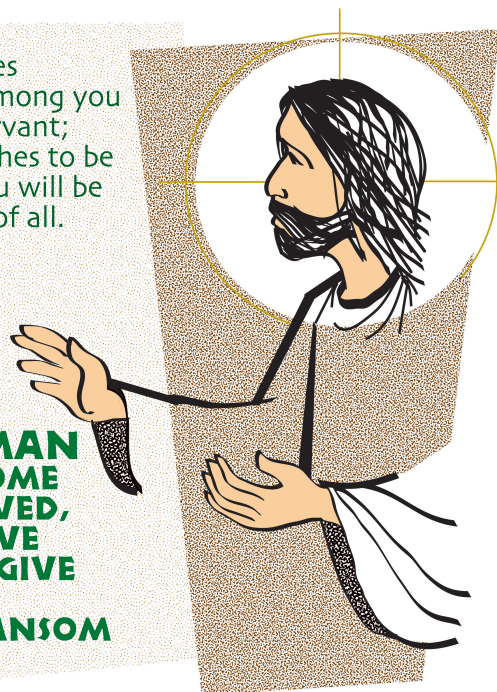

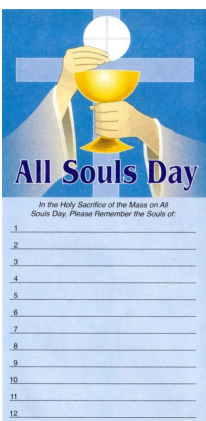

St. Gerard Majella Handkerchiefs

Only one instance is recorded of St. Gerard curing an expectant mother of her illness while he was alive, but there were many women who claimed that they and their children were granted graces through the prayers of Gerard. The famous "handkerchief story" goes like this: While he was leaving the house of a family he had gone to visit, he dropped his handkerchief. A young woman retrieved it, but as she handed it to him, Gerard told her mysteriously, "Keep it. One day it will be of service to you." Although puzzled, the woman did keep it. And a few years later, she faced life threatening complications as she was about to give birth to her first child. She remembered the mysterious hanky and the promise, and asked that it be brought to her in her travail. She held it to her womb and immediately the pain ceased and she delivered a normal, healthy child. Are you or someone you know expecting, trying to conceive, or ill? St. Gerard Handkerchiefs and prayer cards are available for pickup at the front office.

This past weekend, our Knights joined forces with St. Francis Cabrini Council along with many other local groups to prepare, pack and ship 50,000 meals to those in need. This was such an amazing opportunity headed by Cross Catholic Outreach to come together and do something extraordinary. Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

October 27, 2024

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 10:46-52

As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way.

Reflection Questions

- Where is Jericho and how does it figure into Jesus' journey to Jerusalem?
- What do you learn about Bartimaeus from this passage?
- What does this title 'Son of David' mean and where does it come from?
- What do you learn about Jesus from this passage?
- Why is blindness and the restoration of sight such a good illustration for spiritual realities?
- What can we learn from Bartimaeus about the nature of genuine discipleship?
- How can we as a church help each other to faithfully follow Jesus all the way to the very end? What does that entail?
- Bartimaeus continues to call out to Jesus because he believes that Jesus will heal him. Jesus' words to Bartimaeus tell us that our persistence in prayer is a sign of our faith that God wants to save us. What do you think this might teach us about prayer?



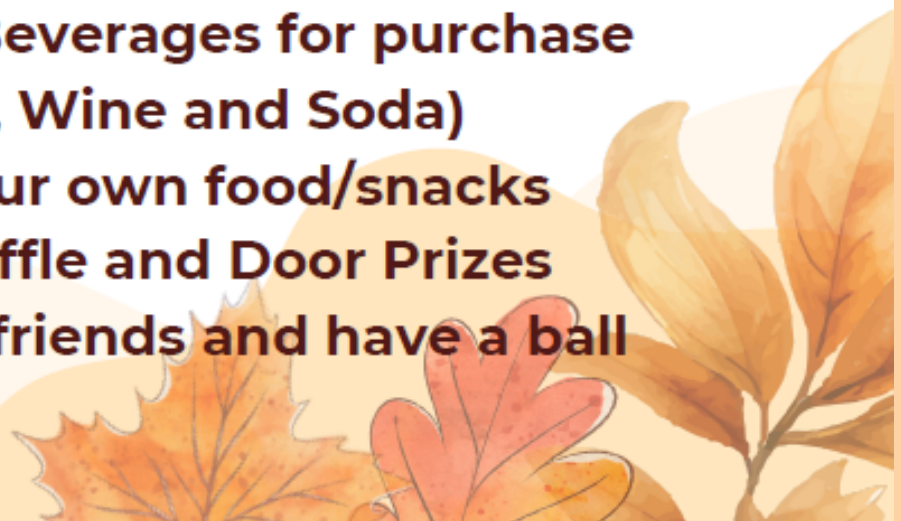
