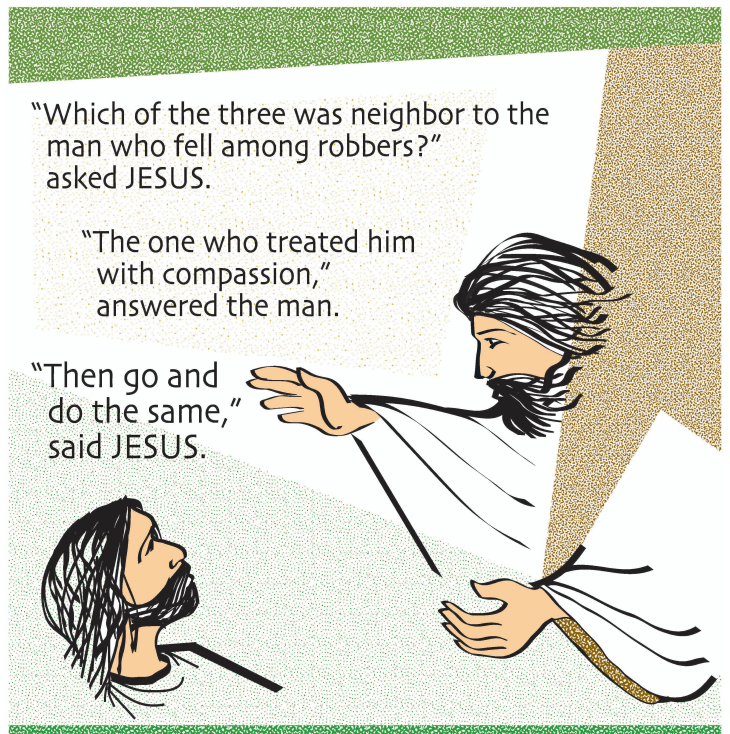

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Friends,

Over the past few months, some parishioners have asked me about the public memorial to commemorate those who have given generously to our ***We Remember! We Celebrate! We Believe!*** Capital Campaign. When we launched that initiative, I said that we would have a dignified display in gratitude for the many families who have helped to make the dreams of our parish campus come to fruition.

I'd like to explain a few reasons for the delay in the memorial for that historic building campaign. First, the memorial was envisioned to be created at the conclusion of the redemption phase of the project. That is, we had a five-year redemption period for parishioners to pay off their intended pledge, so the earliest we would have created the memorial was last year. The memorial acknowledges what was paid, not necessarily what was pledged. Some people weren't able to pay their entire pledge; others were able to exceed it over the five years. In short, we had to await the final numbers before we could create the display.

Second, the location of the memorial will be the left wall of the lobby (vestibule) of the church as you enter. However, behind that wall we have recently created a new confessional in the room which used to be the receptionist office. We did extensive work sealing up windows and doors. I didn't want to install a memorial only to have it taken down to accommodate the new confessional and then have to replace the memorial.

Finally, and the most pressing reason for the delay, is the complication of the memorials themselves. The campaign that I led was the fourth over 30 years for the parish. The memorial plaques commemorating previous major campaigns for the good of the parish, and that used to hang in the lobby, are in storage. We want to find a way to incorporate into one handsome memorial all the efforts over the decades.

I met with our parish Trustees and Finance Committee last month and tasked them with reviewing all the contributions from all the campaigns and present a final list for my review and approval. Once we have that, I will immediately get going on the memorial. In short, I ask for your continued patience as we work to complete this initiative.

Have a blessed week, and I hope you enjoy this summer weather!

As our parish's fiscal year comes to a close this August and as we prepare for the year ahead, it is a good time to reflect on why we give to the church?

People give to the church for a variety of reasons, often rooted in faith, gratitude, and a desire to support the church's mission. Giving is seen as an act of worship, a way to express gratitude to God, and a way to support the church's work in the community and beyond.

1. Giving as an act of worship and gratitude:

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 10:38-42

Jesus entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me."

The Lord said to her in reply,
"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

Reflection Questions

- In every family (and church family) there are a range of personalities. Some people are more task-focused (they love ticking things off lists), while others are more people-focused (more interested in talking and more relaxed about getting stuff done). Each characteristic has its strengths and benefits. Which do you tend more towards?
- It seems Martha was more task-focused, while Mary was more people-focused. In this account, what did Martha get right? What did she get wrong?
- In what ways and to what extent do you find you get "distracted" from listening to Jesus?
- Martha's complaint (v40b) forces Jesus to comment upon the different behavior of the two sisters and he says Mary has chosen what is 'better'. What does this tell us about what sort of relationship Jesus wants with us, his followers?
- Imagine Jesus speaking v 41-42a, but replace Martha's name with your own. Hear him saying it to you... "_____, _____ you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed – or indeed only one." What do you think Jesus is appealing to you to change – to stop doing or worrying about, to start doing or refocus on?
