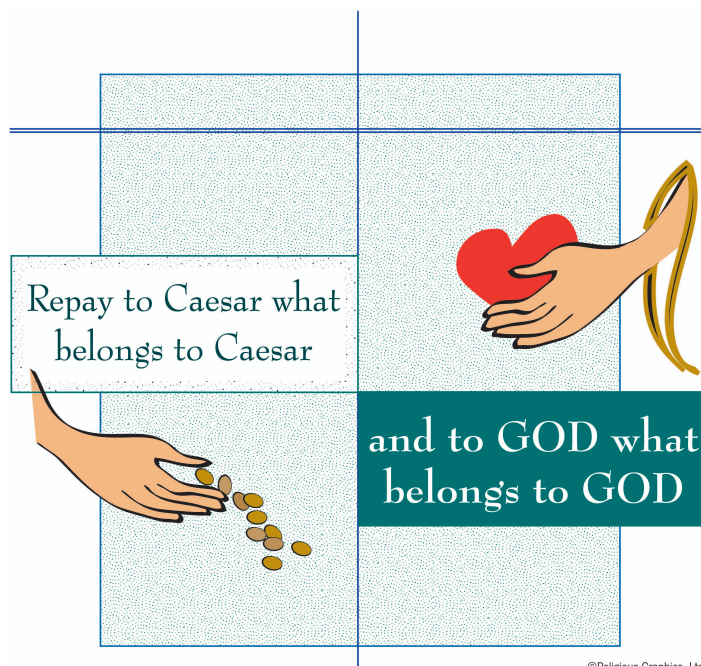

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Friends,

Amid all the tragic news coming out of the Israel-Hamas war, there have been many stories of impressive heroism and courage. One, in particular, caught my attention. Sadly, we know that nearly 200 people are being held hostage by Hamas. Among them are Israeli military personnel, the elderly, women, and children. While world leaders are posturing and pleading for the safe return of all the hostages, one proposal stands out among all the rest.

On September 30th, Pope Francis created twenty-one new cardinals. Among them was Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem. He is the Pope's representative in the Holy Land and surrounding area. In an interview, only days after the horrific attack on Israel and the realization of hostages having been taken, the Cardinal said that the Holy See was using all its resources to help in securing the safety of those hostages. But then, he went further, saying that he would be willing to offer himself in exchange for the children in Hamas' custody. Given his position, he felt he could be seen as more "valuable" and offer safety to innocent children. He is willing to offer himself. As of writing this letter Wednesday afternoon, there has been no move to exchange the Cardinal for hostages, yet still, what a heroic offer!

In my homily last Monday, for the feast of St. Gerard Majella, I remarked about our saint's ability to be a peacemaker. He did so through simple kindness. His charitable spirit brought out the best in people and helped them to gain perspective on what was most important in life: love of God and each other. As has often been said, September 11, 2001 saw not only the evil side of humanity, but also the most selfless, heroic side as well. We witnessed charity in so many ways, big and small alike. Kindness became a transformative power that brought light to the darkest of situations. Cardinal Pizzabella understands that, too, quite obviously. Being willing to place himself in certain danger to save others couldn't possibly be something he would offer if he hadn't already mastered smaller acts of kindness with great love. The challenge for us, in light of St. Gerard and Cardinal Pizzabella, is to renew our own commitment to being disciples of genuine kindness to all we encounter.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus reminds us "to render unto God what belongs to God." And what is that we are asked to render? To quote the prophet Micah: "You have been told what is good and what God expects of you - to show justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." May we have the grace to put that command into practice each day in small, concrete choices for love. In that way, we can be ready if, and when, we need to show great love!

May you and your families have a peaceful, joyful week!

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

October 29, 2023

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Lk 13:10-17

Jesus was teaching in a synagogue on the sabbath. And a woman was there who for eighteen years had been crippled by a spirit; she was bent over, completely incapable of standing erect. When Jesus saw her, he called to her and said, "Woman, you are set free of your infirmity." He laid his hands on her, and she at once stood up straight and glorified God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant that Jesus had cured on the sabbath, said to the crowd in reply, "There are six days when work should be done. Come on those days to be cured, not on the sabbath day." The Lord said to him in reply, "Hypocrites! Does not each one of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his ass from the manger and lead it out for watering? This daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound for eighteen years now, ought she not to have been set free on the sabbath day from this bondage?" When he said this, all his adversaries were humiliated; and the whole crowd rejoiced at all the splendid deeds done by him.

