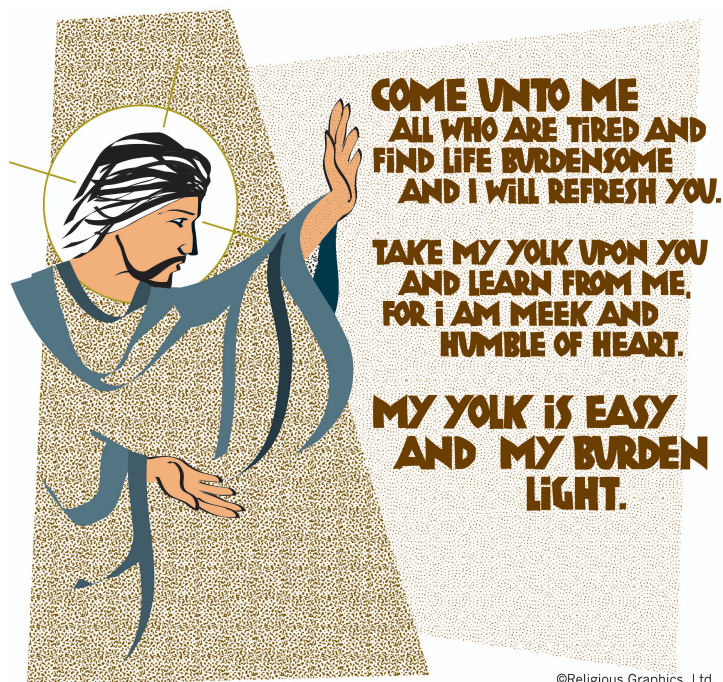

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament

Looking back over the past four weeks, the six proofs that I have presented to you have all been biblically based - explicitly. The last three are not. Yet, in my view, they provide very compelling evidence in their own right.

So now, let us turn to the first of these, which is the SEVENTH PROOF. Specifically, what did the early Church say about the Eucharist, especially the Church of the first century in the immediate aftermath of Jesus' Ascension and the Apostles' public ministry? The answer: quite a lot! And, while numerous sources can be pointed to, for brevity I have chosen one. They are the seven letters that St. Ignatius of Antioch wrote while on his way from Antioch to Rome where, in the Roman Coliseum in the year 107 AD, he would be executed for his Christian faith. These seven letters are still in existence today.

Ignatius was no ordinary Christian. He was arguably the most revered Christian of his time, even more so than the pope was at the time. The reverence paid to him was based upon his intimate relationships with none other than the Apostles Peter, John, and Paul, as well as his sanctity, and the position that he held for forty years as the bishop of Antioch which, was a leading center of Christianity.

In Ignatius' Letter to the Philadelphians, he states: ***"Take care, then, to have but one Eucharist. For there is one flesh of our Lord Jesus Christ, and one cup to show forth the unity of His blood; one altar; as there is one bishop, along with the priests and deacons, my fellow-servants."***

In his Letter to the Smyrnaeans, making reference to heretics who denied the True Presence, Ignatius states: ***"From the Eucharist and prayer they hold aloof, because they do not confess that the Eucharist is the flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ."***

From these quotations, it is clear that Ignatius believed in Jesus' True Presence in the Blessed Sacrament and, by extension, the early Church did as well. The reverence in which the early Church held Ignatius testifies to this.

What Ignatius says that a heretic does not confess, we confess:

"... the Eucharist is the flesh (and blood) of our Savior Jesus Christ."

