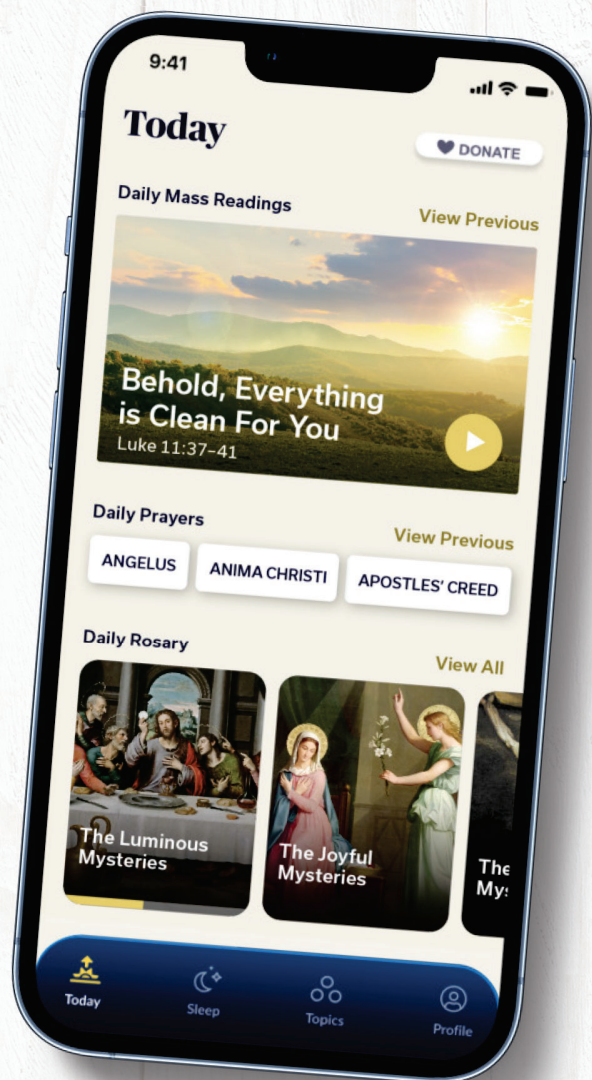

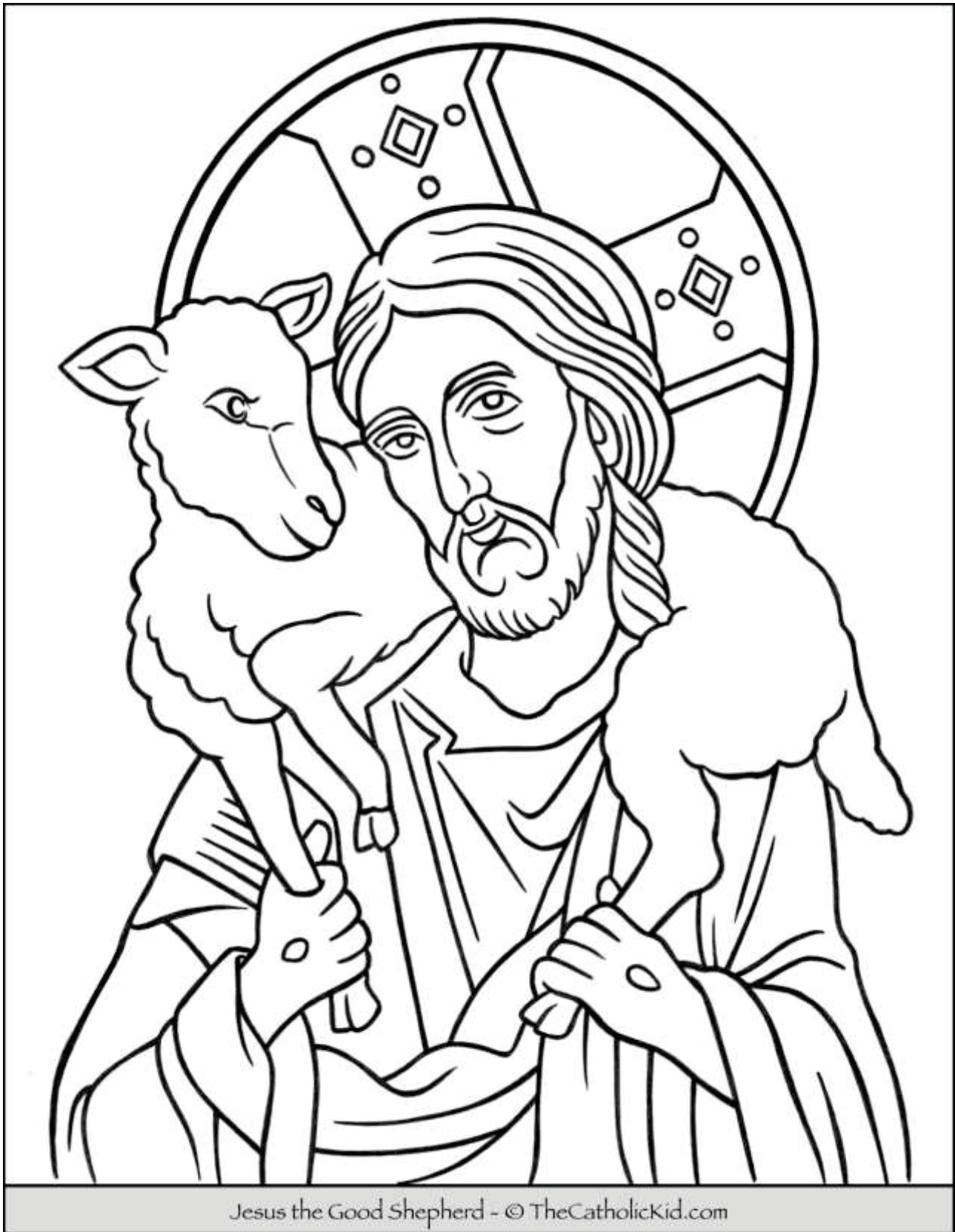
