A Message from the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Gerard's,

Last week, we received the sorrowful news of the passing of His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI, who served as the chief shepherd of the Church for eight years. His historic resignation – the first of a pope in over 600 years – is what many will likely remember most about him. But the legacy he leaves behind is far greater than that one humble act. His impact in theology will be felt for centuries to come. His wisdom, sound leadership and devotion to the richness of our Catholic Faith will echo down the generations. The devotion of so many who offered prayers for him – like the Mass we had last Wednesday evening – will aid Pope Benedict as he approaches the joys of heaven.

On April 25, 2005, during his inaugural homily, Pope Benedict said that one of the greatest joys in life was “to be surprised by the Gospel.” That is, the life-giving Word of God, coupled with the Church’s care for it throughout the centuries, can change someone’s life forever. This weekend, we contemplate the Magi – astrologers from a faraway land – coming to see the newborn King. We are told that they “departed by another way” to their homeland. In other words, they could not go back the same way that they had arrived. They had been “surprised” by what they looked upon – the very Word of God now in flesh. We, too, are invited to look upon Christ, each day – especially in the Eucharist – and allow His very presence to transform us into a new creation, one that is animated by His grace to fulfill faithfully the vocation to which he has called each of us. And the ultimate vocation for each one of us is to become saints, in union with God, for eternity. The feast of the Epiphany is that “eureka” moment for the Magi, and for us, to be awakened to the power of Christ that moves in, with, and through us.

Finally, as we close the Christmas season this weekend, I would like to thank the many who made both the Advent and Christmas seasons so beautiful. That beauty was found in the liturgies marking the holy days, the decorations which adorned the church and chapel and the music that lifted our hearts in prayer. Thank you to everyone who helped in so many ways – seen and unseen – to bring joy and solemnity to our parish community.

The Epiphany of the Lord

The visit of the Magi occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family’s flight into Egypt. Matthew’s Gospel tells a version of Jesus’ birth that is different than the one in Luke. Of the actual birth of Jesus, Matthew tells us little more than, “When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod . . .” The story of the census is found only in Luke’s Gospel, but we hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew’s Gospel.

We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel does not say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. In Matthew’s Gospel, they represent the Gentiles’ search for a savior. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus.

We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus’ role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological. Gold is presented as representative of Jesus’ kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple. Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus’ death.

The word Epiphany means “manifestation” or “showing forth.” Historically several moments in Christ’s early life and ministry have been celebrated as “epiphanies,” including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana. (Loyola Press)

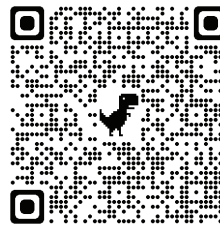

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

January 15, 2023

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jn 1: 29-34

John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.' I did not know him, but the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known to Israel." John testified further, saying, "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

Reflection Questions

- Why does John call Jesus, "The Lamb of God" ? How did John recognize Jesus as the Lamb of God?
- The ministry of John the Baptist prepared for and pointed to the ministry of Jesus. In a similar way, our lives are to offer testimony to who we know Jesus to be for us and for the world. Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. How does the witness of your life give testimony to the reconciling presence of Christ?
- Pray this week that your life will show others that Jesus is the Son of God, the lamb who takes away the sins of the world.