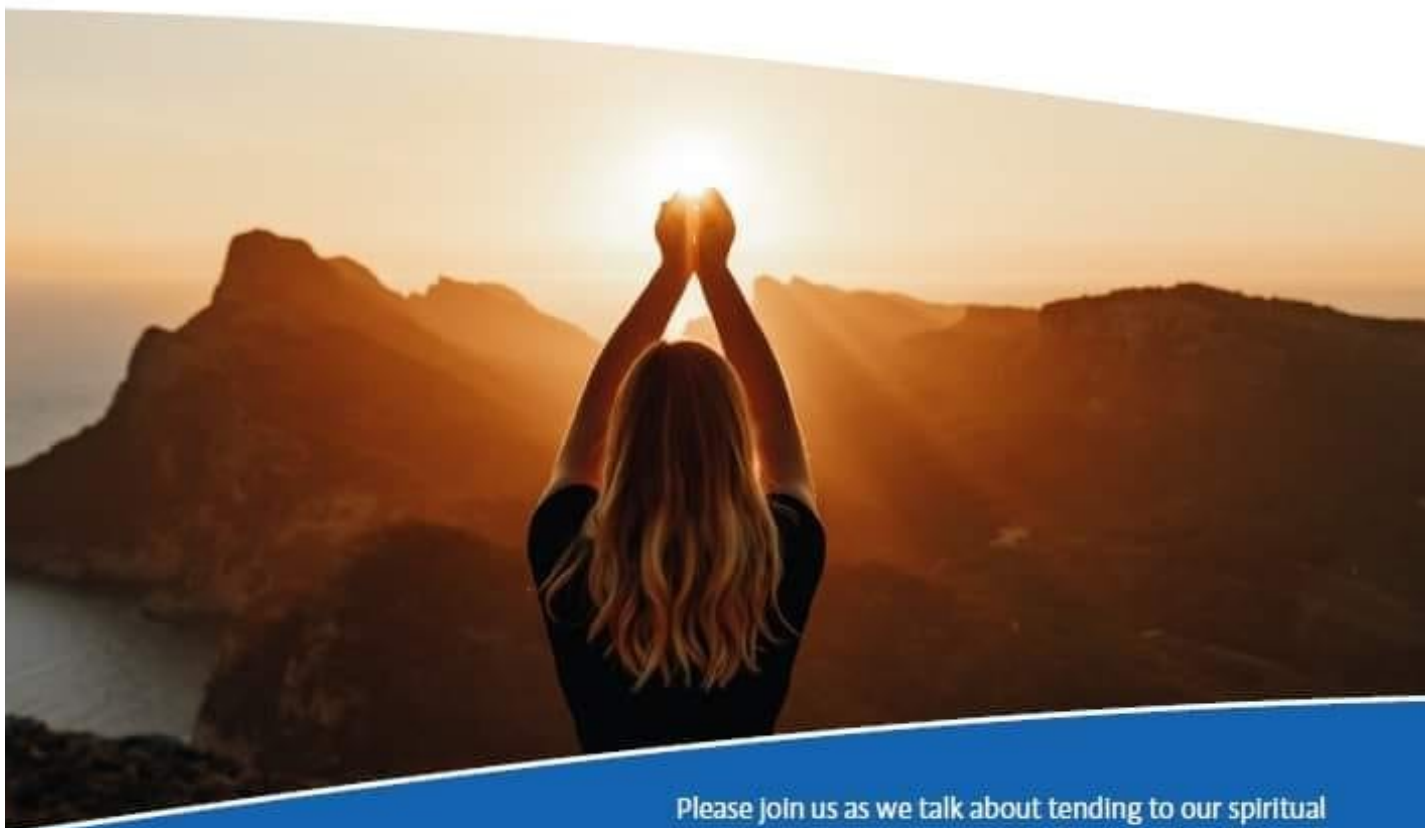

Month of the Precious Blood

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. The faithful are encouraged to honor the Precious Blood always and especially during the month of July. Consider making an act of love to the Precious Blood every day this month, such as an Act of Consecration to the Precious Blood of Jesus and the Litany of the Precious Blood as an act of love and reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Precious Blood courses through the Church, giving life to the Body of Christ. It was the cleansing agent that allowed the holy saints and martyrs to wash their robes clean. It is the price of our redemption, the object of our salvation, and the assurance of our eternal inheritance.

As we honor the Precious Blood of Jesus in union with the Church this month, may it awaken in our hearts a love and gratitude for Christ's gift to us, for He has saved us by His blood.

O God,

we may merit to obtain its fruits.*

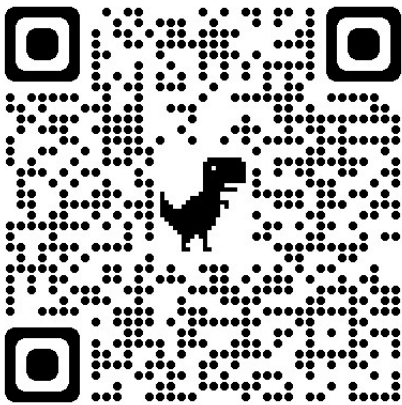

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

July 16, 2023

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 13:1-23

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying:

"A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because *they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand*. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says:

*You shall indeed hear but not understand,
you shall indeed look but never see.
Gross is the heart of this people,
they will hardly hear with their ears,
they have closed their eyes,
lest they see with their eyes
and hear with their ears
and understand with their hearts and be converted,
and I heal them.*

"But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

"Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away

what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

Reflection Questions

- What does the seed represent? Who does the sower represent?
- Who does the seed that fell by the wayside and birds devoured them represent?
- Think about how hardships can choke the word of God. How might you find that happening in your life now, or how it may have happened to you in the past?

