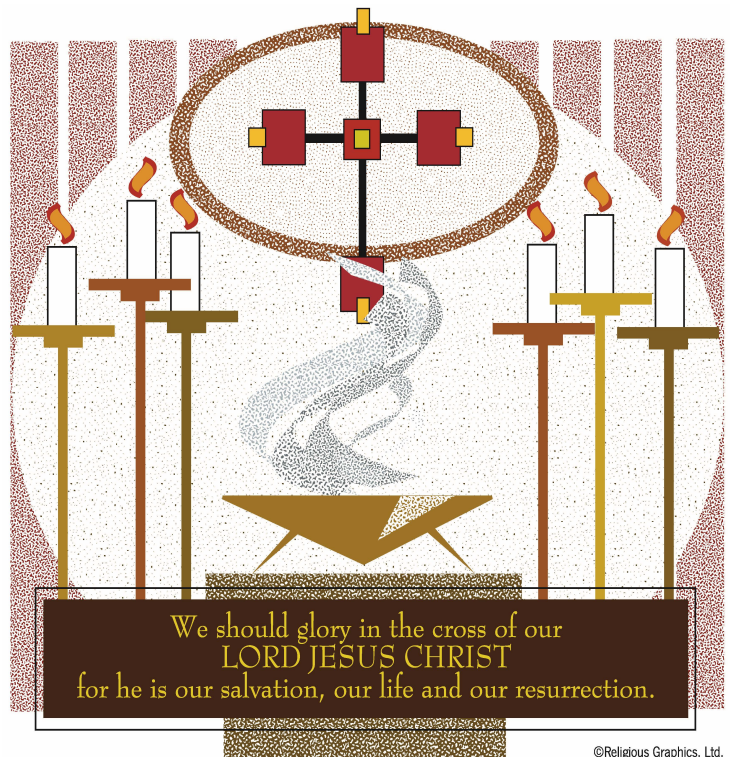

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we reach the midway point in September, we're drawing closer to the end of the 2025 calendar year. While I don't want to rush time away, I do need to bring to your attention an important issue that affects both our parish and our diocese. The Annual Catholic Ministries Appeal! This enables the Catholic community of Long Island to fulfill our Gospel mandate to instruct people about our Faith, to help those in need, and to ensure that vibrant ministries endure. The goal of each parish is determined by the capacity of that community, and it takes into account the many financial demands of each family. As of now, our parish is at only 50% of our overall goal. With fewer than three months to go I ask, if you have not already done so, that you consider prayerfully being a part of this crucial endeavor. Believe me, I realize that there are many appeals for your financial assistance throughout the year, and I am so very grateful for your continued support. However, the CMA is critical to the life of our diocese, and every gift makes a difference.

As many of you know, for several years of my priesthood prior to becoming pastor, I had four assignments simultaneously – Vice Rector of our Seminary in Huntington, Director of Diaconate Formation, Catholic Chaplain at Hofstra University, and Associate Director for Interreligious Affairs. All these ministries were funded completely by the Catholic Ministries Appeal. So, I experienced firsthand the effect of your generosity. Whether its training men who will serve as deacons, or helping college students retain and deepen their faith, or having resources for Catholic retreats and conferences locally, the CMA fund does extraordinary work to build up the Church and equip men and women to be heralds of the Gospel.

Again, I know you have many financial obligations already. But I assure you that the contribution you make to the Catholic Ministries Appeal will have a profound effect on the life of someone you likely will never meet. To paraphrase St. Teresa of Avila, yours are the hands and feet and voice of Christ today. All of us, the Mystical Body of Christ, are the means by which people encounter Jesus.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

The one symbol most often identified with Jesus and his Church is the cross.

Today we celebrate The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast traces its beginning to Jerusalem and the dedication of the church built on the site of Mount Calvary in 335. But the meaning of the cross is deeper than any city, any celebration, any building. The cross is a sign of suffering, a sign of human cruelty at its worst. But by Christ's love shown in the Paschal Mystery, it has become the sign of triumph and victory, the sign of God, who is love itself. Believers have always looked to the cross in times of suffering. People in concentration camps, in prisons, in hospitals, in any place of suffering and loneliness, have been known to draw, trace, or form crosses and focus their eyes and hearts on them. The cross does not explain pain and misery. It does not give us any easy answers. But it does help us to see our lives united with Christ's. We often make the Sign of the Cross over ourselves. We make it before prayer to help fix our minds and hearts on God. We make it after prayer, hoping to stay close to God. In trials and temptations, the cross is a sign of strength and protection. The cross is the sign of the fullness of life that is ours. At Baptism, too, the Sign of the Cross is used; the priest, parents, and godparents make the sign on the forehead of the child. A sign made on the forehead is a sign of belonging. By the Sign of the Cross in Baptism, Jesus takes us as his own in a unique way. Today, let us look to the cross often. Let us make the Sign of the Cross and realize we bring our whole selves to God—our minds, souls, bodies, wills, thoughts, hearts—everything we are and will become.

O cross, you are the glorious sign of our victory. Through your power may we share in the triumph of Christ Jesus.

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

September 21, 2025

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 16:1-13

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.' He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently.

"For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth?

