A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It seems like we only just put away all the Christmas decorations, and yet here we are already embarking on the Sacred Season of Lent. I remember once years ago, when the calendar was similar, a priest remarking that the Magi were going to get their ashes on their way out of Bethlehem! In just days, we will fulfill the usual custom of being marked with **Ashes**, being reminded of our need for God in every facet of our lives and of being challenged to take our discipleship even more seriously. Lent is often described on the surface as a harsh or difficult season. But, perhaps we can look at it in a new way. **Lent is actually a Season of Invitation.** We are invited by our Church to draw more closely to God through **Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving**, and we have ample opportunities for all three. Allow me to highlight some of them.

The **Stations of the Cross** will be prayed each Friday at 7pm. It is a very moving prayer that allows us to consider not only the final hours of our blessed Lord's life, but to contemplate His inexhaustible love for each human heart that propelled Him to make such a sacrifice.

We are challenged to give up some little delights – sweets, social media, alcohol, whatever – a reminder that only God can ultimately fill the deepest desires of our life. The Church asks us all to **Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**, which means eating very modestly, and the minimum we require for health. We also **Abstain from meat on Fridays** to help us recall Christ's sacrifice of His very body by scourging and crucifixion.

In addition to **Regular Attendance at Sunday Mass**, Lent is a wonderful time to receive the **Sacrament of Confession**. Additional times for the sacrament will be posted in the bulletin. The **Tenebrae**, on Monday, March 18th is a prayer service which combines scripture and song, tracing the course of salvation history toward its apex – the Death and Resurrection of Christ. Our parish choir will join Infant Jesus choir to lead our entire community in this sacred time.

Acts of Charity are another hallmark of Lent. Our Outreach Ministry is always in need of donations of food and related items. Your generosity helps to meet the needs of the less fortunate in our area. Those needs are steadily increasing even as the number of resources struggles to meet them. Thank you in advance for your help!

Finally, please see the ad in this bulletin about our **Lenten Mission with Fr. Lachlan Cameron**. Fr. Lachlan will preach at all the weekend Masses March 2nd/3rd and then return on Wednesday and Thursday that week to lead us in reflection and prayer during adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Be sure to mark your calendars for this important time.

Lent is a **Time of Invitation**. Respond generously, and you will experience graces beyond measure!

