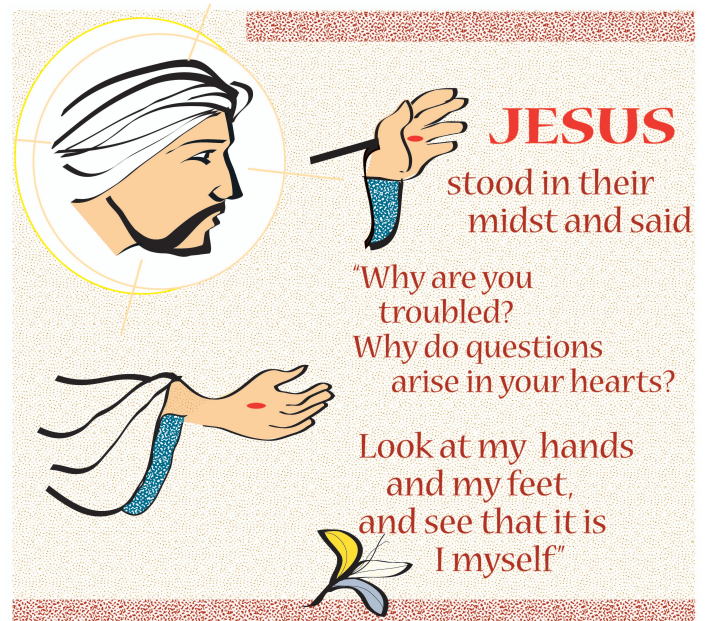

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Easter! Though there are many for whom the celebration of Easter has already concluded, we the Church continue to proclaim this joyful anthem throughout the entire Season of the Resurrection. It was just a couple of months ago when we entered into the Lenten season. As we were marked with ashes on our foreheads and we began the discipline of Lent, we probably thought to ourselves: “What am I going to do for Lent?” By that, of course, we meant what sort of penance would we take on or what act of charity would we commit to doing for the forty-day journey.

Now, here is a question we have likely never asked ourselves: “What am I going to do for Easter?” I know that probably sounds odd, because we think that, now that Lent has ended, our work has been concluded. And indeed, our Lenten work has been concluded. But there is yet another work that we need to take up during this great Easter Season. If Lent was about the renewed effort to purge sin and distractions from our relationship with God, then Easter is about filling up that gap with the power of the Holy Spirit and growing in virtue.

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus tells his Apostles that they are now to be witnesses to all the things that they have seen – His life, His teachings, His Passion, and Resurrection. Their mission is to proclaim this life-changing truth to all whom they encounter. To put it differently, their work post-Resurrection is to make sure everyone knows what has happened. They will be empowered for this task by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in their souls. We, too, have the Holy Spirit dwelling within us. Our work is the same as the Apostles, albeit in a very different setting. Now is the time for us to implore God for a renewal of His seven-fold gifts in our lives – Piety, Understanding, Fortitude, Wisdom, Counsel, Wonder and Awe, and Knowledge – and to put them into practice daily.

In a few weeks, a good number of people from our parish will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation and, for some, the Eucharist for the first time. They continue to prepare for this life-changing moment. We, who have already been fully initiated, are not to be merely spectators of this event. It is a time for us to be renewed in our own identity as witnesses to the world of the power of the Living Christ in our lives.

So... what are you doing for Easter? How will you spend these weeks deepening within you the power of the Holy Spirit to guide your actions and words? May we, who have already experienced Jesus Christ personally, have the courage to embrace our Baptismal call to share the Good News with all those whom we encounter. In short, may we be faithful witnesses to the Resurrection!

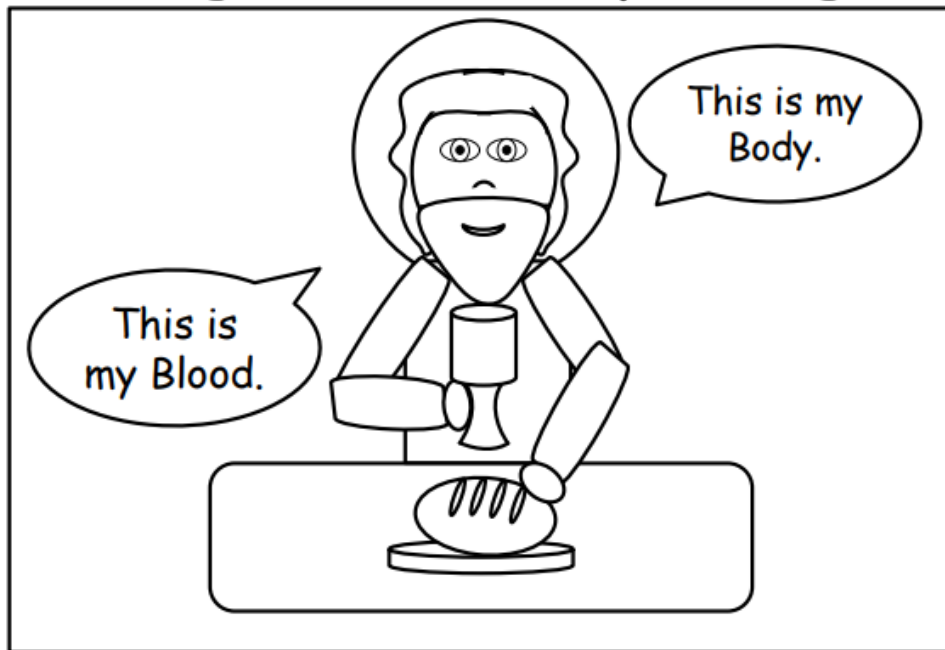

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

April 21, 2024

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Jn 10:11-18

Jesus said:

"I am the good shepherd.

A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep.

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd.

This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father."

- Who might the "hired hand" be in regards to this passage?
- How are the hired hand and the Good Shepherd different?
- What do you think it means that the Good Shepherd knows his sheep and the sheep know the Good Shepherd? What does it mean to hear the Shepherd's voice?
- Jesus says several times that the Good Shepherd lays down his life for his sheep, what does that mean to you?

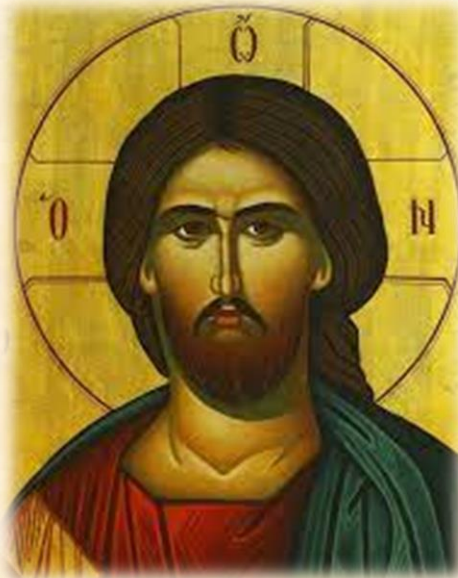

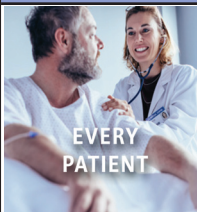
