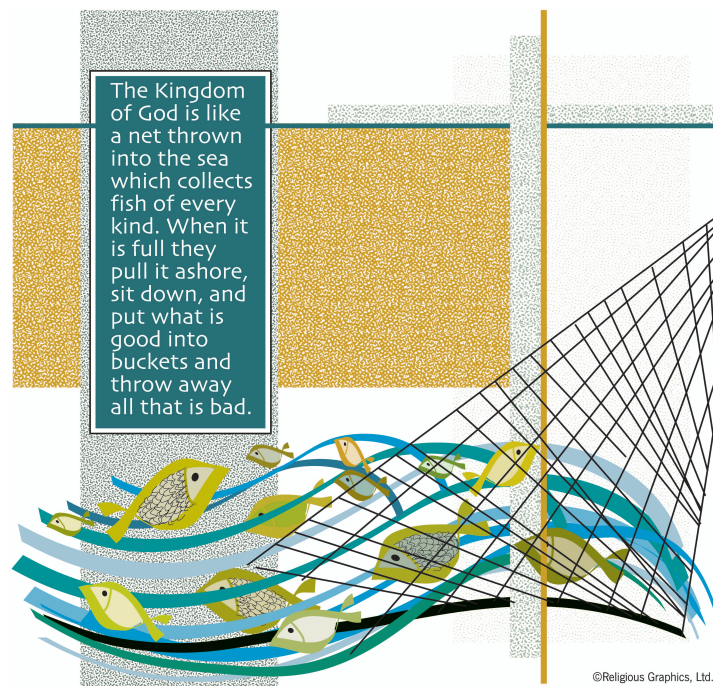

True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament

Over these past weeks, I have given NINE PROOFS, or strong arguments that, taken individually, make a very compelling case for the True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Jesus' own words: *Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood – My flesh is true food and My blood is true drink – Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood.* Jesus meant it literally. Jesus' disciples must believe...even if they have to accept it on faith alone. "Will you leave me also?" Jesus is prepared to start all over again, if necessary, if those disciples refuse to accept this critical teaching.

The Eucharist is prefigured in the Old Testament by the manna in the desert. The study of typology tells us that the Old Testament prefigurements are always less significant than the corresponding fulfillments in the New Testament. If Jesus is not truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, that would make the manna of greater significance, which would be the only exception to this rule.

The Bread is supernatural...this is the translation of the Greek word for "daily" (epiousios) that Jesus uses in the Lord's Prayer.

Jesus' own words to His disciples: *This is My Body; this is My Blood of the covenant.* Jesus has not misled us. He is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament.

The necessity for the Proper Disposition, following St. Paul's admonition, that we knowingly discern the presence of Jesus and that we be free from serious sin.

Universally believed by the Church from its earliest days that "...the Eucharist is the flesh (and blood) of our Savior Jesus Christ.

Even Satanists believe that, in a host consecrated by a Catholic priest, Jesus is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament.

Eucharistic miracles, e.g. in Sokalka, Poland, the consecrated host was the Heart of Jesus truly present in the Blessed Sacrament.

And, as I said at the outset, in my opinion, when taken as a whole, these nine proofs present irrefutable evidence of this. Not a symbol, but rather His very Self, made present in His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

I'm sure that there are other proofs as well, but it is my hope that these nine proofs will strengthen our faith in the True Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and that, with our faith strengthened, our devotion will increase; and that, with our increased devotion, our spirit of worship here will deepen; and that, as our spirit of worship deepens, we will experience a true Eucharistic Revival in our parish-- manifesting our faith in the...

Saint Alphonsus Liguori-Feast Day August 1st



During sixty years of Christian service in central Italy, opposition of every sort stalked St. Alphonsus Liguori. His bullheaded father resisted his ordination. Powerful anticlericals battled the Redemptorists, his religious order. Jansenists denounced Moral Theology, his book that sought to correct them. Rheumatism bent his head into his chest, a deformity he suffered for his last twenty years. And for two years just before he died, Alphonsus was assailed with a dark night of doubt, fear, and scruples.

