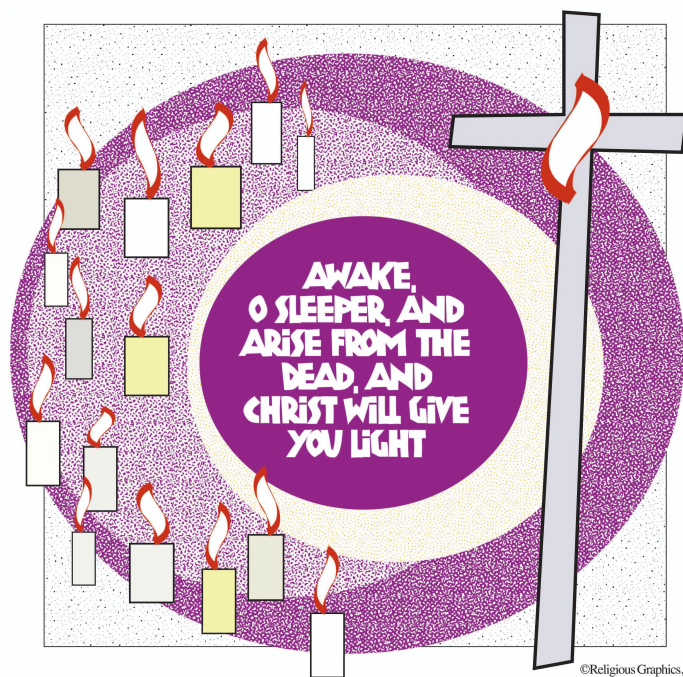

## A Message from the Pastor



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last Tuesday, I went to my former high school, St. Anthony's in South Huntington, to hear the confessions of the students. Each year during Advent and Lent, they are offered the opportunity for this sacrament. Not only is this a wonderful trip down memory lane for me as I walk the halls of a place I once called home, but now as a priest it is a particularly grace-filled experience to offer the sacrament of God's mercy to young people who are learning how to navigate their lives as adults. While I am grateful for the many who will take advantage of the opportunity for confession, I'm also aware of those who do not approach. Some of them are simply not Catholic. But I suspect a number of them are! They do not see the need to make a good confession and receive not only God's forgiveness in sacramental absolution, but also the edifying grace that enables them to live holier lives. Despite solid catechesis, something prevents them from coming to the sacrament. They sit there on the bleachers, chatting quietly with a friend or scrolling through their phones. I find myself praying for them, those who remain on the bleachers rather than coming to the font of mercy itself.

As we enter our fourth full week of Lent, we hear the story of the blind man healed by Jesus. There is great tension in this scene between Jesus and the Pharisees, the latter resisting the idea that – ironically – Jesus is who the blind man sees Him to be. I think of the Pharisees as being “on the bleachers” so to speak, unable to come to Jesus because of their preconceived notions about Him, or themselves. The challenge for them to break free of their blinders and see Jesus is just too much! They are the blind ones, and to their detriment. It will be only in the light of the Resurrection that they can understand all the Jesus said, and was. And even then, many of them will remain intransigent in their blindness.

The Lenten season is a time for us to “come off the bleachers” and experience Jesus in a deeper, more personal way. There are two indispensable ways for that encounter to happen: the Mass and the Confessional. I encourage each one to take advantage of God's mercy in confession. We may think of it as a lamentable chore, but it is a sacrament of abiding joy. In confession, our blindness is lifted as we become aware not only of our sin, our blindness, but so much more importantly, of what God has done through the cross and Resurrection of Christ His Son! *“By his wounds we are healed,”* acclaimed Isaiah the prophet. And in Jesus, that healing love conquers the blindness of sin.

We are approaching Holy Week in a short time. Please take advantage of the sacrament of Reconciliation, whether it is at our parish on Saturday afternoon or on the Monday of Holy Week. Don't remain on the bleachers. Go to the One Who desires nothing more than to heal your blindness and bring you to His amazing light and life!

May you continue to have a meaningful Lent!

## Laetare Sunday

It's optional, but I've always liked it — when the Church's sacred ministers wear "pink" on Laetare Sunday — Roman Catholicism's Fourth Sunday of Lent. The day's theme comes from the entrance antiphon reflecting on Isaiah 66:10-11: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast." Laetare is the first word — meaning "rejoice" — in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent's Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Call it pink — or, more fittingly, rose — this change in color indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

The joy of Easter being around the corner is symbolized in a few other interesting liturgical possibilities. During Lent, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal forbids flowers adorning the altar. But on Laetare Sunday (as well as solemnities and feasts within the season), there's a temporary halt to these penitential observations! I remember well decking out the altar with pink roses on that day when I was once a parish liturgy director. At one time, marriages were generally forbidden during Lent, but Laetare Sunday was often associated as a day when marriages could be celebrated during the penitential season. While marriages are now only forbidden on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, Laetare Sunday is still a fitting day for those wishing to be married before Eastertide. Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a "shot in the arm" as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It's an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday — the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and that our hearts will always be filled with joy! Being aware of traditions and customs assists us in celebrating the beauty of our faith. As you can see, there is much associated with even a nondescript day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent — not to mention the rest of the season, or the 50 days of Easter and beyond. Take advantage of the richness of our Catholic traditions.

