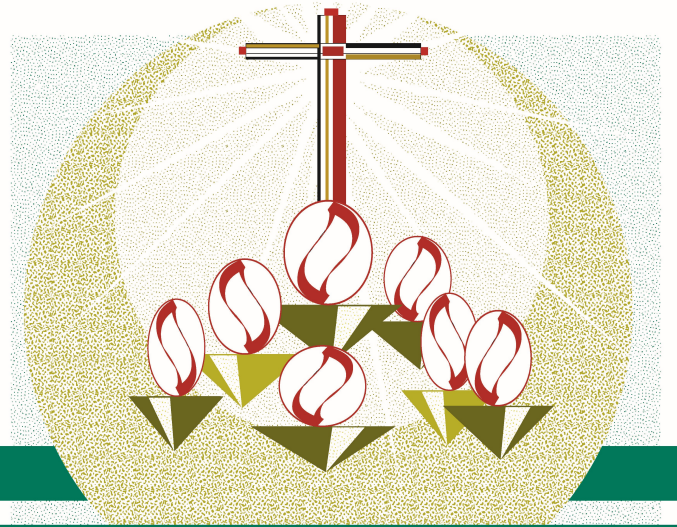

## A Message from our Pastor



Dear Friends,

As we enter the month of October, and to help mark this particular time of year, there are several things about which I wish to remind you. First, October is dedicated to a renewed appreciation of the Rosary. The Rosary is one of the most important and reliable prayers we Catholics have in our spiritual arsenal. As you have heard me say many times before, we have no better advocate, or intercessor, than the Mother of our Savior. She was the first to receive the Word of God into her very body, conceived Him by the Holy Spirit, and she nurtured that life entrusted to her care to His maturity. As a mother loves her son, so our Blessed Mother adores our Savior, and she, undoubtedly, holds a special place in His heart for her. Thus, it stands to reason that her requests have significant weight. As we say “pray for us sinners now...,” we are asking Our Lady to bring our petitions to the foot of the cross. We should do so with confidence and joy. So, whether or not the Rosary has been part of your spiritual regimen, it is a great time now to take it up anew and entrust yourself more deeply to the intercession of Mary, the Mother of Christ and the Church.

In a particular way, we need to ask Our Lady to move hearts from violence to peace. The recent tragedy at a Mormon Church in Michigan, and the many other similar instances, are reminders to us of the reality of evil in our world. The Blessed Mother is often depicted as crushing underfoot the head of the serpent – Satan. We call Mary the “New Eve” since, as Eve fell prey to the attractive lies of the evil one and, along with Adam, broke the covenant with God, Mary restores what was lost by her continual *fiat* to the Lord’s will. Evil still remains a part of our human condition. So, we must never become complacent in our spiritual warfare, and we must continue to pray for, and work towards, greater peace in our world. Mary is our most critical ally in that matter.

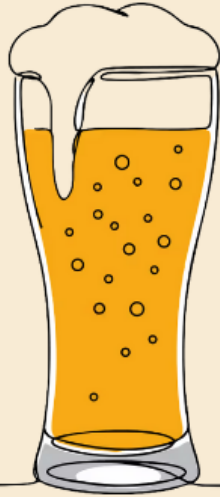
Another October dedication is to the Pro-Life Movement. While great strides have been made since the Supreme Court’s *Dobbs v. Jackson* Decision, there is still so much that must be done in our State to ensure the welfare of every human life, from conception to natural death. If we say we are Pro-Life, that means we must do everything we can to help those women, who find themselves in the position of an unplanned or unwanted pregnancy, to bring their child to full term and, if they so choose, to raise that child safely and with dignity. Prayer is a good start, but we also have to commit financially to this endeavor if we are going to make a difference. From our special diocesan collection this weekend to the programs here at our parish, our commitment must be unwavering to help all people see the intrinsic value of human life. Thank you for your efforts!

Be assured of my prayers for you, your family, and your intentions this week. Please keep me and my brother priests and deacons in yours as well.

**Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?**

*October 12, 2025*

*Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

*Luke 17:11-19*

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him. They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" And when he saw them, he said, "Go show yourselves to the priests." As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus said in reply, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

*Reflection Questions*

- "They stood at a distance" Share a time when you "stood at a distance."
- Leprosy was a hideous disease. It robbed people of their identity, separated them from their loved ones, from human touch itself, and from hope. What modern diseases or situations do the same thing or similar things to people? How can we minister to them?
- Jesus healed other lepers and then sent them to the priests to go through the purification process so they could re-enter the community. Why did Jesus do the opposite with these lepers? Why did he send them to the priests first, and then heal them on the way?
- "One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice." (vs. 15) What are you grateful to God for?
- Have you risen to the level of gratitude where you are grateful, not to God or for your blessings, but grateful for God? How can we express this level of gratitude to God?

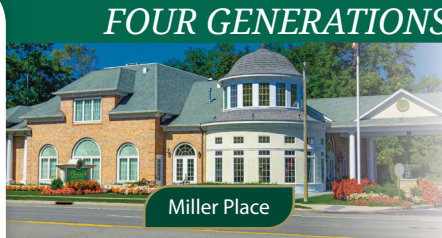