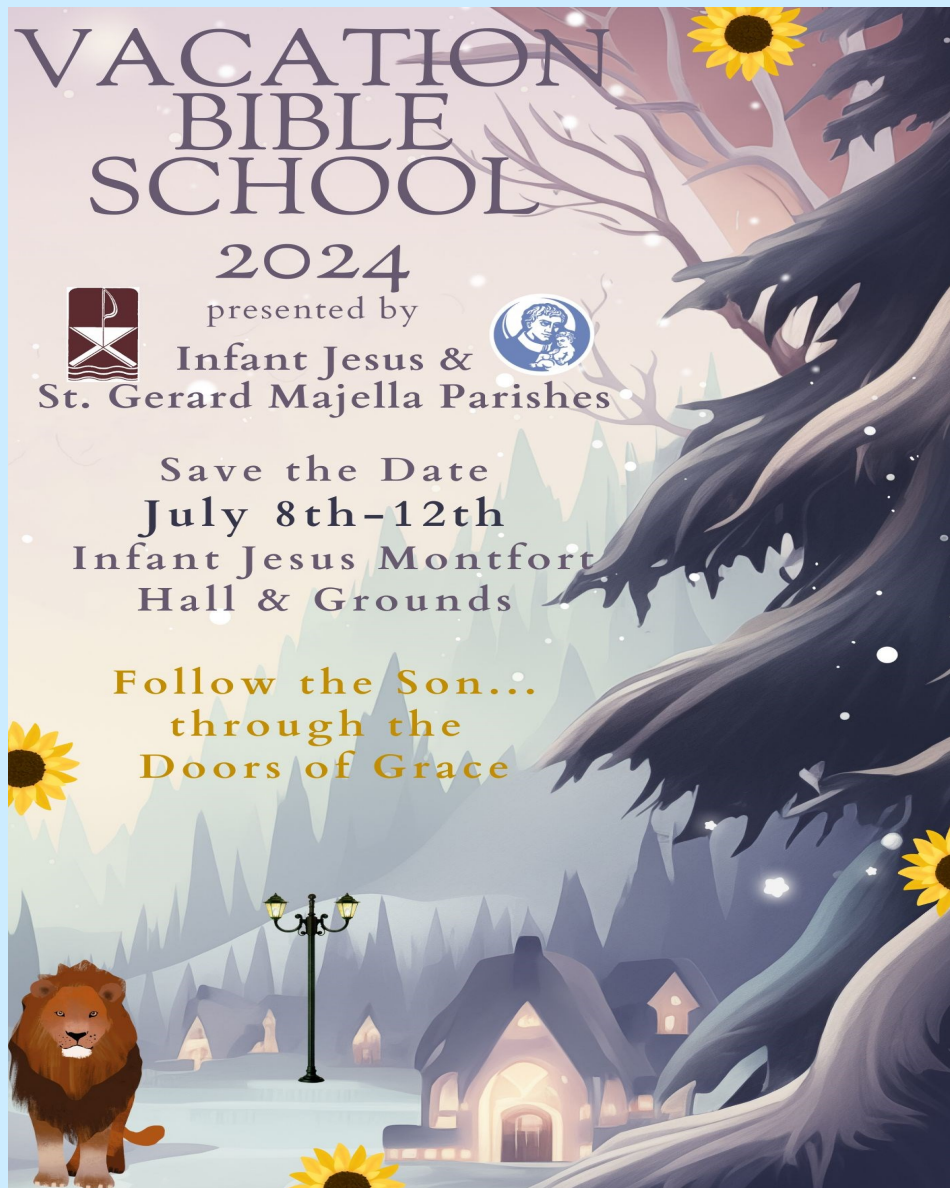

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

February 18, 2024

First Sunday of Lent

Mk 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God:
"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Reflection Questions

- What details about Jesus' temptation in the desert are described in this Gospel?
- Who is with Jesus in the desert?
- What does this Gospel tell us about the angels?
- What are some temptations do you face?
- During Lent, we seek to strengthen our resolve to resist temptation. However, God does not expect us to do this on our own. God helps us, giving us the Holy Spirit in Baptism. God also gives us the community of the Church to help us. What can we do during Lent to accept the help God gives us to resist temptation?



St. Gerard Majella Handkerchiefs

Only one instance is recorded of St. Gerard curing an expectant mother of her illness while he was alive, but there were many women who claimed that they and their children were granted graces through the prayers of Gerard. The famous "handkerchief story" goes like this: While he was leaving the house of a family he had gone to visit, he dropped his handkerchief. A young woman retrieved it, but as she handed it to him, Gerard told her mysteriously, "Keep it. One day it will be of service to you." Although puzzled, the woman did keep it. And a few years later, she faced life threatening complications as she was about to give birth to her first child. She remembered the mysterious hanky and the promise, and asked that it be brought to her in her travail. She held it to her womb and immediately the pain ceased and she delivered a normal, healthy child. Are you or someone you know expecting, trying to conceive, or ill? 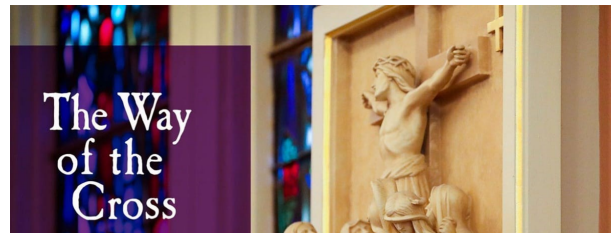