Reflection Questions

- Why does the lawyer ask Jesus this question? What's his goal?
- What does Jesus mean by the word "love"?
- In what sense is this commandment bad news? In what sense is this commandment good news?
- In what ways did you fall short of the command: to love God with all your heart, soul, and mind?
- We grow in love by cooperating with God's Spirit who lives within us; and we cooperate by practicing the spiritual disciplines, habits such as reading the Word, giving, and serving. What habit will you invest time into this week so that God's Spirit can grow your love?

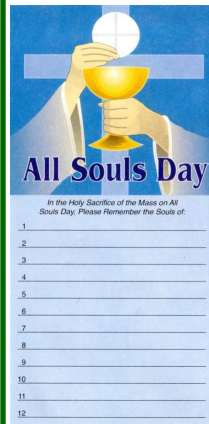

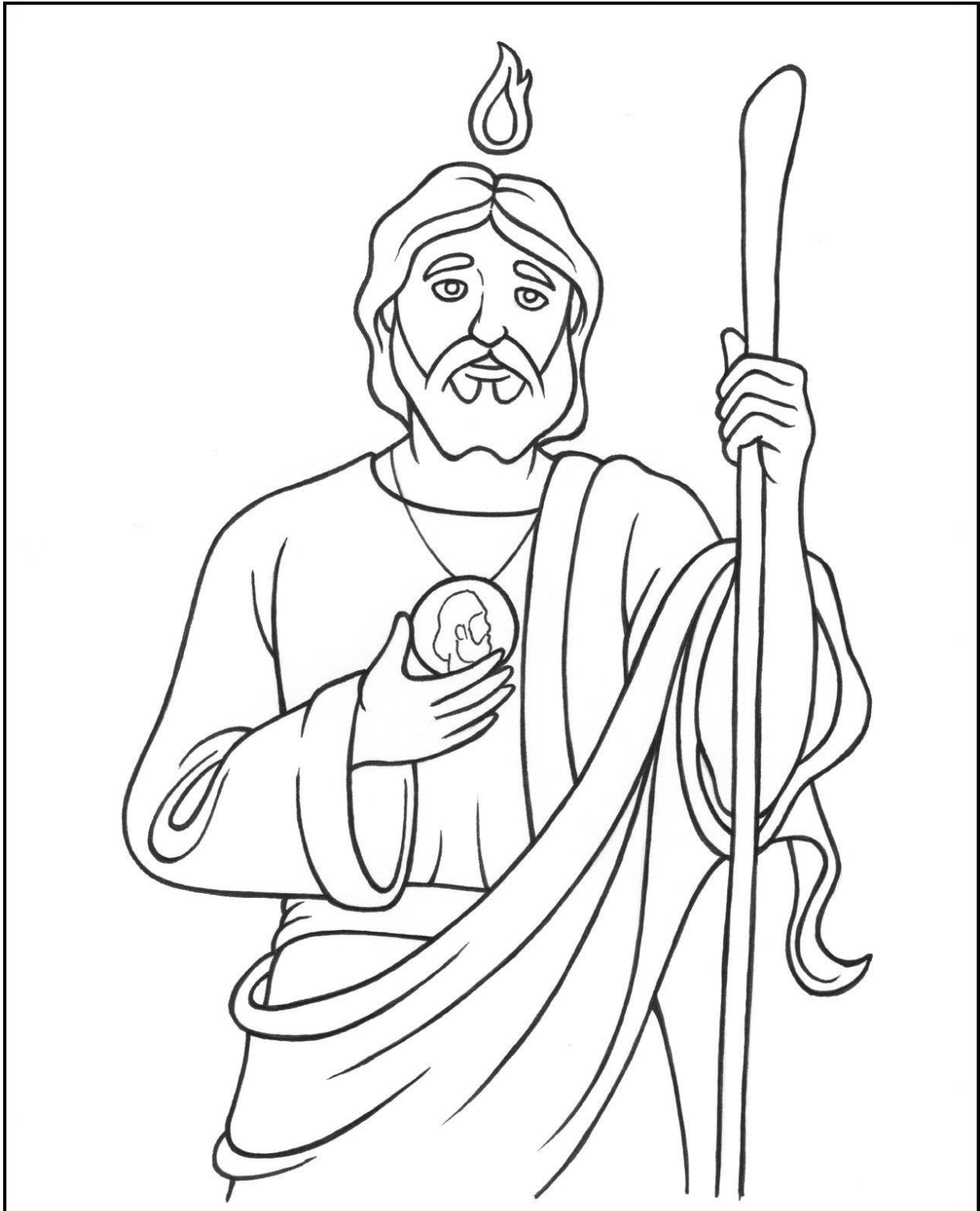