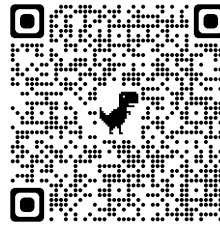

## Breaking Open the Word

**Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?**

**March 26, 2023**

**Fifth Sunday of Lent**

**Jn 11:1-45**

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to him saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?" Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." He said this, and then told them, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him." So the disciples said to him, "Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." But Jesus was talking about his death, while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him." When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you." As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him. So when the Jews who were with her in the house comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out, they followed her, presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there. When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and deeply

troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go." Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

### Reflection Questions

- Why do you think that Jesus did not go immediately to Lazarus the moment he got news that he was sick? How was Jesus preparing the disciples for what was going to happen?
- We see that both Mary and Martha both say the same thing to Jesus when they first see him after Lazarus' passing. What do you make of Jesus' responses to the both of them and why do you think they were different?
- How does Jesus use this miracle to point back to the Father?
- Think about a time where you were moved deeply in your spirit to see God move in your life or in the life of others. What happened? How did that impact your view of God?

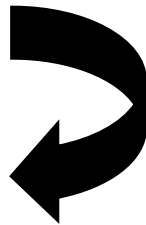

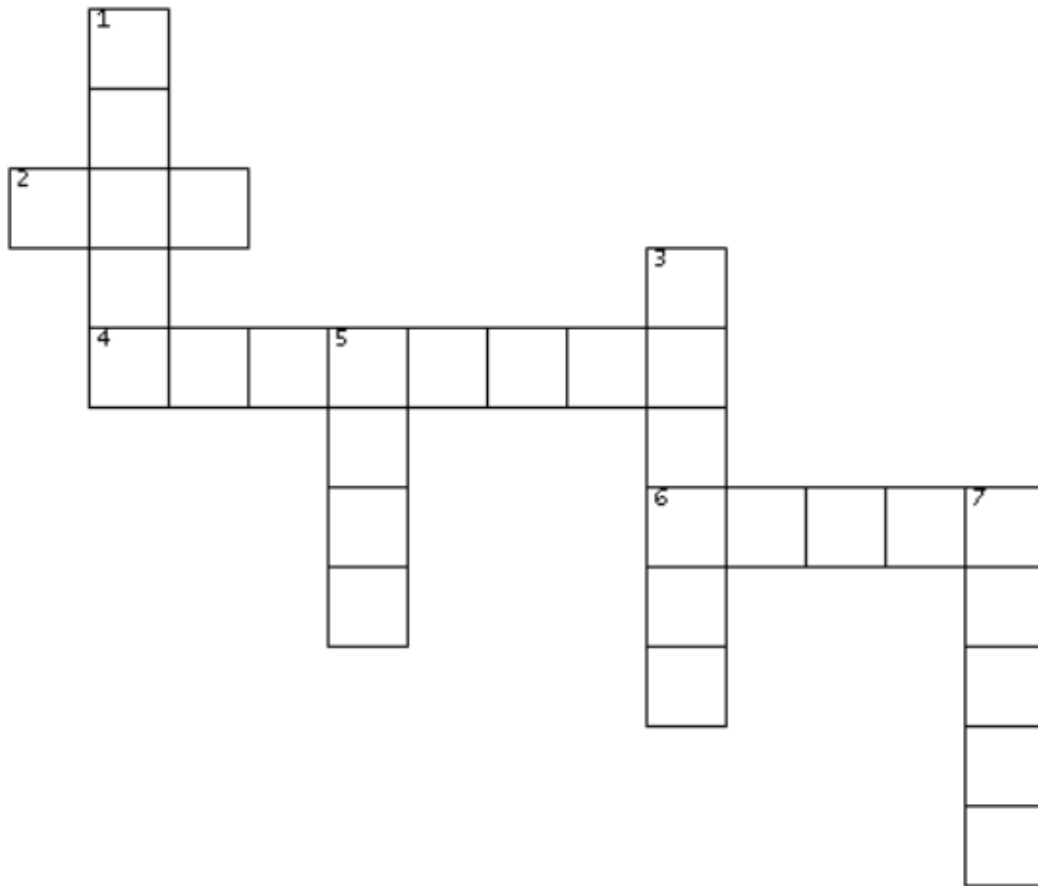

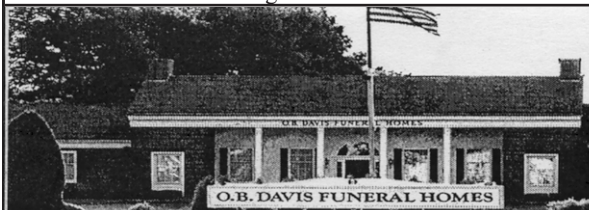
