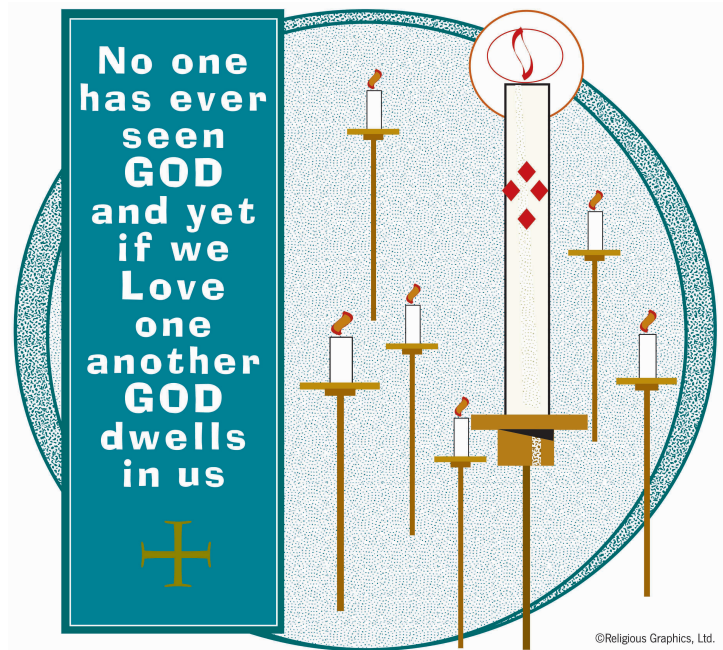

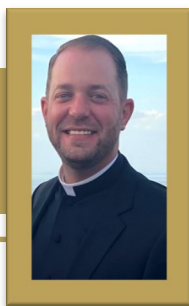

## A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It has been six weeks since our celebration of Easter! There is one thing I have noticed consistently notice over the course of the Easter Seasons – we don't usually reach Pentecost with the same number of flowers that we had on Easter Sunday! This isn't a knock against our staff, who do a wonderful job making sure our church is beautifully decorated. The hard truth is that, despite their best efforts, some flowers just don't make it the full seven weeks of Eastertide. For whatever reason, some will wilt and fade and need to be tossed.

I wonder if, like those wilted flowers, something happens within us. Maybe the luster of Easter wears off within our hearts over the course of the weeks and months following what is the most important day for us Christians. Maybe we reach the great crescendo of the Easter season with less than full enthusiasm. Maybe that great acclamation of "Alleluia," absent during Lent, becomes routine. This shouldn't be so!

We are in the midst of very sacred days – the novena between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost. Like the Apostles, we wait for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit that will transform us anew. Most of us have received the seal of the Holy Spirit already at Confirmation. Next weekend, several people from our parish will receive that great sacrament of full initiation into the Church. But will we, who have already received this gift, be merely spectators of these great mysteries rather than active participants? We need the Holy Spirit in our daily lives. And God is not stingy when it comes to imparting the Spirit. Rather, it is we who sometimes don't open wide the doors of our heart to allow the Holy Spirit to be fully operative in, with, and through us.

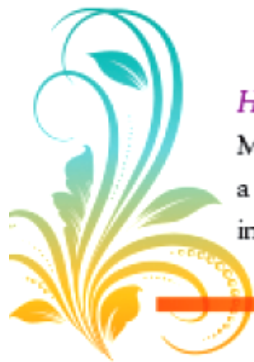
Don't let the luster of the Easter season wear off! As you anticipate Pentecost next week, redouble your efforts to ask the Holy Spirit to renew your faith where it is weak and your charity where it has become slack. And please pray for those in our parish who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, and for our entire community.

## Breaking Open the Word

**Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?**

**May 19, 2024**

**Pentecost Sunday**

**Jn 20:19-23**

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

### Reflection Questions

- What does "Peace be with you" mean? Why might Jesus' greeting of peace have been so welcome to his disciples?
- What is the source of your peace?
- The Feast of Pentecost celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' first disciples. This same Holy Spirit is still with us. After breathing upon them and giving them the gift of the Holy Spirit, what does Jesus tell his disciples to do?
- Then why does Jesus say to His disciples, "Whose sins you forgive, they were forgiven them; whose sins you retain, they were retained" ?

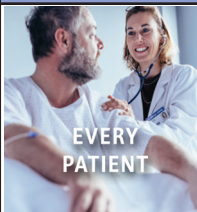
