A Message from the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On January 20th, there were news reports in several outlets – arguably Newsday the most notable – that discussed our diocese’s ongoing bankruptcy litigation. The reports centered on the plan submitted to the Court by the attorneys for alleged victims. Among the four or so reports that I viewed, there were significant discrepancies in several specific points of the proposal which, I think it fair to say, represents well the ongoing confusion about the process of resolving these allegations in a just and substantial manner. From the start, the goal of our diocese was, and remains, that victims of abuse by Church personnel be compensated for the pain inflicted. At the same time, the essential mission of the Church – the proclamation of the Gospel, the celebration of the sacraments, faith formation and works of charity – must be preserved and enabled to continue.

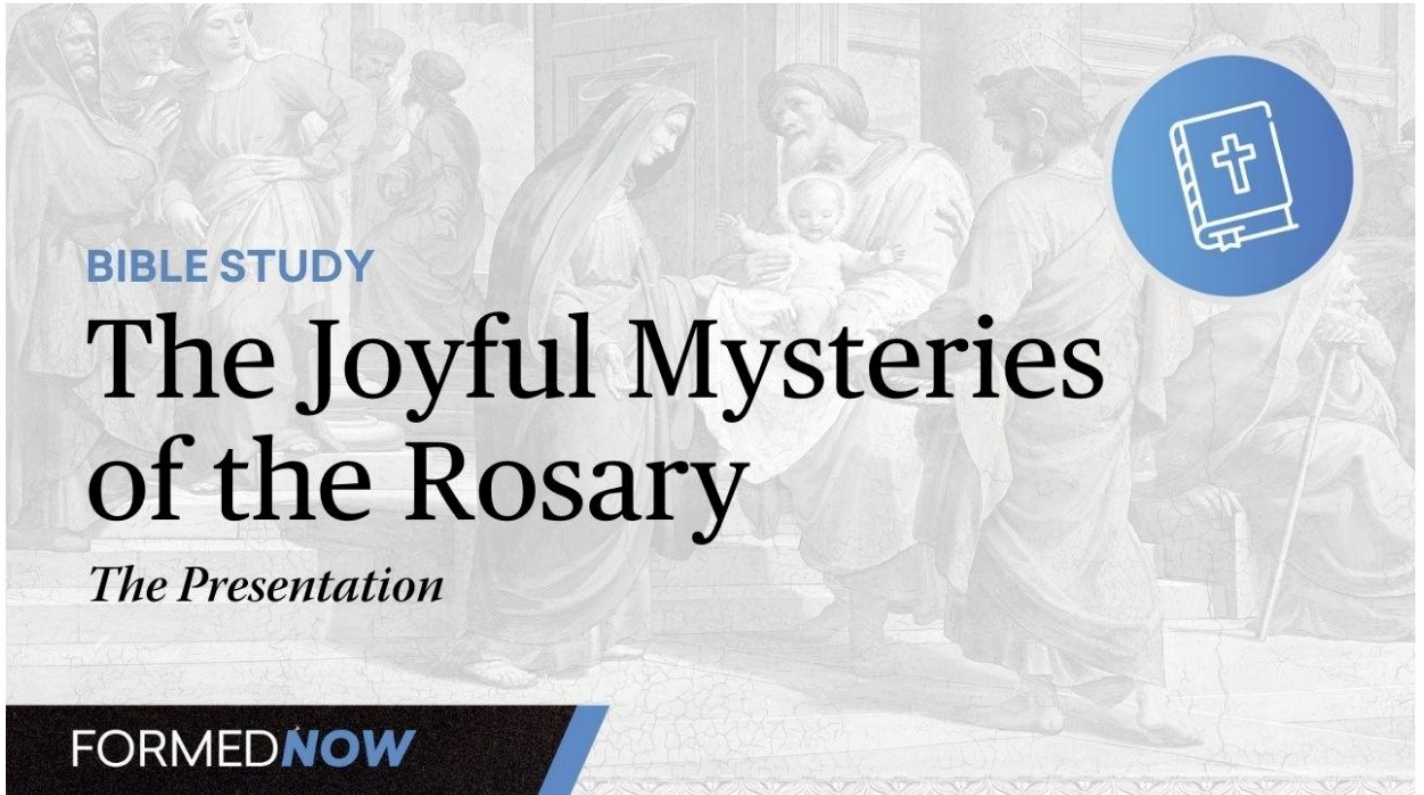
Presently, it would be irresponsible of me to offer much commentary on the settlement process, because it is just that – a process that will unfold with time. After months of mediation, it will likely come down to a decision that is realistic and equitable. What the specific dollar amounts will be, and where that will come from apart from diocesan resources and insurance carriers, remains to be seen. But what seldom gets reported is the fact that our diocese is committed both to rendering what is just to abuse survivors and to continuing her indispensable pastoral mission. When a final settlement is crafted and approved by the Court, I will keep you informed of the particulars.

On a much happier note, I am writing this letter in Providence, Rhode Island, in anticipation of the Mass of Reception of Bishop Henning as the Coadjutor Bishop of that diocese. The term “coadjutor” means that Bishop Henning will be an auxiliary bishop to Bishop Thomas Tobin, as he has been to Bishop Barres for the past few years, but with automatic right to succession when Bishop Tobin retires later this year. I had the privilege of working with then-Monsignor Henning at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington for several years, helping to transform that amazing space from a house of formation for priests into the largest Catholic retreat and conference center in the tri-state area. Bishop Henning’s creativity, leadership and pastoral charity were, no doubt, the characteristics that led to his being selected to serve in the episcopal college and now to lead the good people of Providence. I witnessed firsthand how Bishop Henning, a gifted scripture scholar and professor for many years, made the life and teaching of Christ come alive in his lessons, sermons and, above all, his personal connection with people. He departs Long Island with the gratitude and affection of so many priests and laity, your pastor foremost among them. Please keep Bishop Henning in your prayers as he embarks on his new role as Shepherd of Providence.

Finally, allow me to express publicly my gratitude for the many well wishes for my birthday last week. Thankfully, turning 40 has proven to be far less jarring than many make it out to be! I know that is due in no small part to the countless blessings I have received both from the family in which I was raised and the family of our Church which I am privileged to serve. Thank you all for your prayerful support and encouragement!

Prayer and the Family Meal

Committing to gathering regularly, if not daily, for a shared meal is a great way to strengthen your family and to learn how to pray together. We might always say a traditional prayer. In doing so, we are also unified with our larger family, the Catholic Church, whose members have uttered the same or similar phrases for years upon years. Said thoughtfully, it resonates. Even on those days when we zip to the finish, it makes a point—God is with us, and we thank him.

But if you find prayer becoming habit over heart, there are ways to be more mindful at mealtime. Here are a few different approaches to spicing up the prayer portion of your family meals.

1. Have family members take turns leading the prayer each day. You might start with a petition, praise to God—whatever the leader chooses.
2. Sing the traditional prayer—let your child improvise the melody.
3. Institute a moment of silence. St. Thérèse of Lisieux described prayer as “a simple look turned toward heaven.”
4. Ask each member to say one thing he or she is grateful for that day.
5. Expand on the previous exercise by having each person at the table quickly answer these questions: What are you grateful for? What do you want to ask God for? What are you sorry for today? Whom did you help?
6. Read a poem or Scripture passage that gives thanks to God. Perhaps you can even find positive lyrics in a song from pop culture to engage your children
7. Of course, it’s always good for your children to know the standard meal blessings:

Bless us, O Lord, and these your gifts
which we are about to receive from your goodness.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

We give you thanks for all your gifts,
almighty God, living and reigning
now and for ever.
Amen.