A successful lawyer before age 20, Alphonsus used his legal skills lifelong in his writing and the governance of his order and his diocese. He was ordained in 1717 and immediately became well-known as a compassionate confessor and down-to-earth preacher. "I have never preached a sermon," he said, "that the poorest old woman in the congregation could not understand." You can hear his gentle voice in the following excerpt that also suggests the secret behind his perseverance:

We are now at the end of 1761. Today the New Year of 1762 has begun. How many saw the beginning of the year that has just gone but did not live to see its end! We should give thanks to God that we are allowed to see its conclusion. But do we know whether we shall see the end of this year? Certainly, many will not see it. Who knows if we shall not be among this number? A year must dawn for us that will be our last. We should awaken our faith and strive for the remainder of our lives to live according to the maxims of our faith. Why should we wait until death overtakes us and finds us living according to the maxims of the world? Let us awaken our faith to realize that this earth is not our true home but that we are merely here as pilgrims.

Our faith will give us confidence in our difficulties, teaching us that whoever prays will be saved. May our faith make us always live with the thought of eternity. Let's keep ever before our eyes this great thought—everything in this world comes to an end, whether it be prosperity or adversity. Eternity alone never ends.

In 1748, St. Alphonsus published his acclaimed Moral Theology that steered a middle way between the rigorism of the Jansenists and an irresponsible laxity. At age sixty-six, he reluctantly accepted appointment as bishop of Sant' Agata and worked hard for thirteen years to renew his flock. His resignation in 1775 brought the saint no rest, as he had to fight to protect his community from the state. External politics threatened to divide and destroy the Redemptorists. But the community endured and today has missionaries serving throughout the world. Exhausted by a life of extraordinary industry, St. Alphonsus Liguori died on August 1, 1787, two months before his ninety-first birthday.

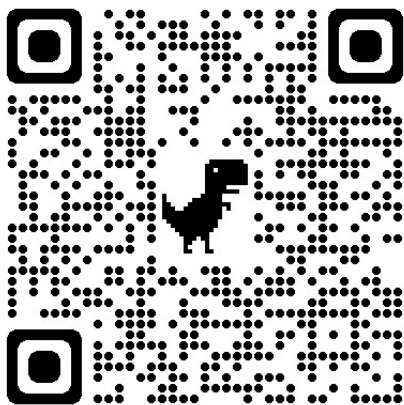


the suggested items - HOWEVER, anything that you return would be very much appreciated.

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

August 6, 2023

Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

Mt 17:1-9

Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

Reflection Questions

- What does the Transfiguration tell us about who Jesus is?
- Why is it significant that Moses and Elijah were present?
- When you think of Jesus, do you have a tendency to forget about, or to downplay, His power and holiness?
- Do you think focusing on Christ's power and holiness more would affect your spiritual life? Why or why not?
- What does it mean for you and me to be transformed (or "transfigured") into the image of Jesus?

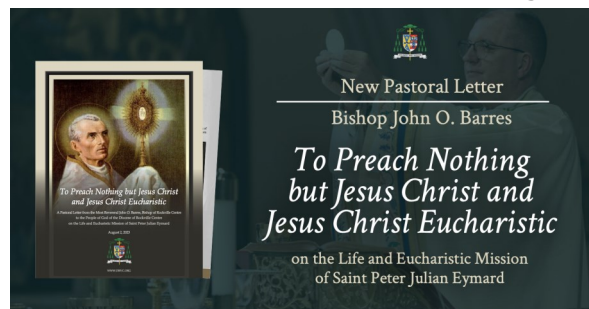

The August 5th *Saturdays at Six Concert* at historic All Souls Church ([61 Main Street, Stony Brook](http://61MainStreet.com)) will feature a very special CONVERSATIONS ON THE SACRED. The concert will combine poetry, music and drumming in one very unique performance for the community. The special program was the brain child of Stony Brook poet and literary scholar Carmen Bagan. She suggested the sacred readings for the evening and collaborated with Stony Brook University composers and musicians Ford Fourqurean and Lindsay Ross, All Souls organist Dan Kinney, and Native American Drummer Ric Statler on the musical interludes between readings.

The selection of poems and religious texts include works that are widely regarded for their technical virtuosity and lyrical beauty. Christian and Judaic religions are in conversation with Taoism, Zen Buddhism, and Native American tradition, as the selections will be placed in descending chronological order, beginning with a Native American chant, all the way to several hundred years before Christ with a reading from Lao Tzu.

