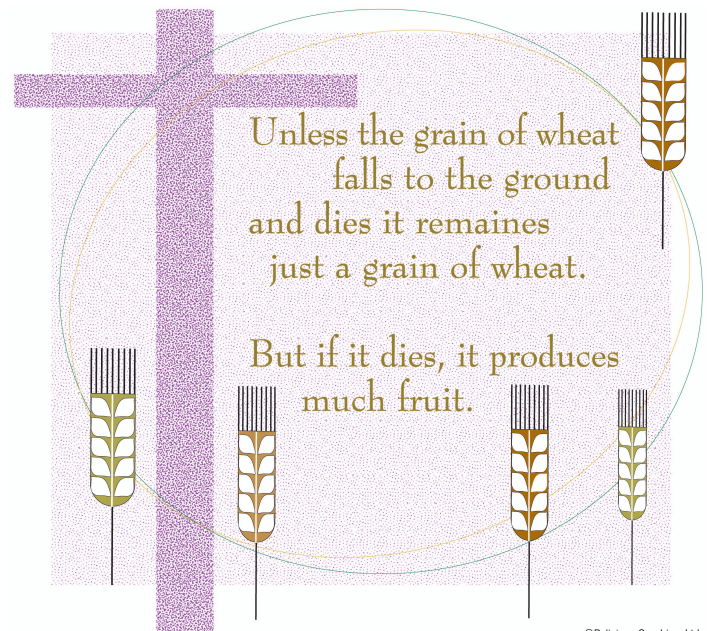

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Friends,

This past week, as we have begun to break out of the cocoon of Winter, we have seen some noticeable changes. Daylight is extending much later; temperatures are occasionally reaching much higher; and the ground is preparing to sprout new grass and plants. New life is certainly all around us these days. And what we know is that this new life comes only after the “death” of Winter. Death leads to something new! That is exactly what we are preparing for as we are swiftly approaching Holy Week – the new life that God wishes to give us through our death to sin and our rising to a more profound life.

Please join us – Monday night, at 7pm, in the Chapel of St. Charles Hospital – for the moving **Tenebrae Service**. This unique time of prayer combines Scripture and Song to aid us in meditating on the source of our salvation – the Crucifixion and Death of our Savior. It will feature the combined choirs of Infant Jesus and St. Gerard. If you have never been to a Tenebrae Service, I strongly recommend that you consider attending. You’ll be very glad you did!

This past Wednesday marked the 11th anniversary of the election of **Pope Francis** as Bishop of Rome and Supreme Pastor of the Universal Church. He was formally inaugurated on the feast of the **Solemnity of St. Joseph**. It is important for us to keep the Holy Father in our prayers each day, as he undertakes the formidable task of leading the Church of Christ. What better patron for him than the one who was charged with protecting and providing for our Blessed Mother and her Son, our Savior, than St. Joseph, whose feast day is Tuesday. This feast provides a wonderful opportunity for us to consider prayerfully his example of fidelity, obedience, and trust in the plan of God for our lives.

And, of course, we will celebrate **St. Patrick’s Day** with all the usual fanfare and traditions – corned beef and cabbage, the wearin’ of the green, parades, bagpipes, and all the rest. Like St. Joseph, St. Patrick was charged with a seemingly monumental challenge – preaching the Gospel in a foreign land that was largely resistant to it. Yet, his courage and persistence, even in the face of setbacks, is an example to us in our own discipleship. It is not always easy to persevere in faith when we are experiencing hardship. But it is especially in those moments that we can unite our trials with the sufferings of Christ during His Passion and bring about grace for ourselves and others.

The holiest days of our Catholic Faith are right around the corner. It’s not too late for us to intensify our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. By doing so, we can make our celebration of Easter more bountiful as we anticipate what we have been promised – the reward of everlasting life offered to us by the Death and Resurrection of Christ for us!

St. Joseph, pray for us!
St. Patrick, pray for us!

