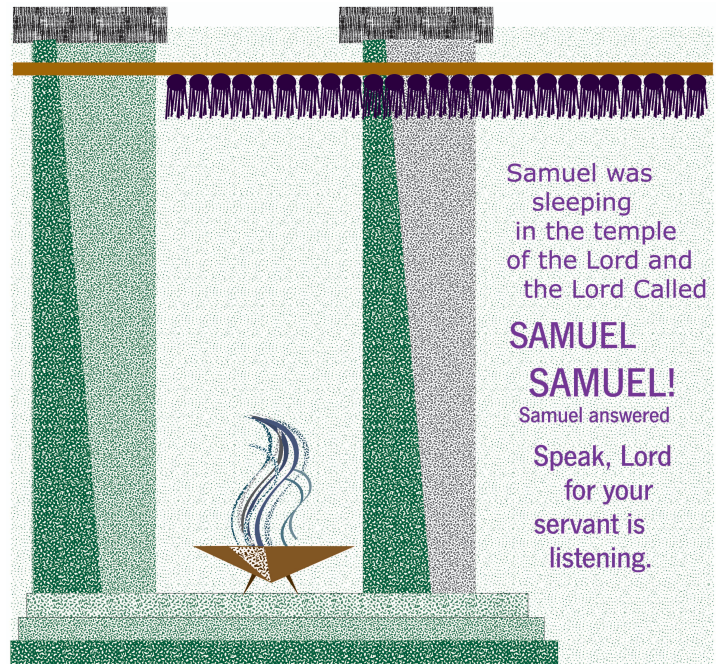

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In this weekend's scripture readings, we hear two beautiful accounts of people being called by God to follow him in a unique way. In the first reading from the Book of Samuel, the young Samuel hears God speaking to him, but being a novice in the spiritual life, mistakes the voice of God for the voice of his mentor, Eli. Recognizing what is happening, the wise Eli tells Samuel that the next time he hears the voice calling him, he should say, "Speak, for your servant is listening." In the Gospel, two men are following Jesus, wondering where he is staying. They are greeted by the Lord with the words, "Come and see." With that, the two disciples stay with Jesus not only that day but for a long time afterwards. As the saying goes – and the rest is history!

Whenever I hear either of these scripture accounts, I cannot help but think of my own life as a priest and the quiet, subtle ways in which the Lord called me to the ministerial priesthood. It started out like that quiet voice calling to Samuel and then eventually I had the courage to go with Jesus into a period of serious preparation and formation as did the Apostles. While at times challenging, I would never change by decision to answer the Lord's invitation to be a priest. The people I've encountered and miracles I've witnessed over the past nearly fifteen years fill me with awe at how God is able to use the weak and simple of the world – like me! – to do the most amazing things.

None of us needs to be reminded of the shortage of priests, deacons, and professed religious in our area. Indeed, the new reality of many priests serving as the Pastor of two parishes is evidence of that. But while we may be tempted to despair, thinking that it will only get worse in the years to come, I challenge all of us to have a renewed zeal in actively promoting young men in our parish to consider the priesthood. I don't believe the Lord has stopped calling men to this pivotal role within His Church, but rather, somewhat like Samuel, they're not accustomed to hearing God's voice amid the cacophony of noise all around us each day.

In a time and culture where parents and grandparents want the best for their children – a good education, happiness, meaningful relationships, financial stability, and a good career – I can attest that I have found all of that and so much more in my ordained ministry! So, I ask all of us to look around at the young men in our midst – our sons, nephews, grandsons, kids in the neighborhood – and have the boldness to ask them if they have ever considered the priesthood for their life. Maybe we'll be met with odd looks of surprise or even laughter. So be it! But maybe, just maybe a seed will be planted in the heart of one God is calling to serve His people in this amazing life of priesthood.

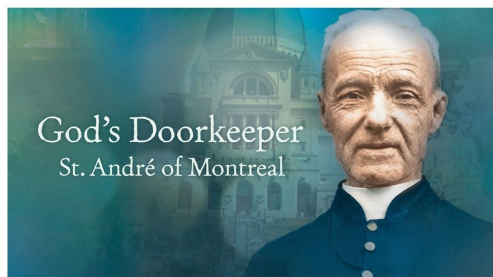

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

January 21, 2024

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 1:14-20

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Then they abandoned their nets and followed him. He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.

Reflection Questions

- What immediately strikes you about Jesus' first recorded words in Mark's Gospel?
- What might it mean for Jesus' disciples (including us) to be 'fishers of men'?
- How does Jesus exhibit His powerful and loving authority in this passage?
- What have you given up since you responded to Jesus' call to 'Follow me'?
- What are some things you might still need to give up to more fully respond to His call upon your life?
- How can you use the resources you have in service of God's kingdom to be 'fishers of men'?

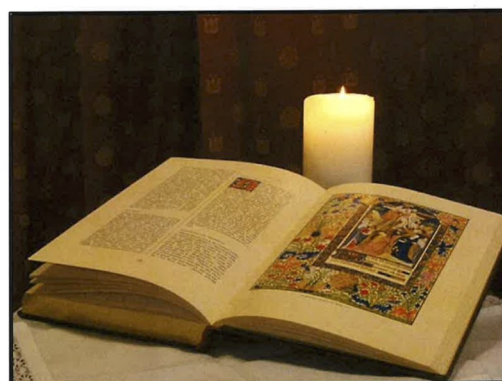

What is the Eucharist?

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term “Eucharist” originates from the Greek word Eucharistia, meaning thanksgiving.


**“Take; this is
my body”**
—Mark 14:22

The presence of Christ in the Eucharist is real, true, and substantial.


“Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love.” (St. John Paul II, *Dominicae cenae*, no. 3)

“It is called: Eucharist, because it is an action of thanksgiving to God.” (CCC, no. 1328)

Eucharist “makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Savior.” (CCC, no. 1330)

Where is the Eucharist mentioned in the Bible?

The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church a memorial of his death and resurrection. The Institution of the Eucharist is written down in the four Gospels below:

Matthew 26:26-30

Mark 14:22-26

Luke 22:14-20

John 6:22-59 (The Bread of Life Discourse)

Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity.

“Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him” (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life.

1. On the crucifix, make the sign of the cross and then pray the Apostles' Creed.
