A Message from the Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I look to celebrate Mothers' Day with you this weekend, I will be particularly cautious when I greet families after Mass. I know that may seem a bit odd, but it flows from a couple of regrettable moments I've had - ones where I had stuck my proverbial foot in my mouth. To most women this weekend, the natural greeting is to say: "Happy Mother's Day!" But there have been times when, a split second after I have said that, I remember quickly that the woman I'm speaking to does not have children or, worse still, I remember that she has been unable to have children, or some other regrettable situation. For most people, this weekend is one to celebrate their moms and grandmas with joy and gratitude. But it can also be a time when one may experience sadness or anxiety because of their unique circumstances, either as a mother, or in relationship with their own mother.

Allow me to offer this meditation, a prayer really, as we reflect on the immeasurable gift and responsibility of motherhood. It was penned by Amy Young, an author and speaker, and captures what many of us would like to say this weekend:

To those who gave birth this year to their first child—we celebrate with you.

To those who lost a child this year - we mourn with you.

To those who are in the trenches with little ones every day and wear the badge of food stains - we appreciate you.

To those who experienced loss through miscarriage, failed adoptions, or running away—we mourn with you.

To those who walk the hard path of infertility, fraught with pokes, prods, tears, and disappointment - we walk with you. Forgive us when we say foolish things. We don't mean to make this harder than it is.

To those who are foster moms, mentor moms, and spiritual moms - we need you.

To those who have warm and close relationships with your children - we celebrate with you.

To those who have disappointment, heart ache, and distance with your children - we sit with you.

To those who lost their mothers this year - we grieve with you.

To those who experienced abuse at the hands of your own mother - we acknowledge your experience.

To those who lived through driving tests, medical tests, and the overall testing of motherhood - we are better for having you in our midst.

To those who are single and long to be married and mothering your own children - we mourn that life has not turned out the way you longed for it to be.

To those who step-parent - we walk with you on these complex paths.

To those who envisioned lavishing love on grandchildren -yet that dream is not to be, we grieve with you.

To those who will have emptier nests in the upcoming year - we grieve and rejoice with you.

And to those who are pregnant with new life, both expected and surprising -we anticipate with you.

This Mother's Day, we walk with you. Mothering is not for the faint of heart, and we have real warriors in our midst. We remember you.

May the Lord in His goodness increase all mothers with every grace they need to embrace fully the noble vocation to which they have been called. And may they know of our love and affection always.

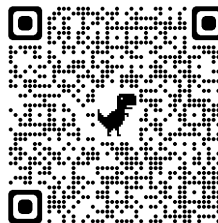

May 21, 2023

Seventh Sunday of Easter

Jn 17:1-11a

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to your son, so that your son may glorify you, just as you gave him authority over all people, so that your son may give eternal life to all you gave him. Now this is eternal life, that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ. I glorified you on earth by accomplishing the work that you gave me to do. Now glorify me, Father, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began.

"I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours, and everything of mine is yours and everything of yours is mine, and I have been glorified in them. And now I will no longer be in the world, but they are in the world, while I am coming to you."

