Getting your coronary
calcium score scan can
save your life.**



Free cardiac screening

A coronary calcium score is like a “mammogram” for the heart to screen for heart artery blockage. This simple, non-invasive test can indicate coronary artery disease before the onset of symptoms or heart attacks. The scan does not require IV or CT contrast.

Calcium in the heart arteries is a representation of the effects of cholesterol that has built up over decades. Upon completion, your test results will be evaluated by Jyoti Ganguly, MD, Chief of Cardiology at St. Charles Hospital and then shared with you and your doctor. If you do not have a primary care physician, we can assist you with that referral.

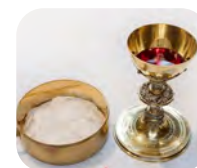

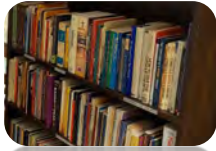

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

January 28, 2024

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 1:21-28

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

Reflection Questions

- How do the people respond to Jesus' teaching?
- In what way do you think Jesus' teaching differed from the teaching of the scribes such that people concluded Jesus' teaching came with 'authority'?
- What's significant about that word 'authority' and what does it tell us that the same root word is used for our word 'author'? What are the implications for Jesus' teaching here?
- Does anything surprise you about Jesus' encounter with this 'unclean spirit'?
- In what way does this passage motivate you to want to listen more carefully and obediently to Jesus' teaching?
- How does this passage encourage you today as a disciple of Jesus?

Catholic Fasting Rules for Ash Wednesday and Lenten Fridays

Catholics age 14 and older do not eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent, including Good Friday. Instead of meat many Catholics choose to eat fish - which is why many parishes around the country have fish fries on Fridays during Lent. These are a great opportunity for a parish community to come together to pray and fast. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics age 18 to 59 also limit the amount of food they eat.

Only one full meal, and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal, are eaten. The best rule of thumb is to make sure your meals are smaller than what you would eat on a normal day - and to avoid snacks. Exemption is allowed for pregnant women and those who need regular meals for medical reasons. You may have heard the words "fasting" and "abstinence" used when talking about Lent. "Fasting" is the word used when the amount of food eaten is limited. "Abstinence" is when you completely give something up, like meat, for a set period of time. Both "fasting" and "abstinence" play a role during Lent.

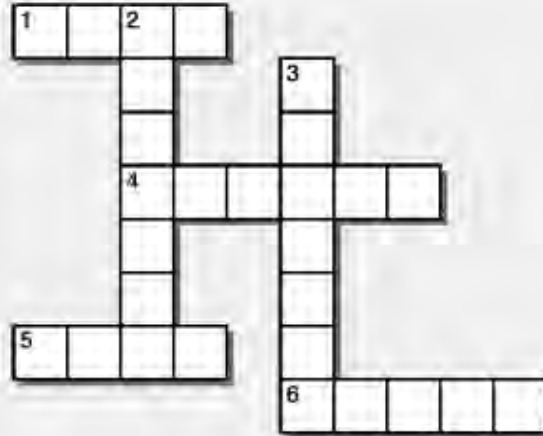
