A Message from our Pastor



Dear Friends,

Last Sunday, at Our Lady of Carmel Parish in Patchogue, I had the joy of joining a few people from our parish to honor catechists who have been serving in our Religious Education Program for a significant number of years. Danielle Krusen was recognized for completing 10 years as a catechist. She is one of 36 parishioners sharing her enthusiasm for our faith with the children in our community. We also wish to congratulate our Director of Religious Education, Patty Longo, on serving as a catechetical leader here at St. Gerard's, and previously at Mary Immaculate in Bellport, for a combined 25 years! I know you join me in thanking her for her tireless work to help, not only the kids in our program, but indeed the hundreds of families that make their way through Faith Formation here every year. May God bless and reward all our faithful catechists!

Hard as it may be to believe, next weekend begins November! While All Saints' Day is not a holy day of obligation this year, it is still a most important feast for us to commemorate. On this feast, we celebrate the heroes of our faith who "have fought the good fight, finished the race, have kept the faith" (cf. 2 Tim 4:7-8). They are intercessors for us and models of perseverance amid the challenges to discipleship that beset us all. As I have shared before, one of the best pieces of advice I received in seminary was to get to know some saints whose lives were similar to mine and also to learn about saints whose lives were radically different. Doing so helps us to understand that the paths to holiness are as varied as we are. Our vocations, gifts, struggles, contexts, and personal histories may be substantially different from others, but we're all called to follow the voice of the Good Shepherd Who leads us into the green pastures of paradise.

On Sunday, we celebrate the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, more commonly referred to as All Souls' Day. It's good that this feast falls on a Sunday this year because it gives us the opportunity to delve into the great gift of Purgatory after death. Purgatory is that state of being wherein we are purified of all the imperfections of this life and learn perfectly how to be loved and to love. In so doing, we reach the goal of our life: union with God for eternity. We will certainly be praying for all our beloved dead during next weekend's Masses, and it also commences the tradition of a month-long remembrance of all the souls in Purgatory.

May you have a blessed week and be inspired by the saints who have gone before us to be with the Lord!

November 2, 2025

The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed

John 6:37-40

Jesus said to the crowds:

"Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to me, because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me.

And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day. For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day."

Reflection Questions

- What did Jesus say He would never do to those who came to Him?
- Why did Jesus come down from heaven?
- What did Jesus say is the Father's will?
- Jesus said that whoever came to him would not hunger or thirst or be cast out. Have you experienced Jesus satisfying your spiritual hunger and thirst? How would you describe that?
- Jesus came to satisfy our spiritual hunger and thirst. What kinds of things distract you from him? What kind of things do you seek satisfaction in?
- What can you do today to rely on God, rather than on things or people, to satisfy your needs?

St. Gerard Majella Handkerchiefs

Only one instance is recorded of St. Gerard curing an expectant mother of her illness while he was alive, but there were many women who claimed that they and their children were granted graces through the prayers of Gerard. The famous "handkerchief story" goes like this: While he was leaving the house of a family he had gone to visit, he dropped his handkerchief. A young woman retrieved it, but as she handed it to him, Gerard told her mysteriously, "Keep it. One day it will be of service to you." Although puzzled, the woman did keep it. And a few years later, she faced life threatening complications as she was about to give birth to her first child. She remembered the mysterious hanky and the promise, and asked that it be brought to her in her travail. She held it to her womb and immediately the pain ceased and she delivered a normal, healthy child. Are you or someone you know expecting, trying to conceive, or ill? St. Gerard Handkerchiefs and prayer cards are available for pickup at the front office.

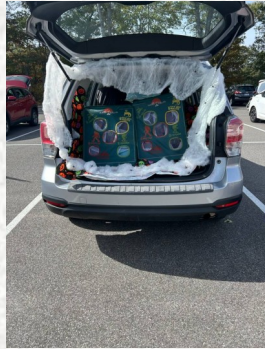



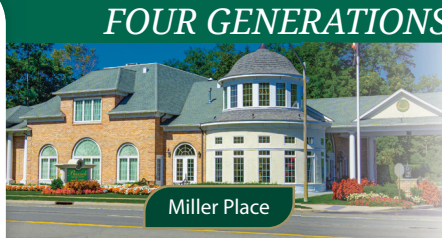
