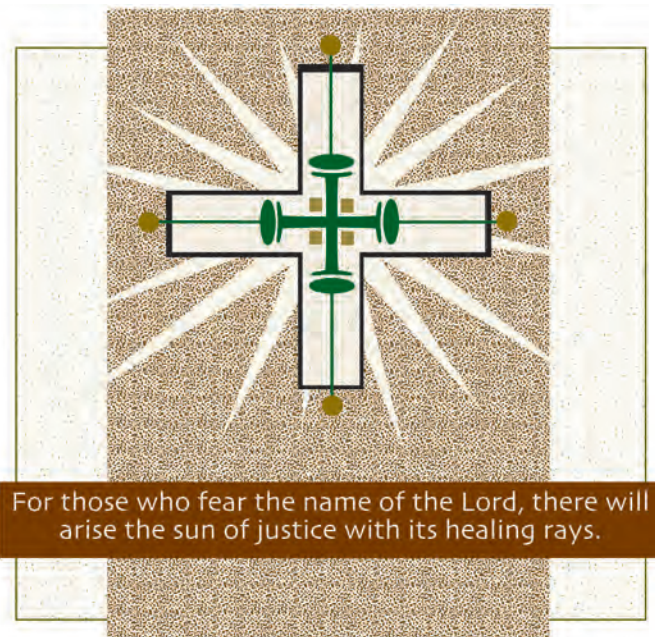

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Gerard's,

Each year, during the month of November, we remember in a particular way the souls of the faithful departed. We pray for our beloved families and friends who have died. We commend their souls to the mercy of God Almighty, asking that they be raised up to the joys of heaven. We are reminded to take time to pray also for all those souls who have no one else to pray for them. It may be hard to imagine, but some people genuinely have no one in their lives. There could be many reasons for this. But we do know, however, that our heavenly Father never forgets a single soul. He has made all of us in His image and likeness and holds each of us in His love at every moment of our existence. One of the spiritual works of mercy is to pray for the dead. Not only do we gain much grace for ourselves in doing such a pious act, but we also assist souls on their way to the fullness of life in heaven.

May I also remind you of the great benefit, in addition to offering personal prayers for those who have died, of having Mass offered for our departed loved ones. (You can, of course, have Mass offered for a living person or for a particular intention, too.) The Sacrifice of the Mass is the re-presentation of Calvary, the perfect Sacrifice of the Cross by which Christ opened the gates of heaven to all those who know, love, and serve Him in this life. This central act of our faith is a singular way of aiding the souls of those we love.

And there are other ways that we can honor our loved ones who have died. Very often, parishes will purchase needed items for use in the sacraments. We have recently done so here at St. Gerard's. You may have noticed that the ciboria we use – the vessels which hold the hosts that become the Body of Christ – are brand new. These are fitting containers of the most precious gift we have – the Eucharist. The offering is \$750. Additionally, we have ordered a handsome new Advent wreath for our church, which we will bless in a couple of weeks. The offering for the wreath is \$3,500. If you would like to memorialize one of the ciboria or the wreath, please contact the parish office.

Finally, please remember that we are continuing to accept orders for memorial bricks for our prayer garden. I'm sure you've seen the work that has been done on the front lawn in our effort to beautify this special prayer space. Bricks may be memorialized to the dead, or in gratitude for a grace received, or simply with a family name. There is an order form in the bulletin, and forms are available at the parish office.

*Eternal rest grant unto our beloved dead, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.
May they rest in peace. And may their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed – especially those
with no one else to pray for them – rest in peace. Amen.*

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

November 20, 2022

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Lk 23:35-43

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews."

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Reflection Questions

- Reflect on how the various people in this Gospel respond to Jesus on the Cross. Who in this Gospel recognizes Jesus as King?
- What does Jesus promise the thief?
- What will happen to those who believe the sign on Jesus' cross?
- Is Jesus a King in the way we normally understand kings and royalty? Why or why not?
- Pray this week that you will always recognize Christ the King and live accordingly.



On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. Christ's kingship is rooted in the Church's teaching on the Incarnation. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. One person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. "From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures" (*Quas primas*, 13).

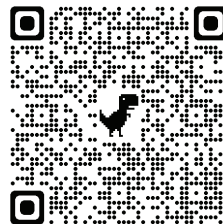



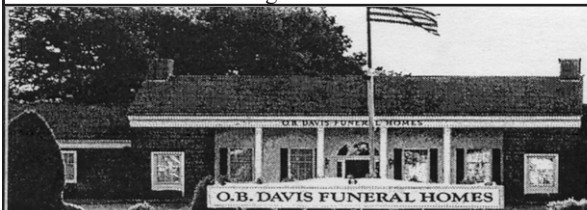
