A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

By now I am sure you have seen school buses driving through your neighborhood in the mornings and afternoons, picking up and bringing children to and from school. While a somber reminder that the more relaxed days of summer are behind us, there is something refreshing about getting back into the regular routine of school, work, and the other usual activities that mark the coming months. Along with the school buses, there are signs reminding us to slow down when driving past schools. Of course, we need to be vigilant, because we never know if a child may be crossing the street. We would never want to do anything that could put a little one at risk and so, reminded by the flashing signs that even tell us our speed, we slow down and become much more aware of where we are and what we are doing.

As we begin this new pastoral year, our parish – indeed the whole country – will also be asking us to slow down in a way. As you may know, we are in the midst of a Eucharistic Revival throughout our nation. It is a time for all of us to slow down amid the hectic pace of life and realize the tremendous gift we have in the Eucharist. Perhaps for some, going to Mass has become something routine – an activity that we do each week and check off on our list. For others, the practice of attending Mass has slipped off the radar and is only occasional and sporadic. Still others are striving for a deeper relationship with God that will sustain them amid the ups and downs of life. In all these situations, delving into the mystery of the Eucharist is the best thing we can possibly do.

As Catholics, we recognize that during Mass the power of the Holy Spirit is invoked by the priest, that the offerings of bread and wine on the altar are transformed at their deepest level into the Body and Blood of Jesus. The term “Real Presence” is used often to describe this action, but the sad truth is that, for many, the word “real” has become watered down or lost altogether. Even among those who regularly attend Mass, data shows that belief in this most Real Presence is waning. As a pastor, it is my obligation, as well as my desire, to develop ways to reinvigorate an authentic understanding of the Eucharist. As a brother disciple, it is my sincerest hope that everyone come to know this most amazing gift Jesus left us as the perpetual means and memorial of His presence.

During the next few months, there will be multiple ways offered to everyone to develop a renewed sense of the Mass and the power of the Eucharist. For now, I simply ask all of us to be open to the power of God, Who wishes to transform us and bring us into fuller communion with Him and each other. That’s what the Eucharist is – the glue that binds us all together. So, let’s get on the bus, and let’s go back to school!

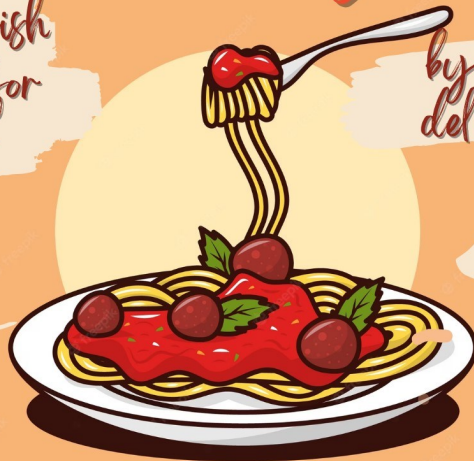

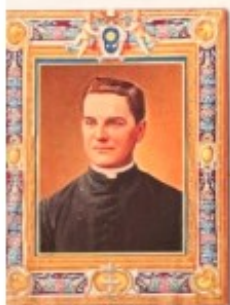

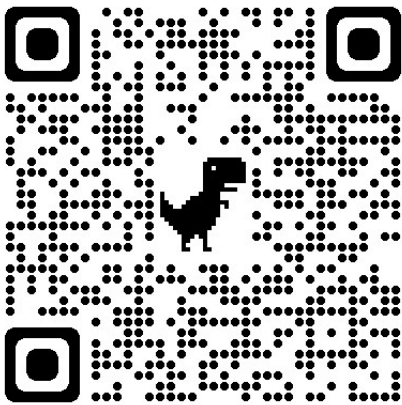

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

September 24, 2023

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 20:1-16a

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Reflection Questions

- What is the kingdom of heaven like? Who is the landowner and what kind of qualities does He have?
- What application could the disciples and we make with this parable?
- Do you feel God owes you something or that you deserve certain things from God?
- Do you ever compare yourself with others? Have you ever felt God has been unfair with you and not given you what you deserve or have you been surprised with God's unexpected generosity?

