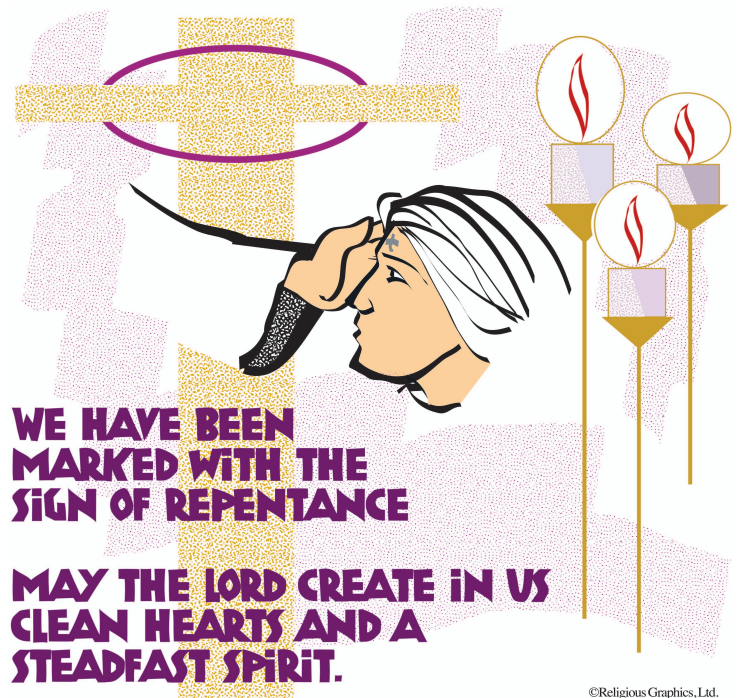

## *A Message from the Pastor*



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Having now begun our Lenten journey, we are presented during this sacred season with many opportunities to deepen our relationship with God. In last weekend's bulletin, I offered some suggestions for what we "can do" during Lent to make it a meaningful experience. One of the more common communal activities of Lent is attending the parish mission. This year, I am happy to announce that Fr. Roy Tvrdik, SMM, will be leading us. Some of you may know him from his work at the Shrine in Manorville and from men's groups, adult education classes and even trips to the Holy Land and other sacred places. About a month ago, Fr. Roy unexpectedly underwent bypass surgery. Thankfully, he is well on his way to a full recovery and will be able to resume his schedule in the next couple of weeks. Originally, we had planned for him to offer separate missions at Infant Jesus and at St. Gerard's. But, as you can surely understand, we don't want to overextend Fr. Roy at this time. Therefore, we'll be having a Joint-Parish Lenten Mission. You will find the advertisement in this bulletin.

On another more somber note, this past Friday marked the one-year anniversary of the war in Ukraine when Russian troops began their invasion. Since then, international tempers have flared at various times, hundreds of thousands of people have fled into exile to other countries, and the geopolitical landscape has seemingly worsened. This is an important reminder to us of the need to pray for peace in our world, especially in areas where violence and suffering are so prominent. Perhaps part of our Lenten fast can be offered for this intention.

May you continue to have a meaningful Lent and enter Holy Week with a mind and heart made new by the grace of God.

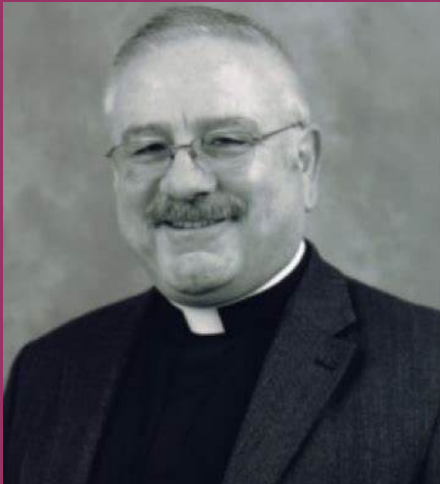

### Works of Mercy Tree

#### Materials:

Coffee can	Leafless tree branch
Gift wrapping paper	Yarn
Glue	Paper punch
Plaster of paris	

You may need one or two aides for this project.



**FAITH CONNECTION**  
 Explain that the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy are concrete ways of showing our love of neighbors.

#### Directions:

- Cover a coffee can with gift wrapping paper.
- Fill the coffee can with plaster of paris. Set the branch down into the plaster of paris and hold the branch upright.
- Have the students make little booklets from gift wrapping paper and write a promise to perform a work of mercy inside each booklet. (One or two aides will be needed to help the younger students write their works.)
- Write the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy on the board.

#### Corporal Works of Mercy

- Feeding the hungry
- Sheltering the homeless
- Clothing the naked
- Visiting the sick and those in prison
- Giving alms to the poor
- Burying the dead

#### Spiritual Works of Mercy

- Instructing
- Advising
- Consoling
- Comforting
- Forgiving
- Bearing wrongs with patience

- Punch a hole in each booklet. Using yarn, tie each booklet to the tree.
- Help the students remember to do their works of mercy by suggesting they make a "promise" tree at home.
- This project can be brought to the liturgy and presented as the students' gift.

