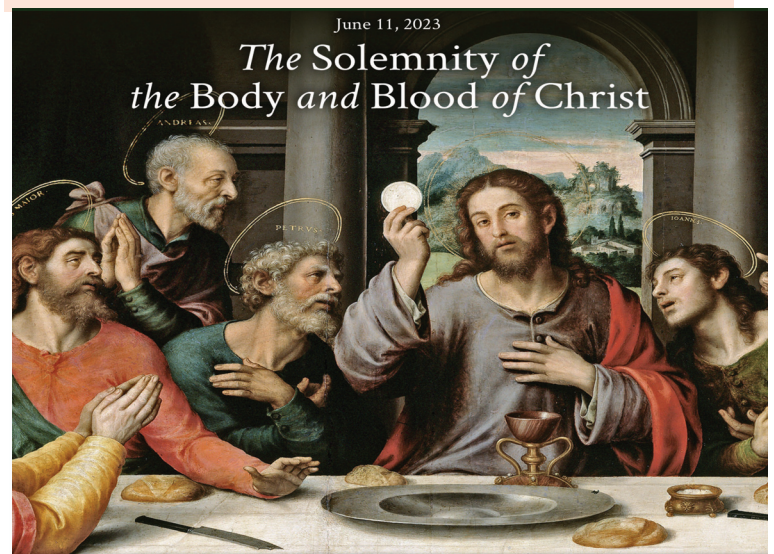

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and
Blood of Christ

The True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament

Let me begin with the following statement: Our celebration of the Eucharist and our reception of Holy Communion are the center of our Catholic faith.

As St. Paul states, this act of unity is intended to convey a belief in “a common faith, hope and Lord.” Unfortunately, even among Catholics, there are divergent views as to what takes place at the Eucharistic celebration. Specifically, those divergent views center on the very nature and reality of what Holy Communion is. Recent national surveys have indicated that only thirty percent of American Catholics believe in the True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Equally, if not more troubling, is the fact that these surveys further convey that, of those who attend Mass regularly (regularly being defined as those only attending Mass at least once per month), the percentage is a mere sixty-two percent.

This lack of belief in the True Presence is the result, in part, of poor catechesis within the Church for several decades. To address this problem, the bishops of the American Church have inaugurated a two-year Eucharistic Revival that began on Jun 19, 2022, and that will conclude on July 17, 2024. In this first year, activities occurred at the diocesan level. With the commencement of the second year, beginning on June 11, 2023, the focus will shift to the parish level.

To that end, over the next several weeks and in preparation for a Eucharistic Revival in our parish, I would like to present to you nine proofs or strong arguments that, taken individually, vigorously support the belief in the True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and, in my opinion when taken as a whole, these nine proofs present irrefutable evidence of this. Not symbol, but rather His very Self, Jesus is made present in His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

So, let me offer here the FIRST PROOF, found in the “Bread of Life Discourse” in Chapter 6 of John’s Gospel, that testifies to Jesus’ True Presence in the Blessed Sacrament. It is Jesus’ own words: *“Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.”* (Jn 6:53-56). Emphatically, four times in these four verses, Jesus states that we must eat His flesh and drink His blood in order to attain eternal life. There is no symbolism contained in these words!

In fact, it becomes even more literal when we realize that the word “eat” does not exist in the Aramaic language, the language that Jesus spoke. The translation of the word Jesus would have used in this text, in lieu of eat, is *munch, chew, or gnaw!* Now, reread the four verses above replacing the word “eat” with any of these choices, and it becomes more obvious why, after hearing Jesus speak, so many of his followers left Him.

They knew that Jesus meant it literally!

THE SHOCKING TRUTH

Jesus said, “Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life.” This teaching was so shocking that many of his followers left at that moment! Jesus did not call them back to clarify, because he knew they understood correctly. He was actually telling them to eat his flesh and drink his blood.

As Catholics, we believe Jesus’ words literally, not symbolically. The substance of the bread and wine transform into the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ at every Mass. We call this miracle the Eucharist.

This Sunday we celebrate a second solemnity during this period of Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This day was once called Corpus Christi, which is Latin for “Body of Christ.” In the revised Lectionary the name for this day is expanded to reflect more completely our Eucharistic theology.

Today's Gospel is taken from the Gospel according to John. The reading is part of a discourse between Jesus and a crowd of Jews. The discourse comes shortly after the miracle of Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and fishes. In John's Gospel, miracles such as this are identified as “signs” through which people come to believe that Jesus is the Son of God. These signs are followed by dialogue, or discourse that interprets and explains the miracle. In John's Gospel, Jesus' multiplication of the loaves is said to have occurred near Passover, thus linking it to the Exodus story and God's saving action toward the Israelites.

Having seen Jesus multiply the loaves and fishes, the crowd pursues him, perhaps seeking more food but also looking for another sign. Jesus tells the crowd that he is the bread of life. He explains that just as God gave the Israelites manna to sustain them in the desert, so now God has sent new manna that will give eternal life. It is in this context that Jesus repeats those words in today's Gospel and tells them again that he is the living bread that came down from heaven.

Jesus' words are not well understood by the crowd; they argue that Jesus is not from heaven but born of Mary and Joseph. The crowd also has trouble understanding how Jesus could give them his flesh to eat. Jesus tells them that when they eat his flesh and drink his blood, they will remain forever connected to him. These are difficult words, but they are important because they seek to show us our intimate connection with Jesus.

