A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Over the past couple of weeks, a good many of us have described ourselves as being in a fog or as having a sense of heaviness. We are still reeling from the tragedy at Annunciation Catholic School in Minneapolis, the Remembrance of 9/11 and, now of course, the senseless murder of Charlie Kirk – on live TV, in front of thousands of onlookers. While I don't think there is much sense in trying to rank tragedies, it is undeniable that the assassination of Mr. Kirk has affected so many millions, both here in America and around the world, in a particularly powerful way. Why? I imagine it is because we saw a man, whose life ambition was to get people talking together in the pursuit of truth, cut down so brutally, simply for speaking. Charlie stood for the peaceful exchange of ideas – debate – in order to arrive at what is truly best for people and nations.

While not Catholic, Charlie was what I would call a “very friendly next-door neighbor” to Catholicism. A devout Evangelical Christian, he had a great deal of respect for our faith and its teachings. He often remarked that the social policies that he avowed were rooted in his Christian faith but could still be defended from non-theological positions. What made Charlie so successful was the very basic truth that the best way for civilization to improve, and thrive, was through robust conversation. Words have meaning and power that can change hearts and draw them into what is right and good.

In the aftermath of Charlie's death, we have seen an outpouring of support for his widow, children, parents, and family. The touching tributes, that have poured in for this 31-year-old man taken so suddenly and violently from his loved ones, have inspired many to take up his call to peaceful dialogue. We have also seen horrific responses that have celebrated his death, and even called it “good.” We have to be clear on this: it is gravely sinful to celebrate the murder of someone who has been killed unjustly simply for saying things some might disagree with or feel are wrong. Such comments have no place in a civilized society and run directly counter to Gospel teaching.

How can we respond to this tragedy? First, we have to pray. Pray for the family of Charlie Kirk and all victims of violence. Pray that hearts and minds will change and become more peaceful and open to all that is good. Second, we have to be agents of peace and truth in our own small portions of the world. Recall the beautiful prayer of St. Francis of Assisi – “Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me so love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.”

May those who grieve be consoled, and may we have the same faith as Charlie to hear the words of the Savior and take them to heart: *“Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven.”* God bless you and your family!

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

September 28, 2025

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 16:19-31

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.'

But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

Reflection Questions

- Why do you think it is significant that Lazarus is given a name and the rich man is not? What might Jesus be trying to communicate by giving Lazarus a name?
- What does this passage teach us about wealth?
- What does the rich man's words in the afterlife communicate about how he views Lazarus? What might this suggest about the rich man's views about himself and God?
- What are the lessons Jesus might be trying to teach us in this parable about wealth? Death? Life in the here and now?
- What lessons might Jesus want to teach you through this parable today in what you're going through?