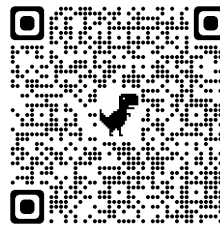

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

**March 5, 2023**

**Second Sunday of Lent**

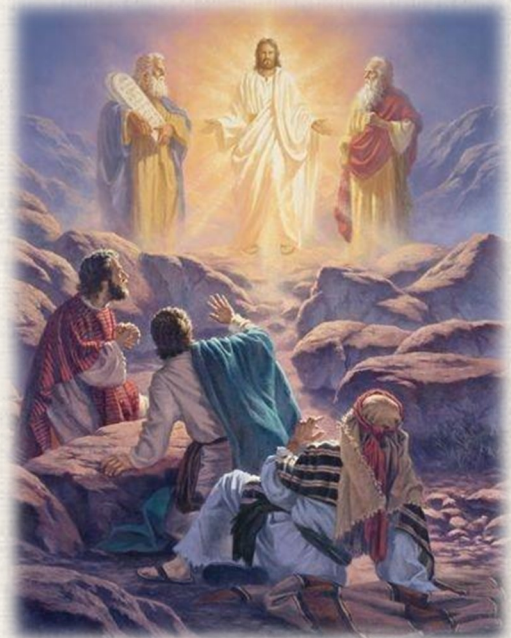
**Mt 17:1-9**

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

### Reflection Questions

- What does the Transfiguration tell us about who Jesus is?
- Why did Jesus tell the disciples not to talk about the Transfiguration until after His resurrection?
- Do you think the disciples understood what they had just observed? Would they understand it better later? How might this experience have helped Jesus and his disciples during the days of Jesus' Passion?
- Do you think focusing on Christ's power and holiness more would affect your spiritual life? Why or why not?

Lent 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

In our Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent, Saint Matthew tells us that before Jesus began His public ministry, He was “led by the Spirit into the desert” (*Mt. 4:1*), where He prayed, fasted, and gave Himself over to a life of Gospel poverty. Lent is the sacred time in which, following the example of Jesus, we are led by the same Holy Spirit into the solitude of the desert to deepen our relationship with the Father and purify our hearts to become like the Son. The Spirit that draws each of us into this period of preparation does so through the practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These three pillars of Lenten observance call us away from the selfishness of sin and lead us to a deeply personal encounter with Jesus Christ.

Recognizing that many have never experienced this personal relationship with Jesus, the Holy Spirit has led our local Church to embark on a period of Eucharistic Revival—a movement aimed at leading many to encounter Jesus by restoring understanding and devotion to the great mystery of the Eucharist. Following the Spirit’s desire to rekindle Eucharistic amazement in our hearts, let us reflect on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as practices deeply rooted in devotion to the Body and Blood of Jesus.

The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church, the “source and summit of the Christian life” (*CCC 1324*). Lenten prayer focused on the Eucharist calls us to rediscover the Catholic practice of praying the Mass by offering our intentions, work, hardships, and family life as “spiritual sacrifices” united to the priest’s offering of the Lord’s Body (*Lumen Gentium, 34*). In this way the great prayer of the Church becomes the great prayer of our lives: the summit to which all our daily sacrifices are directed and the source from which graces flow into everyday life.


Prayerfully receiving the Eucharist not only requires bodily fasting from food but also spiritual fasting from worldly attachments that keep us from communion with God. At prayer in the desert, Christ rejects the temptations of Satan by reciting a scripture verse from Deuteronomy 8:3, “One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.” The Lord recognizes that bodily fasting becomes a prayer only when it moves us to cling to God’s Word. This Lent may we take time to prepare for the Sunday Eucharist not only by fasting, but also by meditating on the weekly scriptures.

In the second century, Saint Justin Martyr wrote one of the earliest accounts of the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist. He recounts that after the breaking of the bread, the early Christians would be moved to give alms and “take care of all who are in need” (*First Apology, 67*). The Church has always recognized an inseparable bond between the sacrifice of the Mass and the sacrifice of almsgiving. Saint John Chrysostom even understood almsgiving as a Eucharistic action. He described the poor person as an “altar” where one could encounter the Body of Christ and offer everywhere a daily sacrifice (*Homily 20 on Second Corinthians*). As we remember the sacrifice of Christ at each Sunday Eucharist, may we always remember the poor.

Christ entered the desert for 40 days to prepare for the mission ahead of Him. Following the Lord’s example, we enter the Lenten desert of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving with the goal of becoming Eucharistic missionaries. The Holy Spirit is leading each of us to a personal encounter with the Lord and calling us to pray and fast for the conversion of many hearts during this grace-filled moment of Eucharistic Revival.

Let us follow the Spirit’s guidance with open hearts ready to receive the Lord; and may the heart of Jesus, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, be praised, adored, and loved with grateful affection, at every moment, in all the tabernacles of the world, even to the end of time.

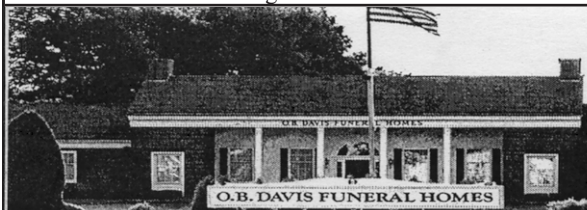
