A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This week, we will be celebrating two very special feasts. November 1st is the Solemnity of All the Saints, when we honor and celebrate the countless number who have gone before us and now bask in the glory of heaven. Many of the saints are familiar to us. Our parishes and schools are named after them. We have a devotion to some of them. Nations and cultures claim them as heroes and intercessors. But, I often wonder if the honor we give to the saints doesn't somehow end up separating us from them. That is, do the statues and stained-glass images make them entirely "other" from us? The saints were all humans, just like us. They had lives that, despite perhaps the differences in historical context, were like ours – families and friends, successes and failures, hopes and disappointments, easy days and tragic ones. The saints are meant to be more friends than idols. They remind us of our true homeland – heaven!

I also like to remind people that, while our Church has canonized saints for centuries, it doesn't mean they are the only ones who have reached the joys of heaven. We can be sure that there are a multitude of those "un-canonized souls" who are part of the heavenly court. I imagine we even knew some of them personally!

Immediately following All Saints' Day, we remember our beloved dead who await the beatific vision. How wonderful to know that we remain connected in this great communion of saints – those in heaven, those on their way, and we here on earth striving to live virtuously so as to attain our salvation. On Thursday, in addition to our regularly scheduled morning Mass, there will be an additional Mass at 7:00pm in the church. All are welcome to join us in praying for our loved ones who have died. And, in a special way, we will remember those whose funeral Mass was held at our parish during the past year. This is one of the most touching Masses of the year, as we offer gratitude for those lives that have touched us and pray that their memory may be a blessing always.

As we see nature all around us in the midst of its autumnal transitioning to the slumber of winter, we are reminded that life never really ends; it only changes. Our lives do not end with the sleep of death but awake to the eternal life for which we are destined. May all of us who still grieve someone who has passed away be consoled by the grace of the Holy Spirit to hold fast to Christ Who declared, "I am the Resurrection and the Life. The one who believes in Me, even if he dies, will live."

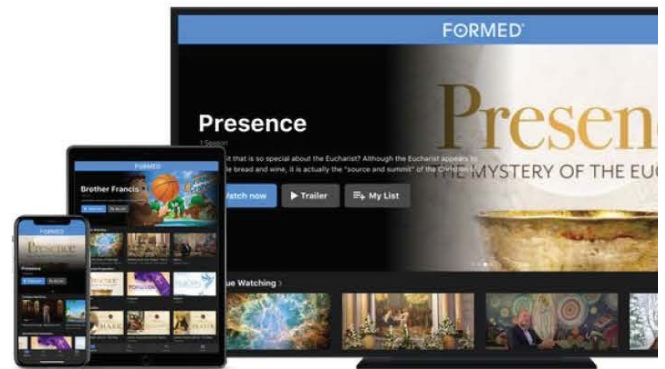

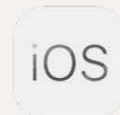

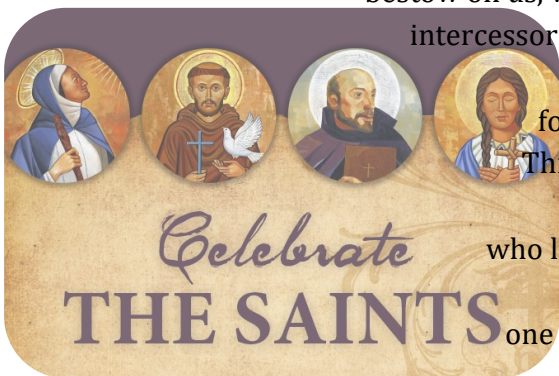

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

November 5, 2023

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 23:1-12

Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples, saying, "The scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

Reflection Questions

- You've probably heard the words "You know better than that." In other words, people look to you for leadership. What would you say are the qualities of a good leader?
- How do we phrase Jesus' teaching today?
- Jesus explains to the crowds that the Jewish leaders are so wrapped up in the privilege and honor that come with their position that they neglect to exercise true leadership. What does Jesus say are the traits of a good leader? And to whom does Jesus say that honor and glory belong?
- Choose one action to take that will show your faith in action. Pray that your faith will be shown consistently in your actions in the coming week.

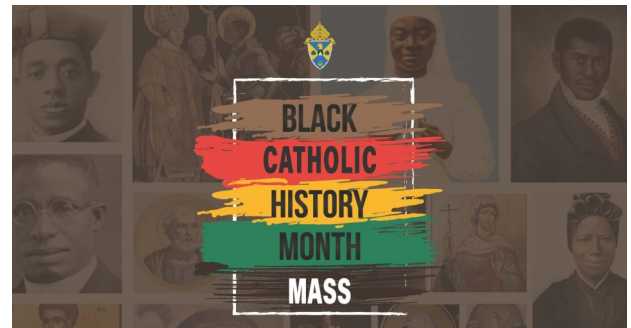
