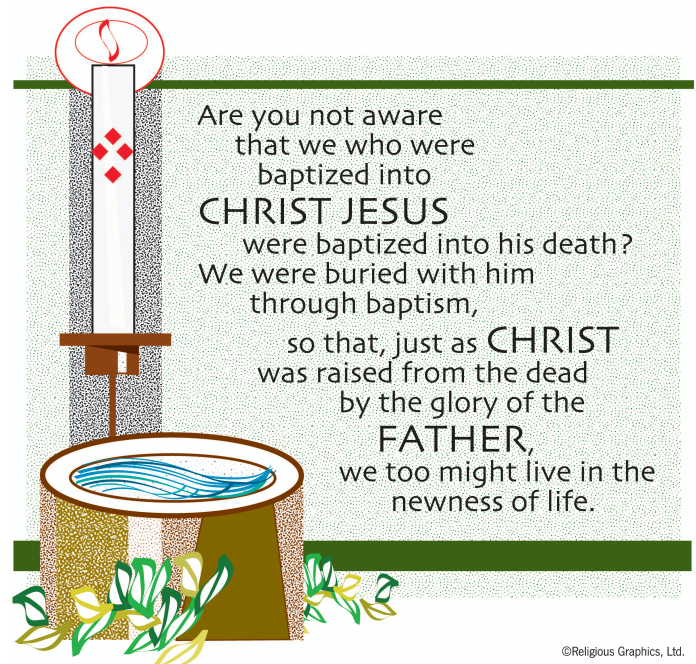

True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament

We turn now to the FIFTH PROOF. Let us examine the words Jesus used to institute the Eucharist. These words can be found in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, as well as in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. I have chosen to use the words of institution from Matthew's Gospel. *"While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat, this is my body. Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it them, saying "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins."* In these words, Jesus institutes the Eucharist and fulfills in the Eucharistic celebration that which He spoke of in the Bread of Life Discourse that we discussed at length in the first proof. Namely, that which he said we would need to eat and drink in order to attain eternal life.

Now, taken together, the words Jesus spoke in the Bread of Life Discourse and in the Institution of the Eucharist go hand in hand. Both speak unambiguously about His disciples eating His flesh and drinking His blood. If Jesus meant these words only metaphorically then, by the manner in which He spoke in both of these important passages, He has truly misled His disciples into believing that He meant it literally.

If Jesus is not truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, then we, as His disciples, are committing idolatry when we kneel down before a mere piece of bread. Recall the words of the first of the commandments that God had given to Moses: *"I am the Lord your God; you shall place no foreign gods before me."* Kneeling is a form of worship, and it can easily be construed as idolatry if it is a mere piece of bread before which we kneel. In fact, many non-Catholic Christians believe that we do just that. It then stands to reason that it is true worship, and Jesus has not misled us, only if Jesus is truly Present in the Blessed Sacrament!

The SIXTH PROOF comes from Paul's Letter to the Corinthians, and it concerns the proper disposition each of us should have when receiving Holy Communion. And I quote: *"Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself."* (1 Cor 11: 27-29).

We should not receive Holy Communion if, by having committed a serious sin, we are not in a state of grace. By doing so, we commit another serious sin and risk spending eternity without God. First, we must obtain forgiveness of our sins, by God, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Isn't Paul's warning extreme if it is a mere piece of bread?

Let us, then, be properly disposed so that we may worthily receive Jesus' Body and Blood in Holy Communion.