Saint Patrick, 389-461

Feast Day March 17th

Saint Patrick was born in England, but when he was a teenager, he was captured by Irish pirates who took him to Ireland as a slave. After six years, Saint Patrick escaped and returned to England and his family.

When Saint Patrick became a priest, he traveled back to Ireland as a missionary so that he could teach the people about God. He used examples to explain the mysteries of the faith in simple ways. One day, Saint Patrick compared the Trinity to a shamrock. He said that the shamrock has three leaves, but it is only one plant. In the same way, God is three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—but one God.

God used Saint Patrick's kidnapping to convert the Irish people. In our lives, God uses the bad times to bring about a good we do not always see. We must be patient and trust Him. (mycatholickids.com)

Patrick's most famous prayer shows us how close he was to God. It's called "St. Patrick's Breastplate." A breastplate is the piece of armor that protects a soldier's heart from harm.

Christ with me, Christ before me,
Christ behind me, Christ within me,
Christ beneath me, Christ above me,
Christ at my right, Christ at my left.

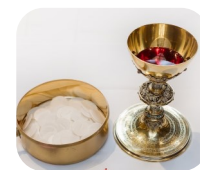

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

March 24, 2024

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Mk11:1-10

When Jesus and his disciples drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately on entering it, you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone should say to you, 'Why are you doing this?' reply, 'The Master has need of it and will send it back here at once.'" So they went off and found a colt tethered at a gate outside on the street, and they untied it. Some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They answered them just as Jesus had told them to, and they permitted them to do it. So they brought the colt to Jesus and put their cloaks over it. And he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. Those preceding him as well as those following kept crying out:

"Hosanna!

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is to come!

Hosanna in the highest!"

- What does Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem teach us about His view of kingship and authority?
- How did Jesus know about the 'colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden'?
- What specifically do you think the picture of the "never ridden on colt" is supposed to push us to realize about Jesus?
- How does Jesus' entry into Jerusalem inspire humility in your own life?
- How does Jesus' approach to His own authority inspire you in your walk of faith?

