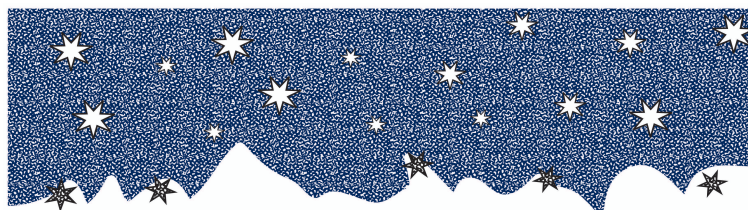

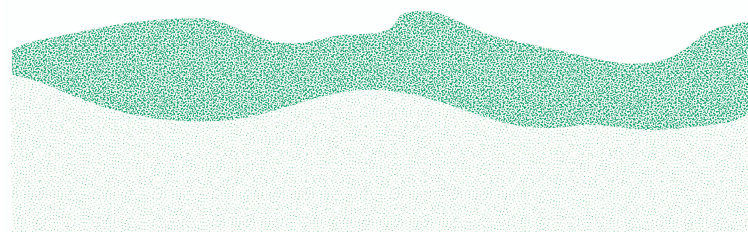

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend, as we begin a new academic year, we have the special opportunity to welcome back our students in religious education, and their families. As you saw at Mass, we offered a special blessing to all our children and their parents. It also gave me the chance to recognize and thank the many dedicated catechists – religion teachers – who volunteer their time to lead the children’s instruction. Some of these gifted people have been doing this for decades! I am grateful to Patty Longo, our Director of Religious Education, and Jennifer Donnellon, our Office Manager, who work tirelessly to create a dynamic program that aims to aid parents in their most important role of handing on to their children the richness of our Catholic Faith.

I am reminding our parents that religious instruction is different from the other academic classes your children attend. In school, professional teachers are trained to help children learn all the basics they’ll need to know in order to grow and thrive academically. And we know well that education is far more successful when it is encouraged and supported by parents – checking homework, helping to study for tests, and reading every day are crucial tasks for parents in their children’s formation. When it comes to religion, however, the Church is clear that it is the parents who are the first teachers of the Faith. Campy as it sounds, a great way to think of this is that “faith is caught, not taught.” Yes, there is a lot to learn about Catholicism, but a child’s most important teacher is his or her experience of religion within the family. Attending Mass each week, praying daily around meals, and discussing what they are learning in catechism are irreplaceable elements of the child’s growth in faith. Please, remember to pray for the families in our parish religious education and for those guiding them in their faith.

As we start a “new year,” please be sure to keep your eye on the bulletin, and your email, for important information about many activities that will be coming up soon. Also, if you’re tech savvy, please be sure to follow us on our social media platforms for even more immediate information.

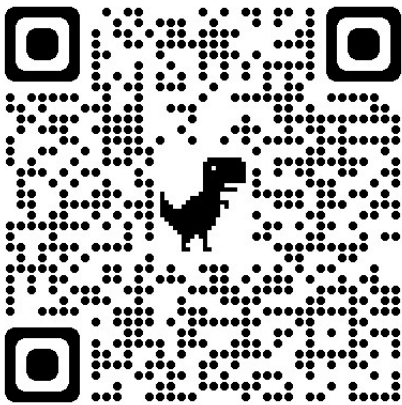

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

October 1, 2023

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He came to the first and said, 'Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.' He said in reply, 'I will not,' but afterwards changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order. He said in reply, 'Yes, sir,' but did not go. Which of the two did his father's will?" They answered, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him."

Reflection Questions

- If you were an employer, which son would you rather hire? Why? Do you see any strengths in the son you did not choose?
- What do you learn about the heart of each son in this parable?
- Who do you think the father in the parable represents?
- In Jesus' context, which groups of people do you think are represented by the first son? ...by the second son?
- Both sons have actions that do not match their words, yet one is noted as doing the will of his father. What do you think the parable is telling us about words and actions when it comes to faith? What is Jesus' point?

I am feeling anxious and overwhelmed. I know that You are with me, but right now I am struggling to trust in Your presence and Your plan. Please help me to find peace in the midst of this anxiety. Help me to quiet my racing thoughts and trust in Your loving care for me.

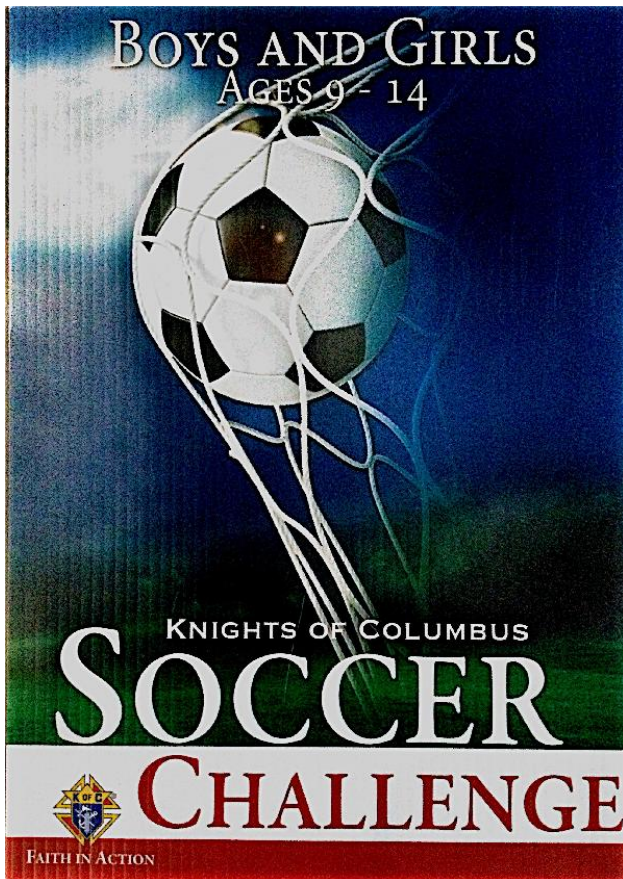

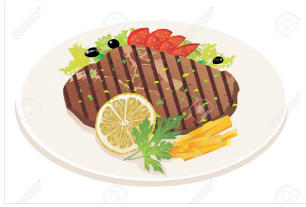