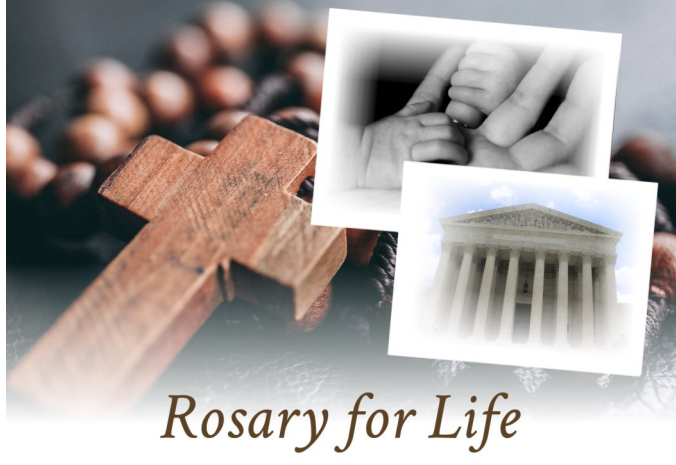

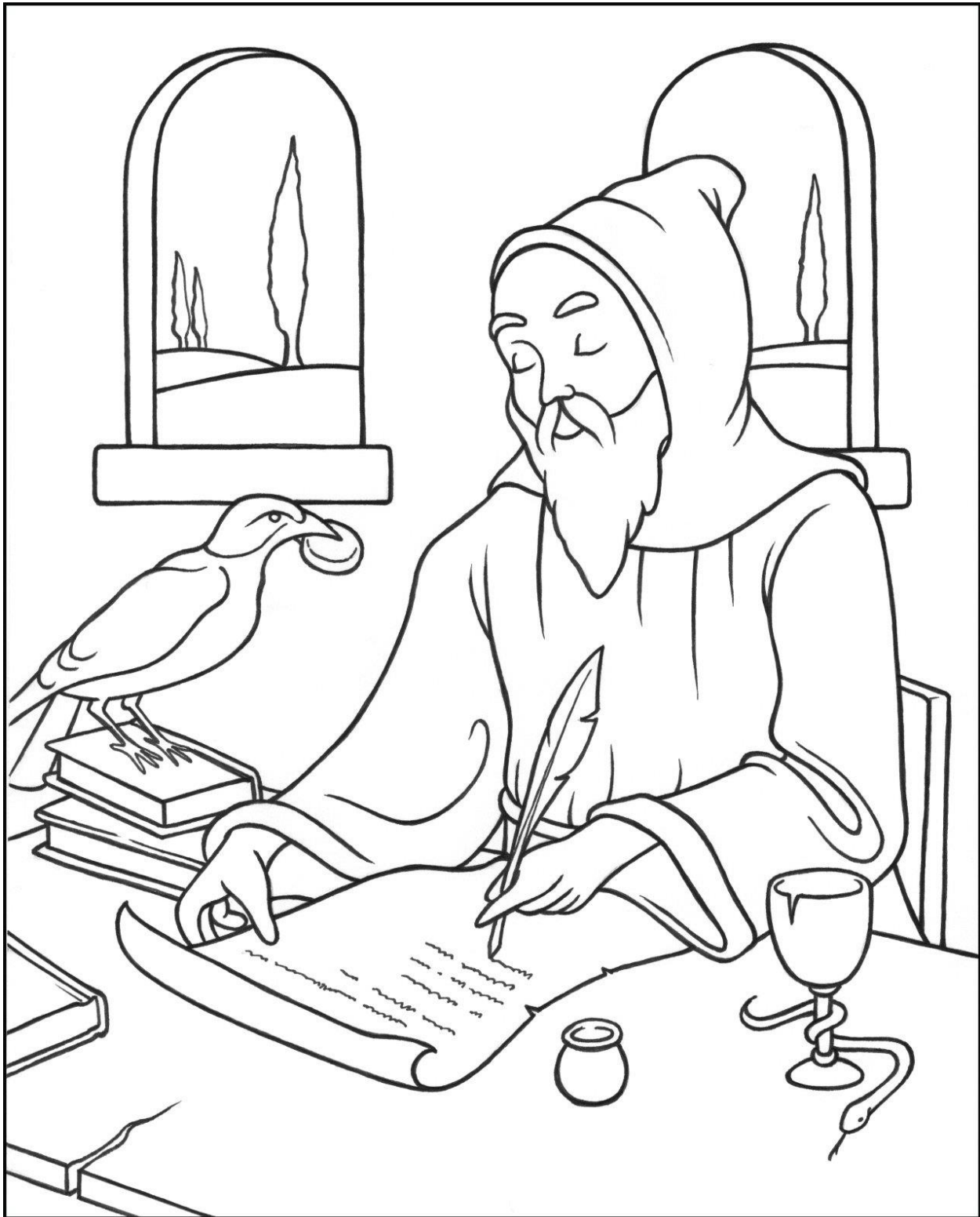