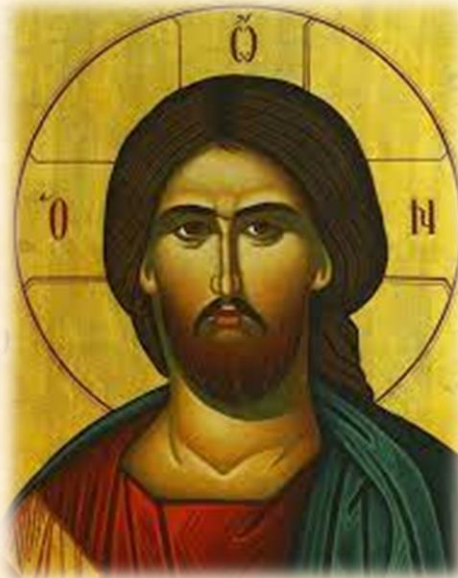

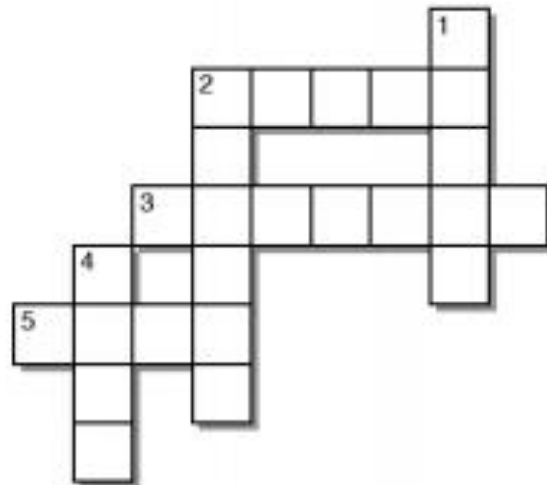

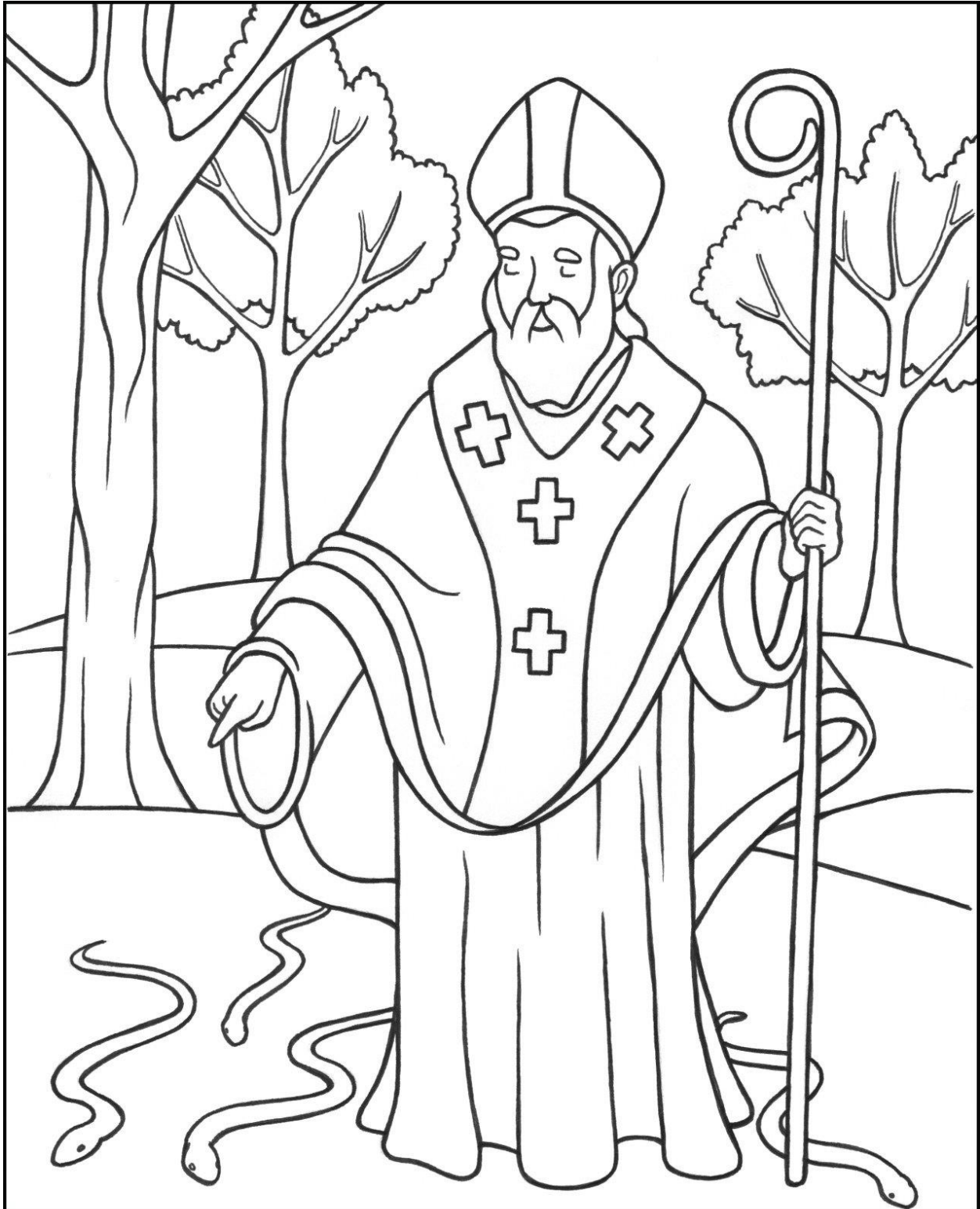