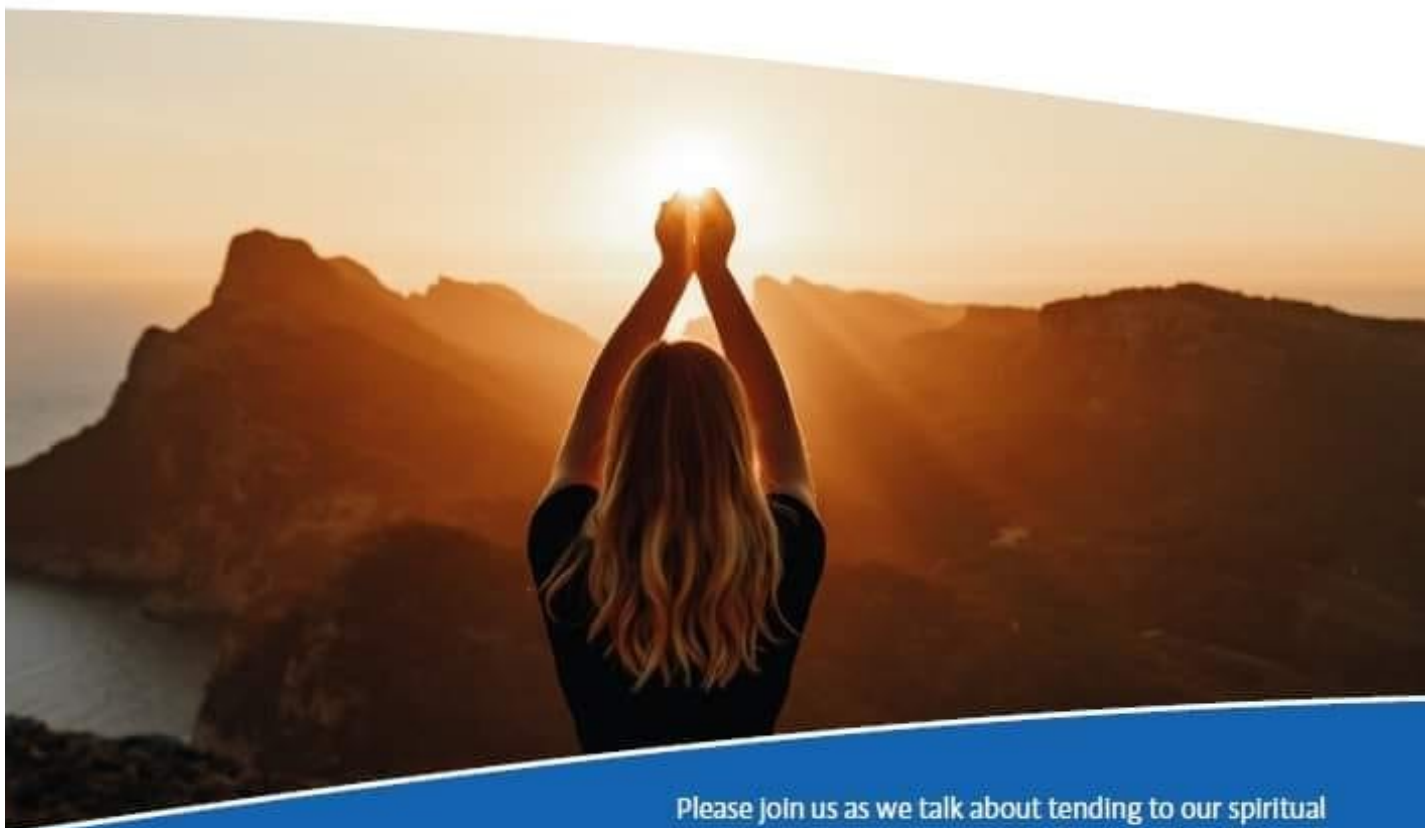

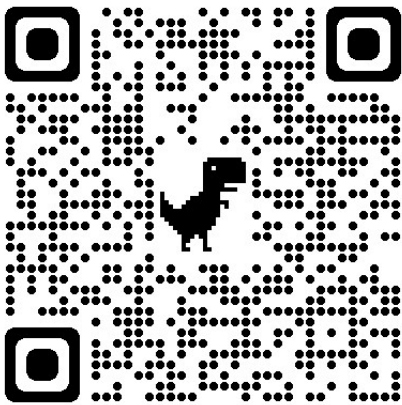
God Sightings!

July 9, 2023

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 11:25-30

At that time Jesus exclaimed:

"I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones. Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him."

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

Reflection Questions

- What did God hide from the wise and learned and revealed to little children? Why would God have done that? Why would Jesus have praised God for doing that?
- What has God given to Jesus? Who does Jesus invite to come to Him? What will Jesus do for them?
