A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

When I'm speaking with students in Religious Education, I'll sometimes quiz them with this: What are the three most important feast days for us Christians? They can easily name Easter and Christmas, but they usually get stumped on the third. After many guesses I'll give them hints. The Apostles are locked in the Upper Room awaiting Jesus' promised gift. Although the doors and windows are locked, a mighty wind sweeps through the room. They see fire appear over their heads and are able to speak in languages they did not previously know. Then it clicks! Pentecost! Yes, today is the third most important feast day on the Catholic Calendar. Often referred to as the "Birthday of the Church," Pentecost marks the moment when the Apostles began to carry on the mission of Christ following His command to go out to all nations, to share the Gospel and to baptize people for the salvation of their souls.

Here we are – twenty centuries later – doing exactly the same thing. Please pray for those in our community who have either just received the Sacrament of Confirmation or who will in the coming months. May all of us be renewed in our identity as temples of the Holy Spirit, carrying within us the capacity to be Christ's voice, hands, and heart. Below is a wonderful prayer asking for an increase of the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The Prayer for the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit:

O Lord Jesus Christ, Who, before ascending into heaven,
did promise to send the Holy Spirit to finish Your work
in the souls of Your Apostles and Disciples,
deign to grant the same Holy Spirit to me,
that He may perfect in my soul the work of Your grace and Your love.
Grant me the Spirit of Wisdom that I may despise the perishable things of this world
and aspire only after the things that are eternal;
the Spirit of Understanding to enlighten my mind with the light of Your divine truth;
the Spirit of Counsel that I may ever choose the surest way
of pleasing God and gaining Heaven;
the Spirit of Fortitude that I may bear my cross with You,
and that I may overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation;
the Spirit of Knowledge that I may know God and know myself
and grow perfect in the science of the Saints;
the Spirit of Piety that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable;
the Spirit of Fear that I may be filled with a loving reverence towards God,
and may dread in any way to displease Him.
Mark me, dear Lord, with the sign of Your true disciples
and animate me in all things with Your Spirit. Amen.

As we conclude the Easter season, may we never cease praising God for the gift of the Resurrection and the Sacraments by which we receive untold grace and the assurance of everlasting life!

Praying with the Holy Spirit

The language of prayer is mystery, the mystery of the encounter between the human soul and its Creator, the invisible God. Indeed, we scarcely need St. Paul to remind us that “we do not know how to pray as we ought” (Romans 8:26). So many of the circumstances of our lives can defy our poor power to respond in prayer. How do we sing of God’s goodness? How do we lament our deepest sorrows? How do we extoll God’s glory? What is the language that can express our love of God and our reception of God’s love for us?

The Holy Spirit can speak for us through the Scriptures. The Word of God is alive, because it was written under the inspiration of the Spirit. When we take those words upon our own lips, the Spirit speaks anew through us. Many traditional hymns and contemporary worship songs take their lyrics directly from the Scriptures too. Whether we speak or sing biblical texts, we can offer back to the Father, by the Spirit, God’s own perfect words.

Sometimes our prayer is beyond being captured by any words. This is when the prayer of our hearts can be made by the Spirit in language beyond our understanding, “with sighs too deep for words” (Romans 8:26). Try the following exercise that can help us to trust the Holy Spirit to pray in and through us.

Prayer Exercise

Come into a space of quiet. Become present to our ever-present God. Invite God to be with you.

Become aware of your breath. The very act of breathing is an expression of the presence of God, who sustains our lives in this moment and every moment. Remember, in Hebrew, Spirit and breath are the same word, ruah.

At our Baptism and Confirmation, God sends his Spirit to reside in us. As you sit in the quiet, notice how you experience the Spirit residing in you. Where in your body do you come to know the active presence of God? In your heart? Your mind? Your gut? Be aware of this truth: God lives in you by the Spirit, here, now.

Continue for as long as you feel called to be in the stillness, aware that God is with you. What might the Spirit be praying in and through you? Set words completely aside. Listen.

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

June 15, 2025

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

John 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples:
"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now.
But when he comes, the Spirit of truth,
he will guide you to all truth.
He will not speak on his own,
but he will speak what he hears,
and will declare to you the things that are coming.
He will glorify me,
because he will take from what is mine and
declare it to you.
Everything that the Father has is mine;
for this reason I told you that he will take from
what is mine
and declare it to you."

