### Ways to Celebrate Your Values on Halloween

Your kids can research their favorite saint or the saint they're named after. They could also dress up as their favorite saint for Halloween.

Tell your children that Halloween can be a festive day to kick off the celebration of All Saints Day. We ask the saints—our spiritual ancestors—to pray for us on our own journey to holiness. At breakfast, recite a short litany of family members who have died and whom you remember in your prayers. After each name, have everyone say, "Pray for us."

Have fun! Make a special meal for dinner. Here's a quick idea for a healthy meal to offset the abundance of candy. Give each child a paper plate. Put out bowls of olives, cucumbers, radishes, raisins, dried apricots or cranberries, cheese sticks, and cold cuts. Have the kids make faces on their plates with the food. ## Breaking Open the Word

**Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?**

**November 6, 2022**

**Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**Lk 20:27-38**

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.* Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage.

They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

### Reflection Questions

- What is the problem that the Sadducees are trying to present to Jesus. What does their questioning of Jesus assume? What does it show that even the Sadducees are trying to question Jesus?
- Jesus is surrounded by questioners on every side. Everyone is trying to catch Him in a trap. Everyone is an accuser. Have you ever been in a similar situation? What was it like?
- The Great commandment says to love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. When you are struggling with your spouse or family member, ask yourself "am I loving the Lord with all my heart, soul, mind and strength?" Give the situation over to God and ask Him for help.