If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

Reflection Questions

- Define the word "shrewd". Why was the manager being fired and in what way did he show shrewdness?
- Jesus was not commending the manager on his dishonesty, but was commending him for what instead?
- How does being faithful with a little lead to being faithful with a lot? How is faithfulness impacted by taking an eternal perspective
- Is there anyplace in my life that God is calling me to take drastic action right now with the abundance He has given me?
- How am I currently using the wealth God has gifted me to help others in need and to spread the gospel?

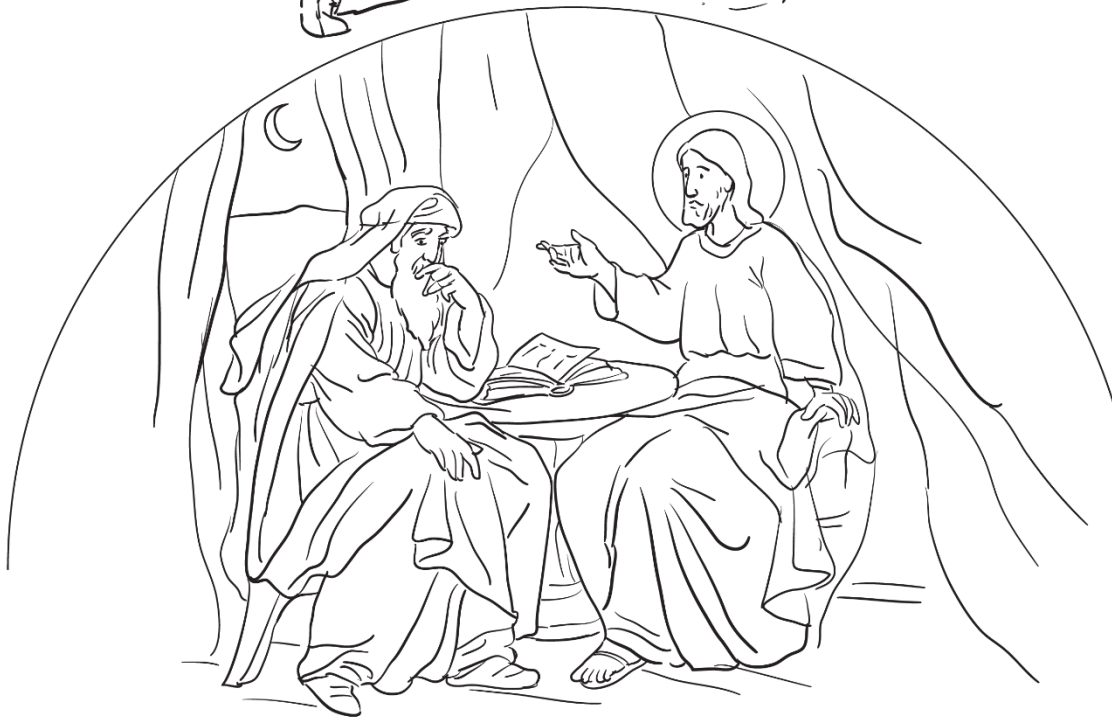
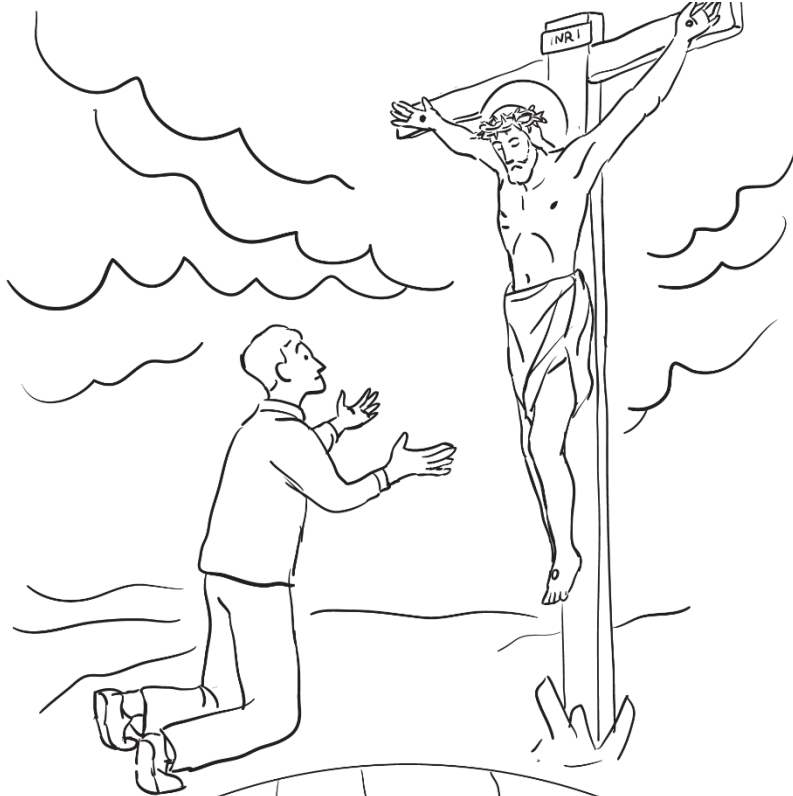