Long Island poets Adam Fisher, Linda Dickman, Mindy Kronenberg, Vivian Vioria Fisher, Greg Alexander, Bruce Johnson, Jack Zaffos, and Kathy Donnelly will serve as readers. The musical pieces interspersed with the poetry will include Native American Drumming; a mix of baroque, modern, improvisation; and some classical hymns performed by Dan Kinney on All Souls' almost 200-year-old Henry Erben-designed tracker organ.

There will be a 15-minute intermission and refreshments will be served.

Please join us for a free (donations accepted) memorable night of spiritual readings, music, and fellowship in the historic Stanford White-designed chapel. The program will begin promptly at 6:00pm. 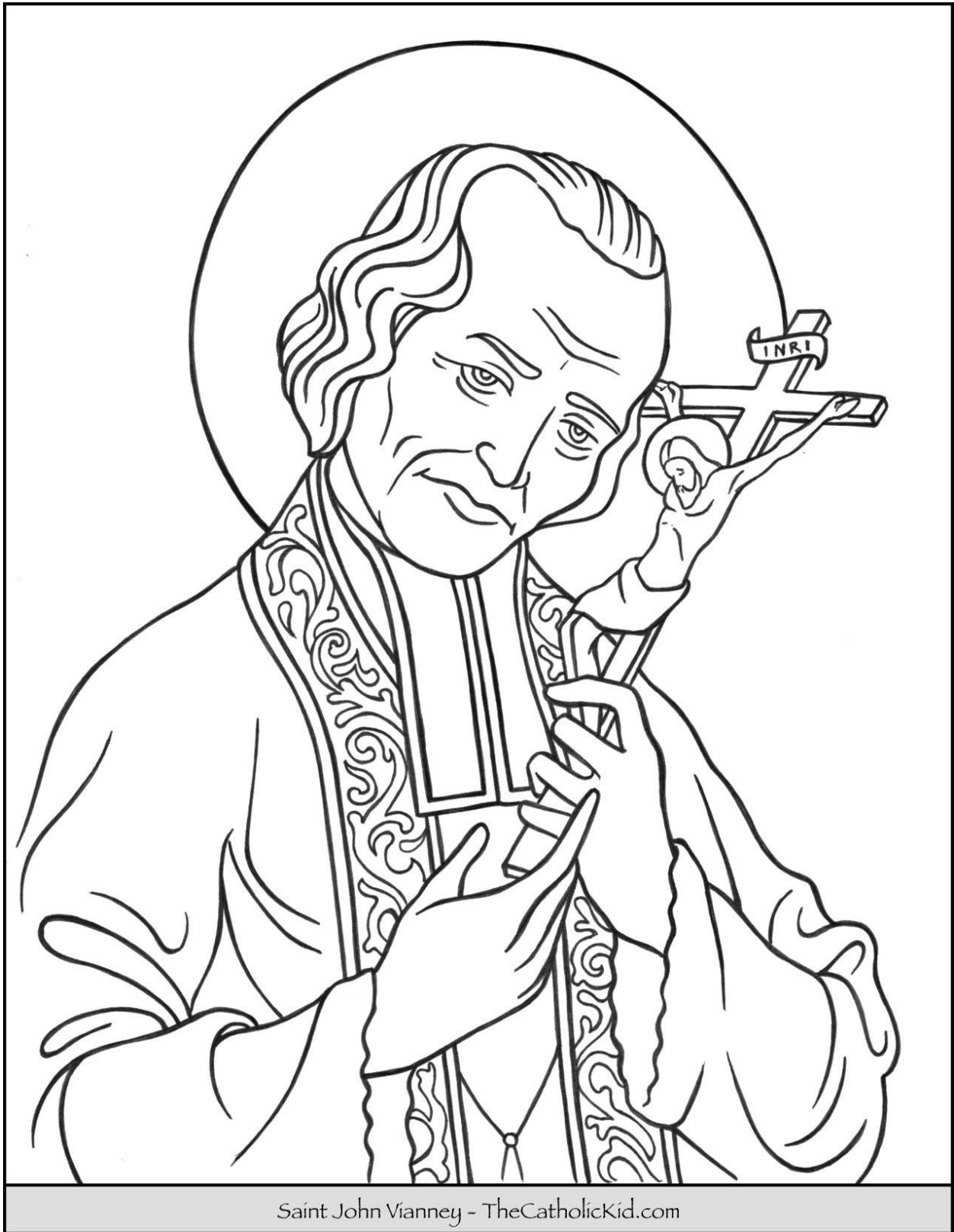