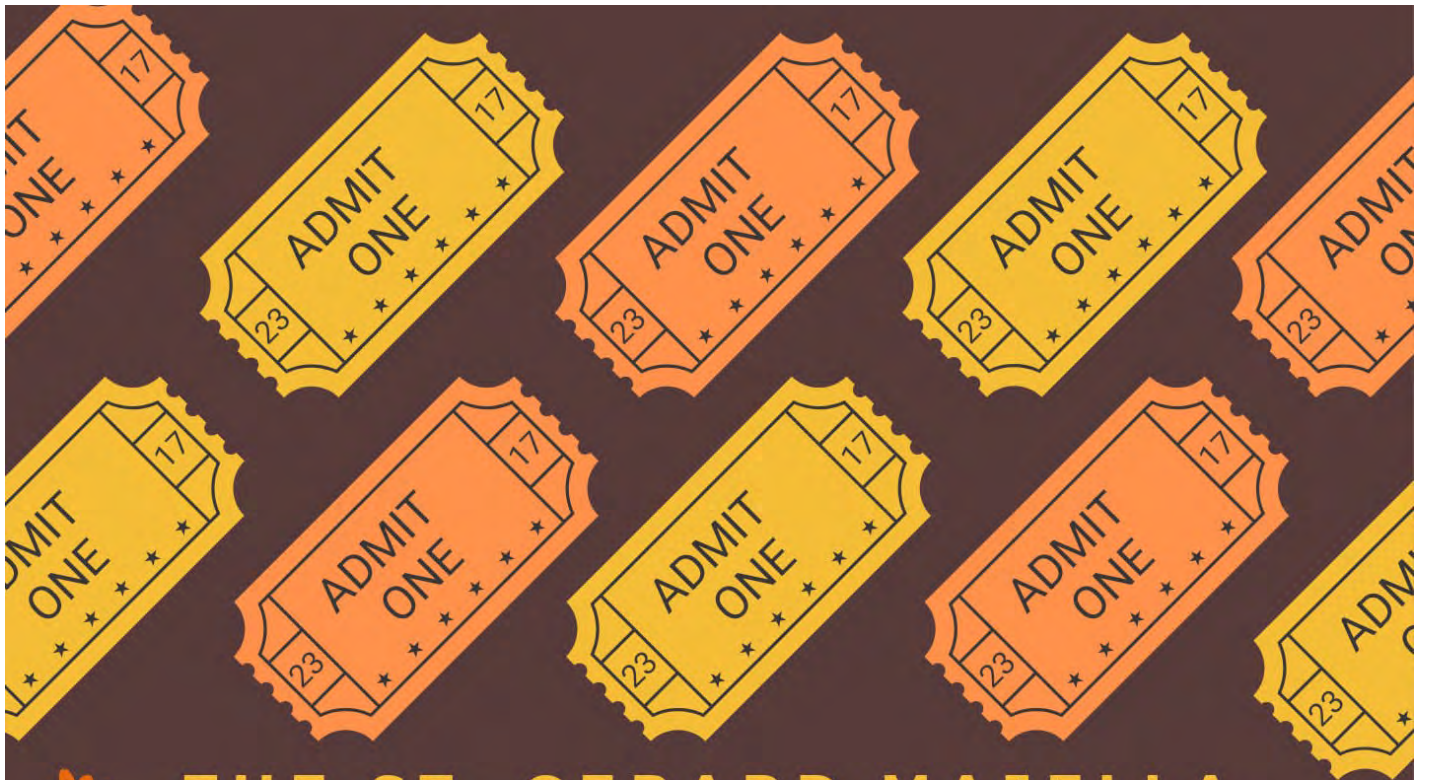

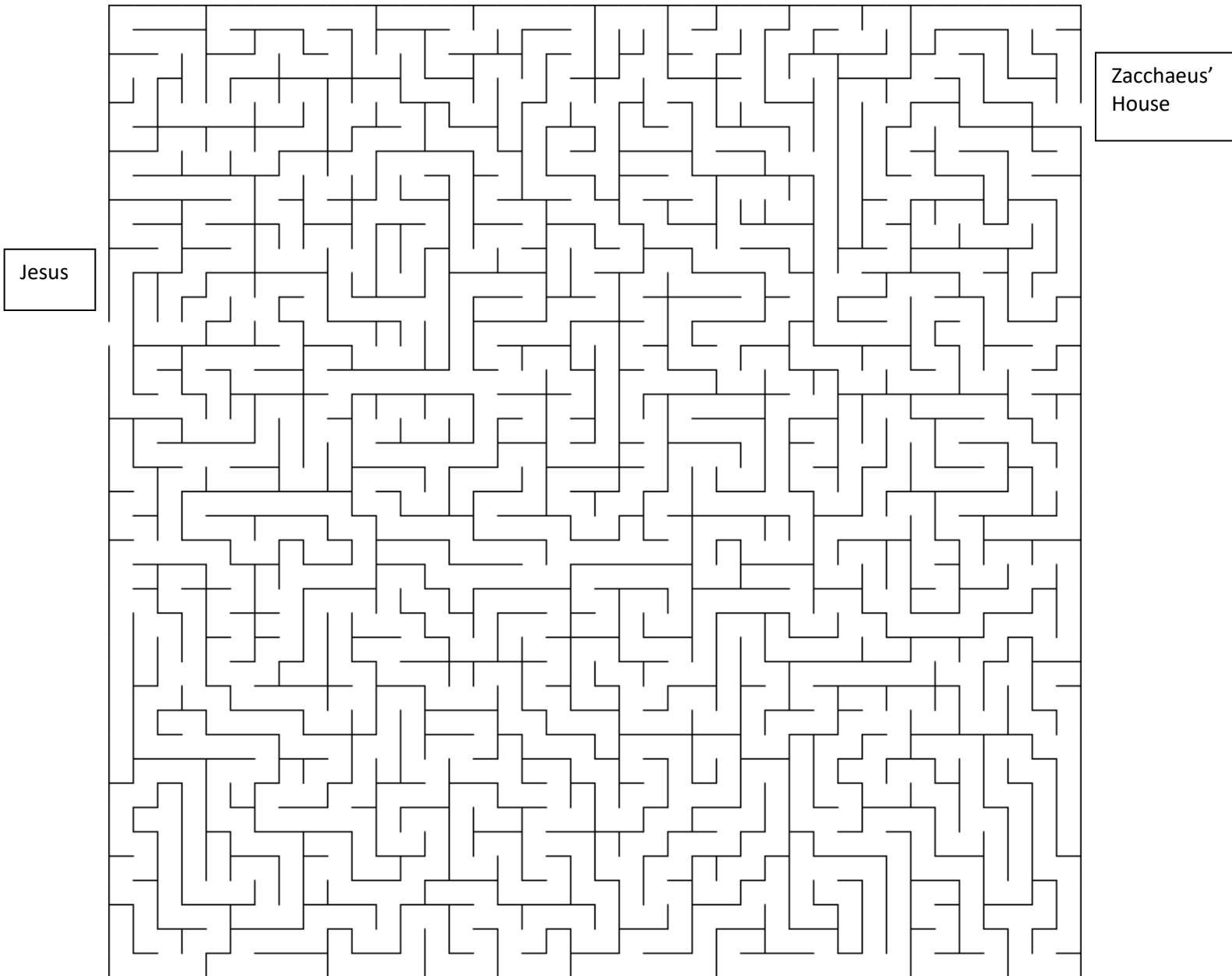

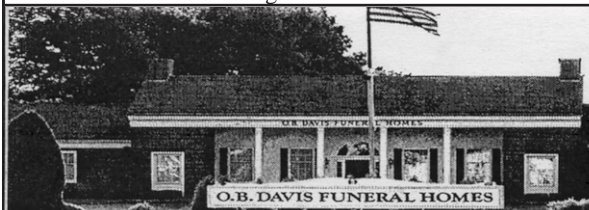