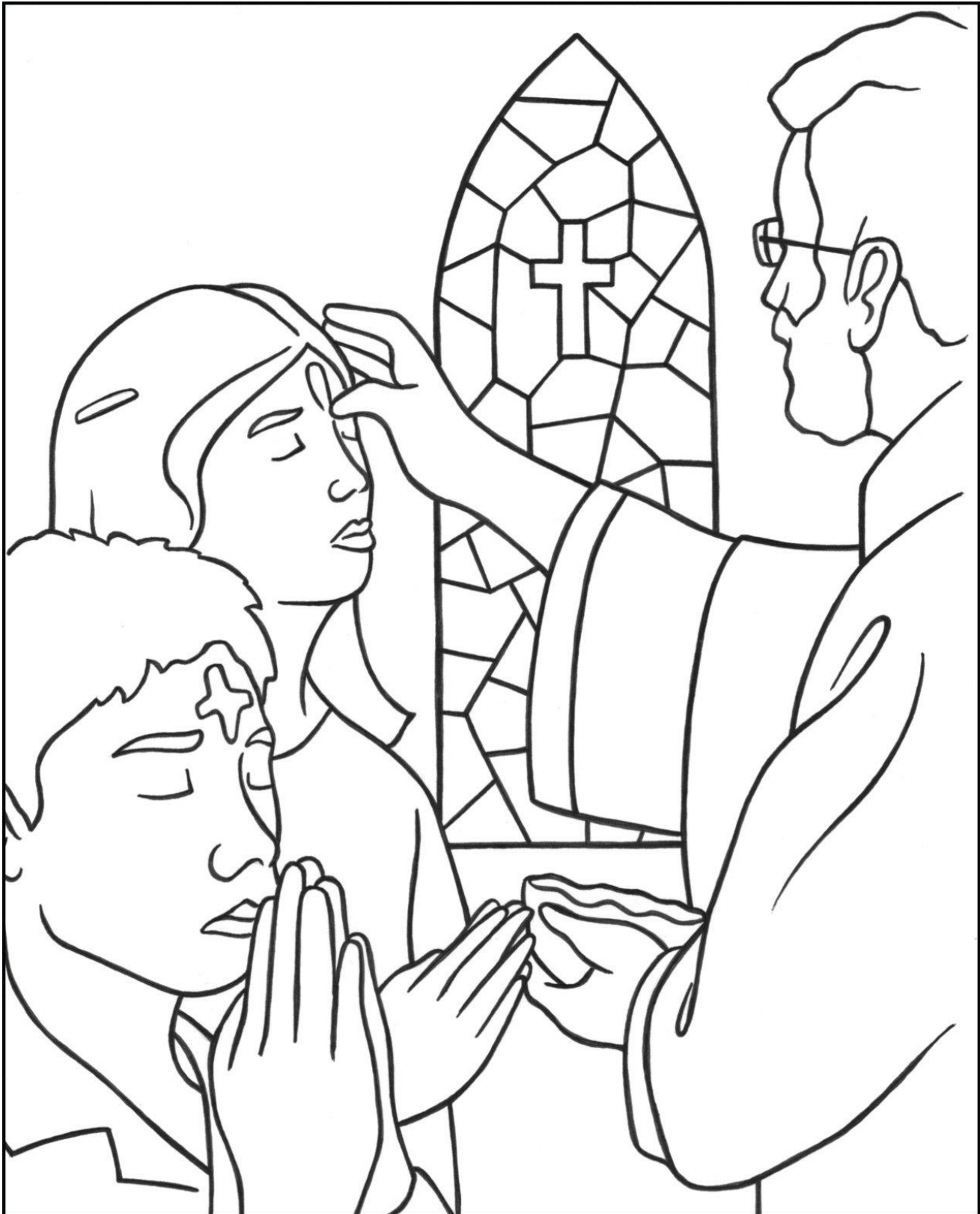

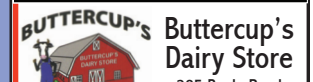