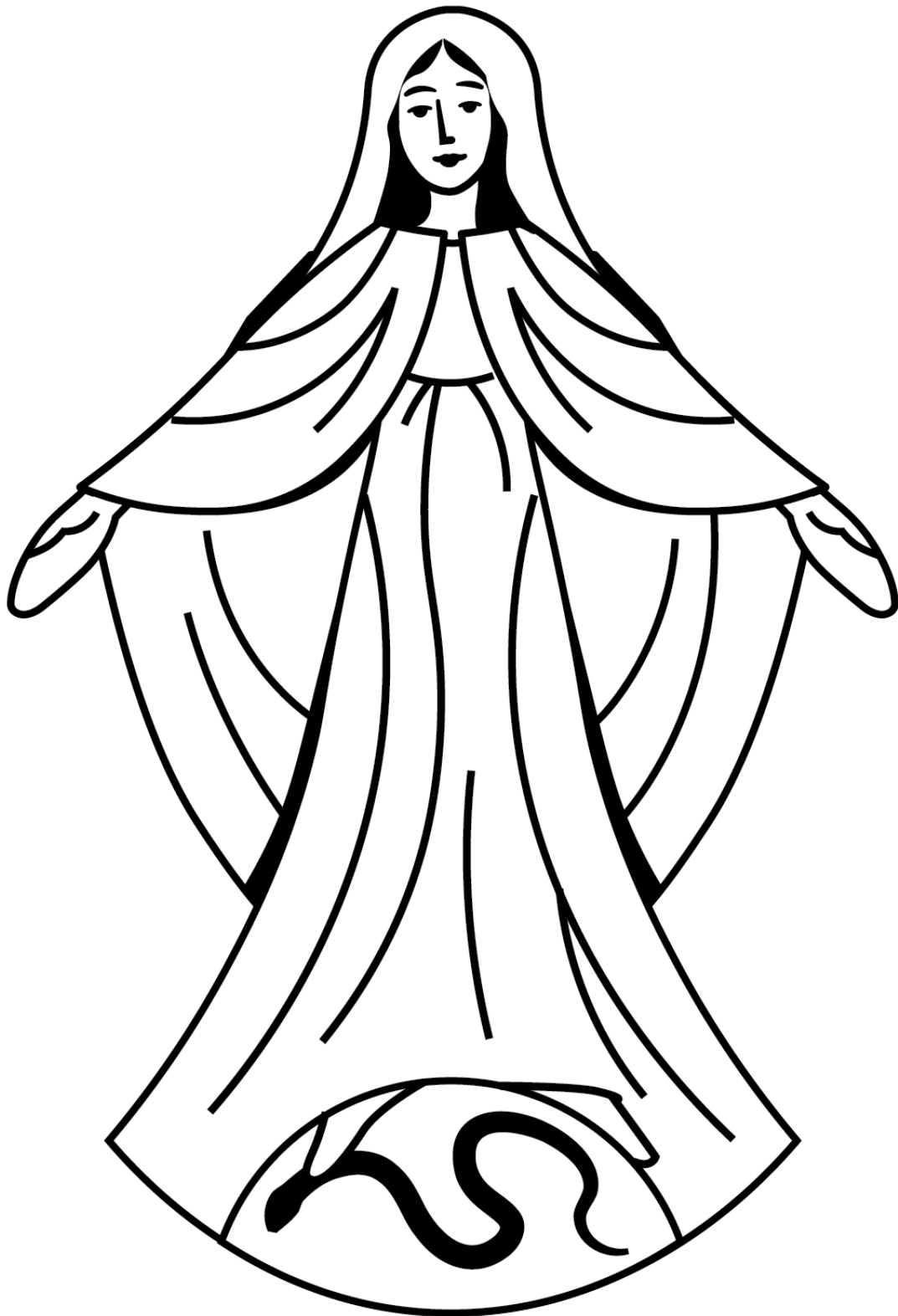

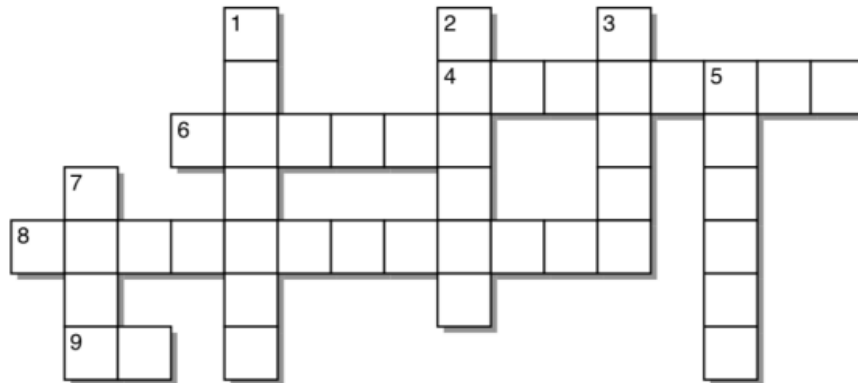

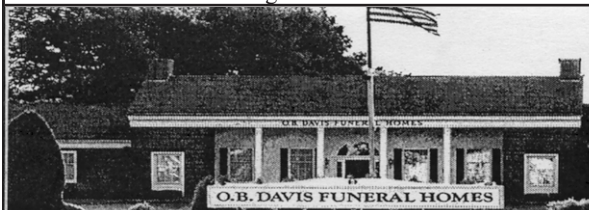
