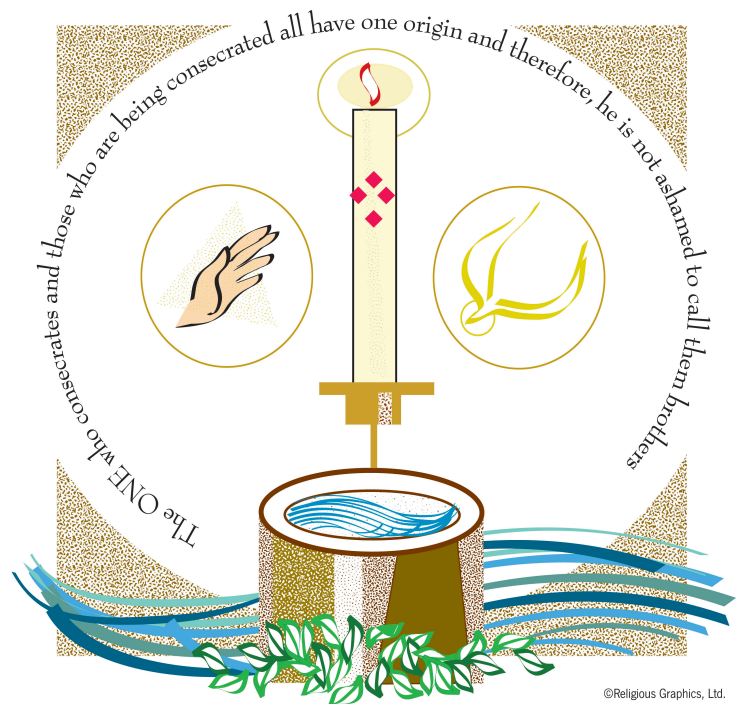

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

At most of the Masses last weekend, I spoke giving an update on our Diocese's ongoing bankruptcy situation. Since I couldn't speak at all the Masses, and so that everyone hears the correct information, I would like to reiterate here the most important points. When the Diocese filed for Chapter 11 protections four years ago, the goal was twofold: offer a just compensation to the victims of child abuse and protect the Church's ability to continue her critical mission, most especially in its parishes and schools.

On September 26th, a term sheet was presented to the Bankruptcy Court. This brief document presented the general outline of a settlement between the Creditors' Committee (the plaintiffs), our Diocese, and the related insurance companies. A channeling injunction – the fund that would be established to compensate victims of abuse – will be established in the amount of \$323 million. The bulk of these funds would come from diocesan assets and contributions by every parish. We pastors have known this would be the case for a couple of years. I have been working with our Trustees, Deacons Carlito and Frank, as well as the Finance Committee to ensure that our contribution would not deter us from our mission. While it will be a sacrifice, it is a necessary one to offer justice to victims and allow us to close this very sad chapter in our history.

When the Diocese filed for Chapter 11 protections, no individual parish did so. Every parish is considered a "related entity" and would therefore benefit from the same liability protections from future claims of abuse that occurred prior to the bankruptcy filings. However, because of a Supreme Court case last summer, related entities no longer have such protections. To safeguard the parishes' protection going forward, every parish will be filing Chapter 11 protections in the coming weeks. When you hear that, you may immediately imagine that our parish is closing, defaulting on its expenses, or some other calamitous situation. This is not the case. Our filing is merely a legal mechanism to maintain our liability about any future claims of abuse before October 2020. There are several types of bankruptcy filings, and this one will take approximately 48 hours to complete. (I call this "baby bankruptcy.") Our parish will continue its mission!

Clearly, no one is happy about this situation. From the victims themselves who have lived with this pain, to those of us who had no part in this being asked to make reparation for it, this is certainly a Good Friday moment. But our Faith tells us that Good Friday does not have the final word. Easter Sunday always does. We get through this dark moment – please, God, soon – and embark on rebuilding.

In the coming weeks, as plans are finalized, I will present more information. In the meantime, please know that we are doing everything to reach the goal of providing justice and allowing the mission of the Church to continue. Thank you for your support, prayers, and understanding.

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

October 13, 2024

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

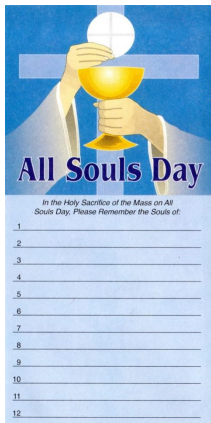
Mk 10:17-30

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother." He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Peter began to say to him, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."

Reflection Questions

- Thinking biblically, what is this 'eternal life' that the man is asking about? How does the Bible define it?
- What are your impressions of this rich man who approaches Jesus? How would you summarize what Jesus is saying to him? What is Jesus trying to accomplish with this man?
- How do the disciples react to Jesus' teaching about wealth and the kingdom of God? Why do you think they react that way?
- What promises in verse 30 do you find most encouraging right now? In what
- ways does Jesus fulfill these promises in the lives of His people? In what ways have you experienced their fulfillment in your life?

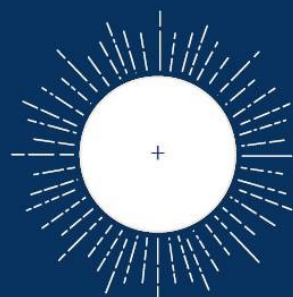

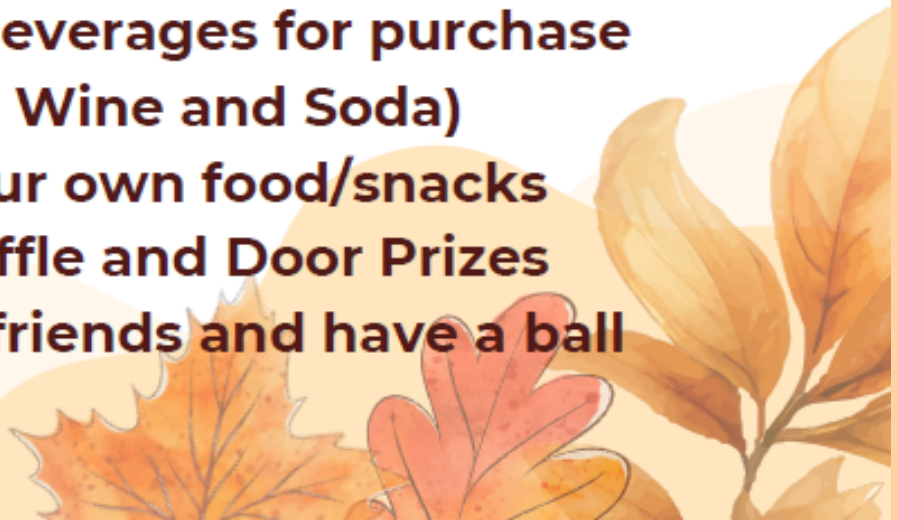