This is the mystery that is at the heart of our Eucharistic theology. In the elements of bread and wine, Jesus' Body and Blood are truly present. When we share in the Body and Blood of Christ, Jesus himself comes to dwell within us. This communion with the Lord makes us one body, brings us eternal life, and sends us forth to be Christ's Body in the world.

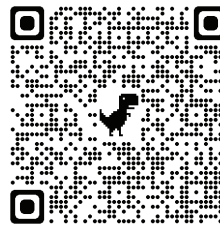

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

June 18, 2023

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 9:36 - 10:8

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Reflection Questions

- How did Jesus respond when he saw the crowd of people? Why? What was Jesus' solution to the problem He saw before him?
- How can we prepare for the harvest? Are you ready for harvesting? What do we need to do to be a worker in God's harvest fields?
- What did Jesus give his twelve disciples? Do you think this was a permanent gift or just a short term one? Have we been given this gift?
- Do we ever think of ourselves as Jesus' "disciples"? What does that mean for us? Do we ever think of ourselves as Jesus' "apostles"? What does that mean for us?
- Do any of Jesus' instructions seem like instructions to Christians today? Which ones? Why those? Why not the others? What does it mean to follow these instructions today? In what ways are these instructions "the same" as the ones given to "the twelve"? In what ways are they different?

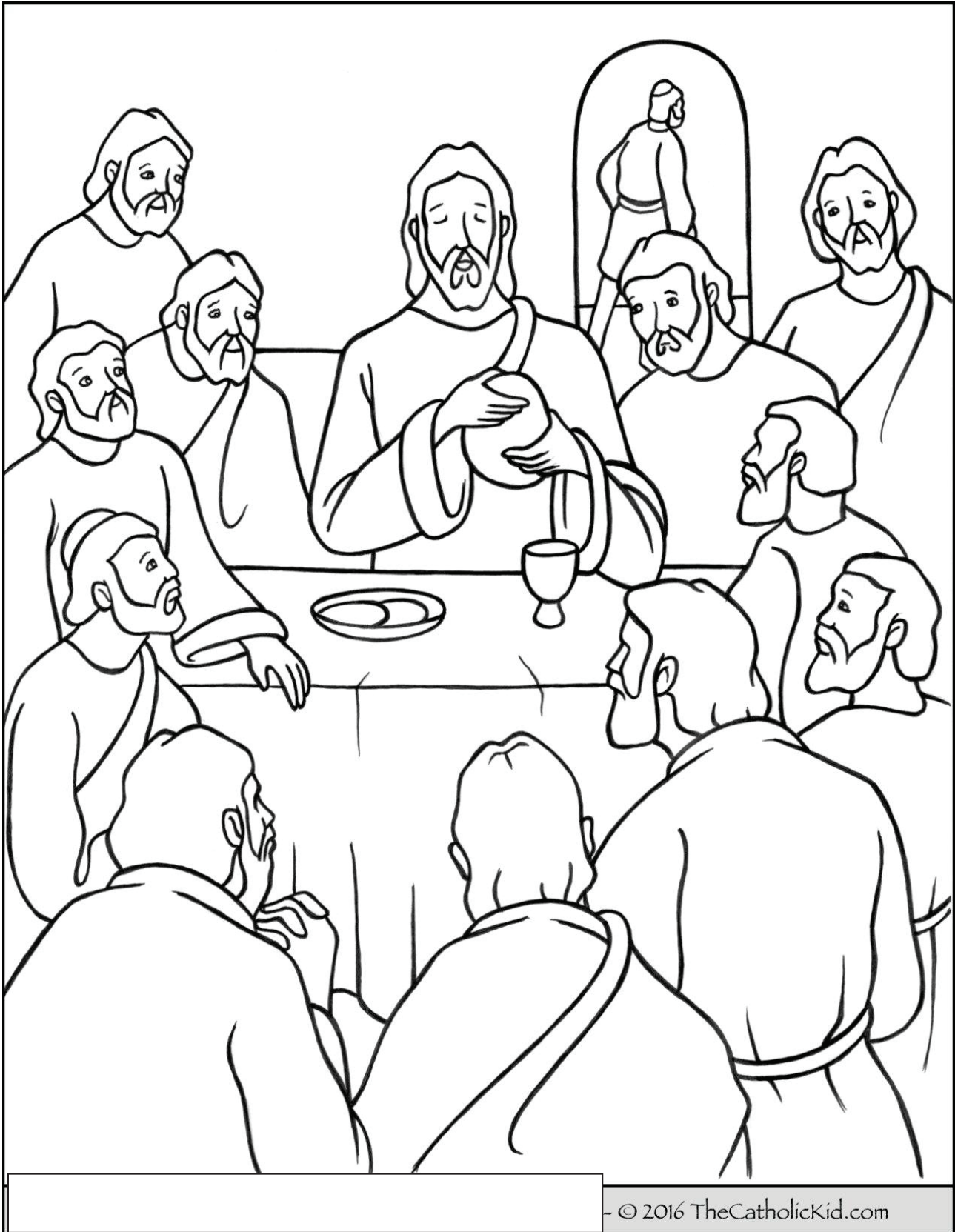
