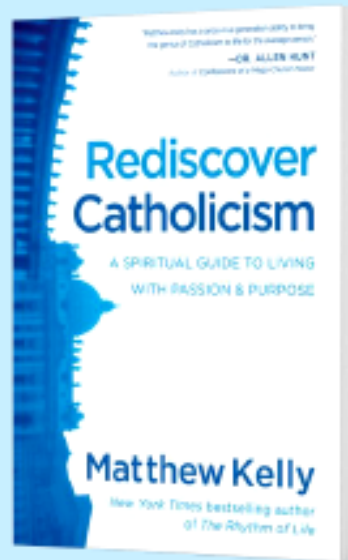

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

August 31, 2025

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Reflection Questions

- In the Kingdom of God, we are to follow the will of God. According to this parable, what kind of people are invited to the Kingdom of God?
- What did Jesus notice in Luke 14:7? How did Jesus respond to that situation (Luke 14:8-10)?
- While Jesus was dining at the house of the ruler of the Pharisee, what behavior did Jesus notice that compelled him to share a parable?
- What does it mean to 'exalt oneself'? Give an example.
- What does it mean to 'humbles himself'? Give an example.
- The hardest time to activate these principles in real life is when everyone else around you does not observe them. It is at this point that one can feel 'left out' or forgotten by God. How does this verse build up our faith so that we can rightly live out our lives by humbling ourselves?

HOMILY – SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the beautiful Solemnity of the **Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, body and soul into heaven. The Church holds this feast with such joy because it is not just about Mary—it is about our destiny too. Mary's life shows us what happens when we say *yes* to God completely: we will share fully in His victory over sin and death.

In the Book of Revelation, we hear of the “woman clothed with the sun” and “crowned with twelve stars.” The Church sees this woman as Mary—the one chosen to bring the Savior into the world, and the first to share completely in His glory. St. Paul in the second reading reminds us that *Christ is the first fruits of the resurrection*, and after Him, all who belong to Him will share in that glory. Mary, being the closest to Jesus, is the first to experience this in fullness.

In the Gospel, we see a very human, very beautiful scene. Mary has just received the message of the angel. She carries Jesus in her womb—the first **tabernacle** in history! And immediately, she goes to serve Elizabeth. This is the secret of Mary's greatness: she does not keep the presence of Jesus for herself—she brings Him to others.

When Mary greets Elizabeth, something remarkable happens. The Holy Spirit fills Elizabeth, and the child in her womb—John the Baptist—leaps for joy. And maybe here we can imagine a little smile—John the Baptist, we could say, became the *first Olympic champion in the “prenatal high jump” category!*

But there is something deeper here. Wherever Mary goes, she brings **the Spirit of joy**. She makes people rejoice, because she brings Jesus. Elizabeth does not say, “Oh, Mary, how great you are.” No—

she says, "*Blessed are you who believed!*" She appreciates Mary for her faith, for saying "yes" to God.

So here is the question for us today: **Are we people who bring the Spirit of joy to others?** When we walk into a room, do we bring peace, hope, and encouragement—or do we bring complaints, criticism, and negativity? Do we make others "leap for joy" in their hearts because they feel the presence of Christ in us?

And another question: **Do we appreciate people, like Elizabeth did?**

Elizabeth noticed the faith of Mary and blessed her for it. In our families, in our parish, in our workplace—how often do we say to someone: "*I thank God for you*"? How often do we encourage rather than tear down? Sometimes a single word of appreciation can be the "leap of joy" someone needs to keep going.

Mary's Assumption reminds us that this life is a journey toward heaven. And on the way, like Mary, we are called to be *living tabernacles*, carrying Christ in our hearts and sharing Him with others.

So, on this feast day, let us ask Mary to help us be people of joy. Let us appreciate one another. Let us carry Christ to our brothers and sisters, so that one day, like Mary, we too may share fully in the glory of heaven.

