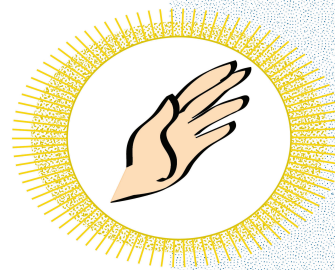

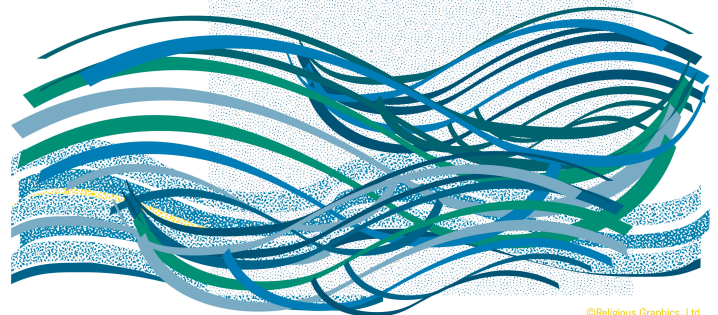

## *A Message from our Pastor*



Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Gerard's,

Over the past few weeks, I have informed you about what we hope to be the final steps in closing the bankruptcy proceedings by our Diocese. There are two goals for this process: fairly compensate victims of abuse and ensure that the work of the Church can continue on Long Island. To those ends, each parish will be making a contribution toward the overall settlement. Our parish's contribution is \$93,980. At first glance, that number seems rather large. Yes, it is a sacrifice, but a necessary one. By making this contribution, we are helping to offer justice to those who were so terribly affected over the past decades. It also allows us to have protection should there be any future allegations against Church personnel prior to 2020.

When I arrived at St. Gerard's in March 2018, our reserve funds were \$215,125. Six years later, the reserve fund is now \$527,814. Thanks to the generosity of so many parishioners and the careful management of our resources, I am proud to say that we are on much more stable financial ground. And we have accomplished this while also raising \$1.68 million to complete the extensive building project! Having anticipated a contribution to this overall settlement, I have been working diligently with Deacons Carlito and Frank, the parish Trustees and the Finance Council to ensure that we continue to thrive in order to further improve our already excellent ministries.

A question that is often asked in this discussion is: "Are the contributions to the Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) used for diocesan legal fees or the settlement fund?" The answer is no. Charitable donations are carefully categorized in New York State law and funds intended to further the ministries of our Diocese cannot be used for other purposes. Some may be reluctant to support the CMA or even our own parish, but that only hurts our parish in the long term.

Finally, this past week the parish Trustees and I signed a corporate resolution that enables us to enter into an abbreviated bankruptcy process. This is merely an administrative legal mechanism that ensures we have future protections against any lawsuits that may be filed. No facet of our parish operations or financial standing will be affected.

None of this news is easy for us to hear. It can stir up feelings of anger and frustration. But the hard truth is that this is the only way we are able to conclude this painful chapter in our collective history as a Diocese. As I said some weeks ago, I am confident that after the conclusion of all these proceedings, we will not only survive but thrive as a Diocese. The sins of the past cannot, and will not, diminish the vibrance of our parishes, and ours especially.

Thank you for your patience, understanding, and cooperation during all of this. If you have any further questions, please contact me. Know of my daily prayers for you, your families, and intentions. Please keep me and my brother clergy in yours as well.

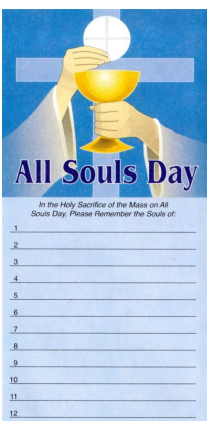

### *St. Gerard Majella Handkerchiefs*

Only one instance is recorded of St. Gerard curing an expectant mother of her illness while he was alive, but there were many women who claimed that they and their children were granted graces through the prayers of Gerard. The famous "handkerchief story" goes like this: While he was leaving the house of a family he had gone to visit, he dropped his handkerchief. A young woman retrieved it, but as she handed it to him, Gerard told her mysteriously, "Keep it. One day it will be of service to you." Although puzzled, the woman did keep it. And a few years later, she faced life threatening complications as she was about to give birth to her first child. She remembered the mysterious hanky and the promise, and asked that it be brought to her in her travail. She held it to her womb and immediately the pain ceased and she delivered a normal, healthy child. Are you or someone you know expecting, trying to conceive, or ill?

## Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

November 3, 2024

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 12:28b-34

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?"

Jesus replied, "The first is this:

*Hear, O Israel!*

*The Lord our God is Lord alone!*

*You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart,  
with all your soul,  
with all your mind,  
and with all your strength.*

The second is this:

*You shall love your neighbor as yourself.*

There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

### Reflection Questions

- What does Jesus mean by saying that you are to love God "with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength"?
- What makes this scribe both close to the kingdom of God and yet still not in the kingdom of God?
- Does it surprise you that love is commanded? What does that tell you about how the Bible conceives of love?
- How would you respond to the person who says, "Jesus is telling us we need to learn how to love ourselves first and then to love others?"
- How would you help disciple the person who claims to love God but who doesn't seem to love other people very well?
- In what way has Jesus exhibited the kind of love that He commands here?

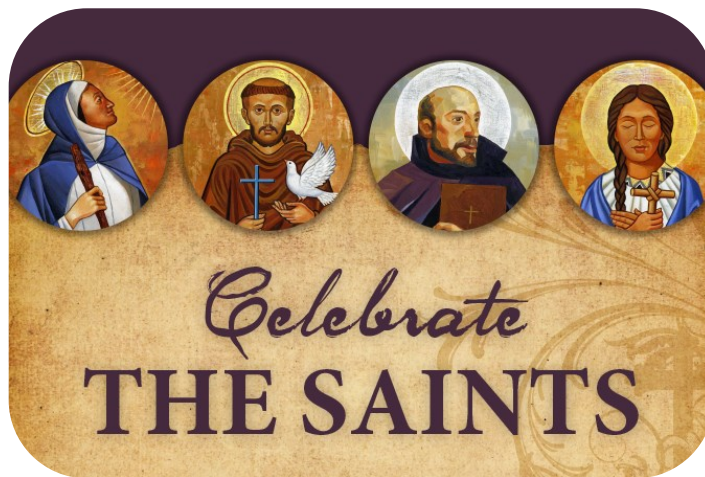

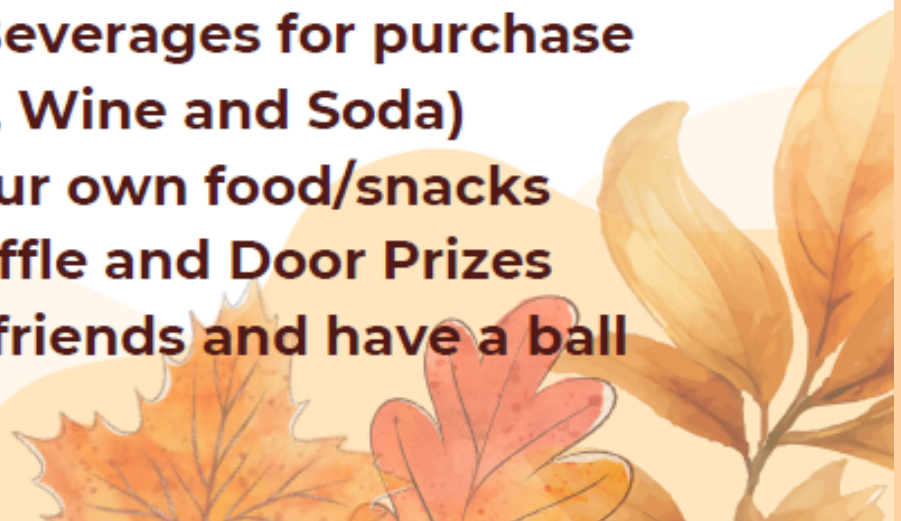