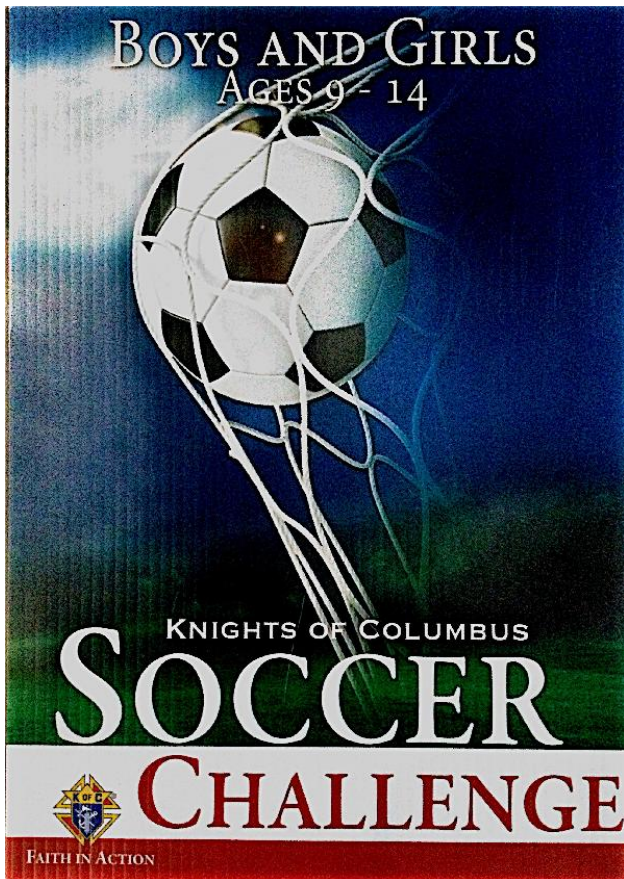

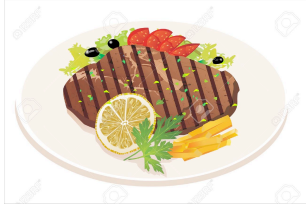

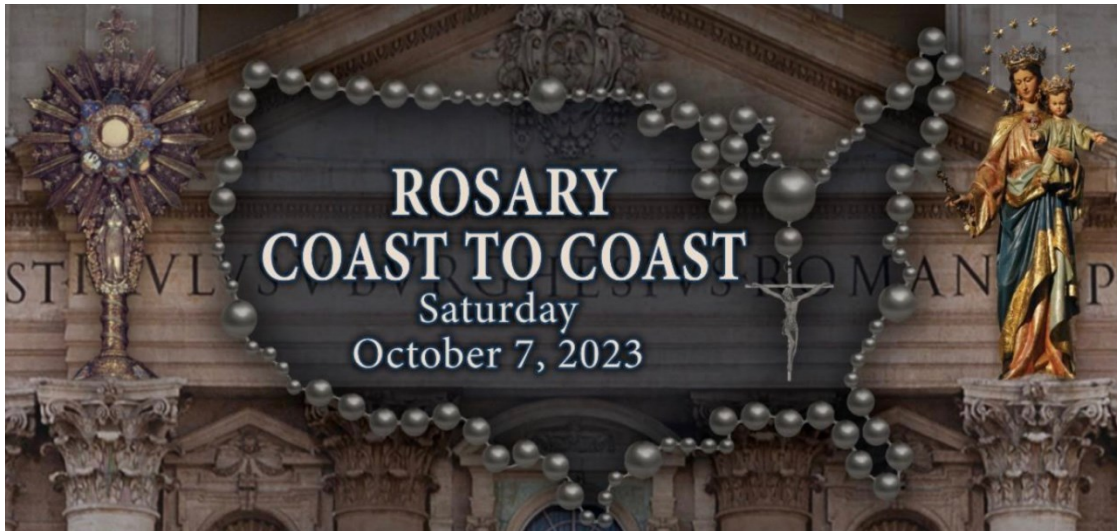