Reflection Questions

- How does the world make it hard for us to be Christians?
- When have you seen the world pressure people to conform?
- Why is having the Holy Spirit more important than having the physical Jesus with us?
- How does the Holy Spirit teach believers?
- How will you let the Holy Spirit guide you this week?
- Think of the last time you witnessed an act of selfless love in your family. Parents and caregivers of all kinds are called upon to act selflessly every day. Family life calls us to share selfless love with one another. God is the model for us of selfless love. There was no need for God to create our planet or the creatures that inhabit it; it was an act of selfless love. There was also no need for God to send his only Son to save us. That too was an act of selfless love. As we draw closer to God and the mystery of the Trinity, we learn about God's love. God has lavished us with love in the persons of the Son and the Spirit, who in turn nurture in us the desire to do the same. When we open ourselves to be filled with an awareness of the divine life within us, we participate in the endless spiral of love that leads to eternal life. Whenever we share selfless love in the family, we are sharing in the life of the Trinity.

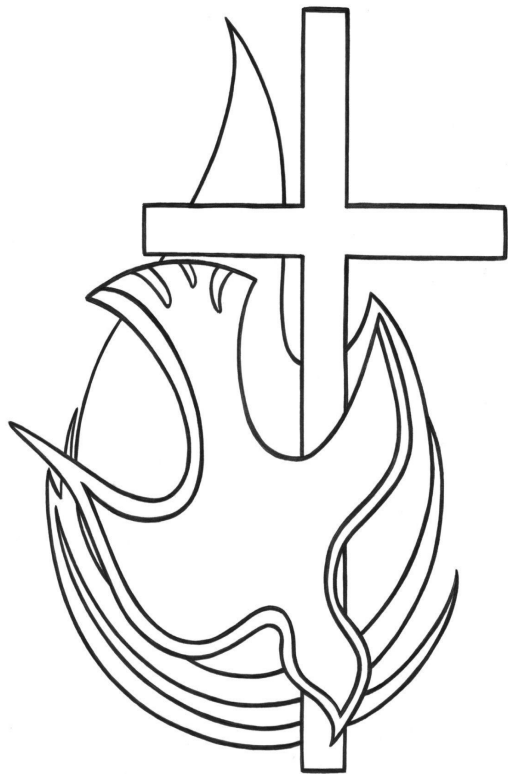

On the night before Jesus died, he promised the disciples that he would send the Holy Spirit to enlighten them, guide them, strengthen them, and give them everything they would need to carry the Good News to people all over the world. They didn't understand what this meant. But on Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit came like the wind and descended on the apostles gathered in the Upper Room. They were filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, they understood everything, and they immediately went out into the streets to tell people the Good News of Jesus Christ!

The Gifts of the Spirit

When the Holy Spirit descended on Pentecost, the apostles received the gifts of the Spirit. At baptism, we received the gifts of the Holy Spirit. These gifts are strengthened during the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Talk about one of the gifts of the Spirit during a meal this month.

Wisdom, to see the world as God sees it (not from our own perspective).

Understanding, to recognize that what lies below the surface is sometimes more important than what is obvious.

Judgment (counsel), to know the difference between right and wrong.

Courage (fortitude), to stand up for what is right.

Knowledge, to always seek the truth.

Reverence (piety), to recognize what is holy and sacred and the divine presence of God.

Wonder and awe (fear of the Lord), to appreciate the mysteries of life.

Keeping the Spirit Alive

The Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, is always with us, but sometimes we don't pay attention to the Spirit's presence. Here are some simple ways that you can keep the Holy Spirit alive in your home, your neighborhood and your parish.

Reflect on the Holy Spirit at mealtimes:

Why do you think it is important to have "wonder and awe" in our world today? What makes you feel wonder?

How do we use the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our lives today? (Example: We use courage when we stand up for a friend who is being teased.)

Share a time in your life when you felt as if the Holy Spirit was asking you to reach out to another person. How did you respond? What was the outcome?

What does it mean to be wise? Is it the same as smart? Who do we know who is truly wise?

What is one way each of us will "share the Spirit" this week?