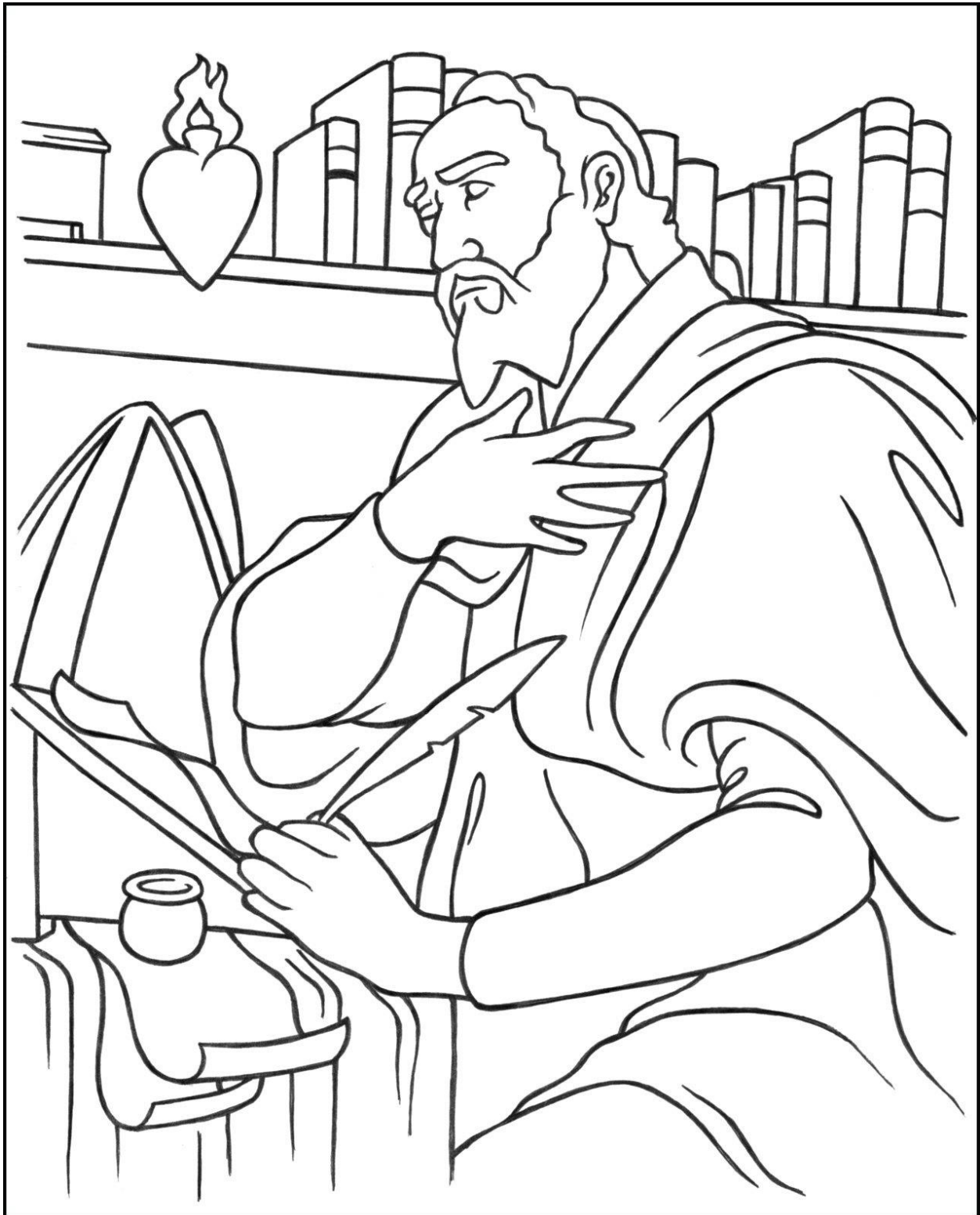
