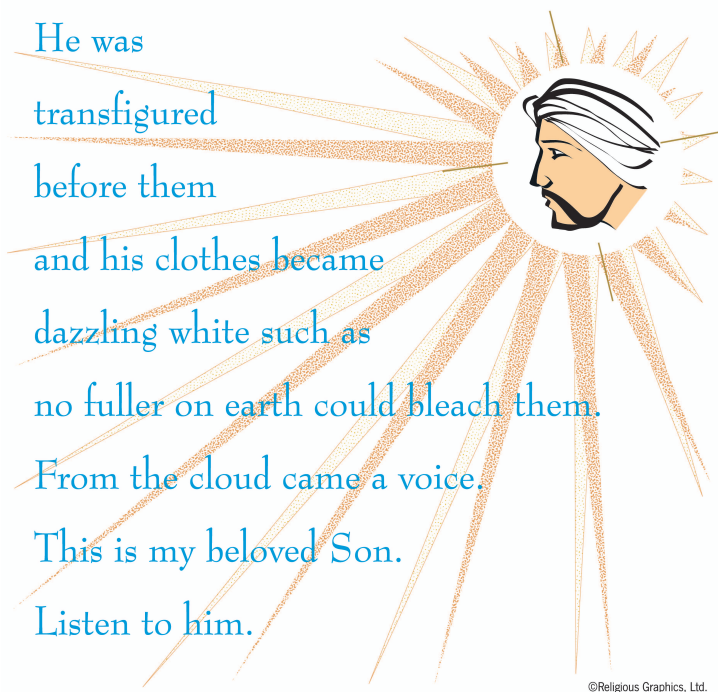

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Friends of Saint Gerard's,

At last Sunday's Masses, I shared some disturbing news that I received from Fr. Vitus, who was scheduled to arrive home here in New York later that day. His youngest brother, who is also a priest, Father Martin, was on his way to pick up Fr. Vitus to take him to the airport for his flight. Shortly after Fr. Martin left his parish, his car was pinned by two other vehicles, and he was kidnapped. Sadly, this is a common reality in many parts of Nigeria. People are often kidnapped and held for ransom. This is especially true when it comes to Catholic clergy. In the best of situations, the person who is held will be beaten rather severely, even after a ransom has been paid. In the worst situation, a person could be killed because of the family's unwillingness or inability to pay ransom.

Naturally, Fr. Vitus was devastated, along with his elderly mother and his entire family. We began our prayers immediately for Fr. Martin's safe return. Expecting this to become a protracted situation that could last weeks or even months, I was astounded when Fr. Vitus called me at about 2:30 on Sunday afternoon to tell me that Fr. Martin was released without any harm and without any ransom being demanded. He was allowed to return to his parish, with only some personal items having been taken. It is not an overstatement to call this a miracle! I was relieved to see Fr. Vitus when he returned to our rectory late Sunday evening. And then, on Wednesday, I heard from Fr. Martin directly. He asked me to express his sincerest gratitude to everyone who was praying for his safe return. He accounts it as a grace from God that he was reunited with his family so quickly.

This tragedy-turned-triumph reminds us of two important realities. First, the power of prayer is real. It is simply unheard of for a leader of such a terrorist gang simply to release someone without injury or steep ransom. We still have no idea why, but something moved his heart to show decency towards Fr. Martin. Storming heaven in times of trial will indeed have benefits. We may not always see this immediately, and sometimes the result may be other than what we had hoped for, but nonetheless God is at work in our midst.

Second, the persecution of Christians is real. This is the harsh truth that many Christians around the world face on a daily basis. It is simply naïve to think that persecution is something of the past. Many Christians today face danger simply for professing their faith. In some cases, this may result in kidnapping, torture, or even death. We must redouble our prayers for them and for their families. We need also to pray for the conversion of those who inflict such pain. God is able to soften even the hardest of hearts. And we need to implore all of heaven to do just that – change hearts. That's what this Lenten season is all about – changing hearts toward God.

As we continue our Lenten journey, may we pray for new hearts, transfigured hearts, that reflect the love and mercy of God. Please be sure to join us next weekend as we welcome Fr. Lachlan Cameron to lead us in our Parish Lenten Mission. You'll be glad you did!

Materials:

Coffee can	Leafless tree branch
Gift wrapping paper	Yarn
Glue	Paper punch
Plaster of paris	

You may need one or two aides for this project.



Directions:

- Cover a coffee can with gift wrapping paper.
- Fill the coffee can with plaster of paris. Set the branch down into the plaster of paris and hold the branch upright.
- Have the students make little booklets from gift wrapping paper and write a promise to perform a work of mercy inside each booklet. (One or two aides will be needed to help the younger students write their works.)
- Write the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy on the board.

- Help the students remember to do their works of mercy by suggesting they make a "promise" tree at home.
- This project can be brought to the liturgy and presented as the students' gift.

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

March 3, 2024

Third Sunday of Lent

Jn 2:13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

Reflection Questions

- What had happened to the temple that caused Jesus to respond the way he did? Does this fit with your understanding of the character and nature of Christ?
- What did Jesus use to cleanse the temple? Was Jesus angry when He cleansed the temple?
- What was the temple designed for in the life of the people of God?
- How does Jesus point to a second exodus in his response to the Jewish leaders?
- We're told that Jesus knows what is in the human heart and entrusts himself to his people. How does this idea provide comfort or conviction for you this week?

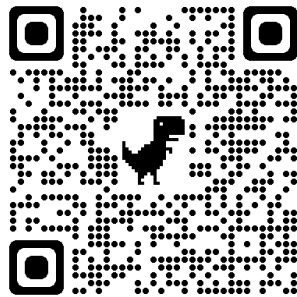
