A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Some of you are probably aware that our sister parish, Infant Jesus, will be celebrating its 125th Anniversary in 2028. We launched a capital campaign this past Spring aimed at enhancing both the church and the chapel at St. Charles Hospital. Since many people in the wider community attend the noon Mass there and stop in when visiting a loved one in the hospital I wanted to share this important information with you all.

I am very excited to announce that renovations to the chapel of St. Charles Hospital will commence this week! The renovations, involving different phases of work, will take roughly six months. The first phase will be painting the entire chapel. Beginning this Monday, November 24th, the chapel will be closed entirely Monday-Friday until December 19th. The noon Mass will be held in the Wisdom Conference Center, which is located to the right of Good Shepherd Hospice through the cobblestone path. There will be a few days in December when the noon Mass cannot be celebrated, but those dates will be advertised in advance. Hospital personnel and the chaplains will ensure that all staff, patients, and visitors will have access to the sacraments during this time. Weekend Masses in the chapel will be unaffected. I regret, however, that we will have to suspend adoration and benediction on Fridays until the work is completed. Our church on Myrtle Avenue will be open on Fridays until 6:30 PM for those who wish to pray there before the Blessed Sacrament. I appreciate everyone's understanding. We've all experienced home improvement projects, and there are often interruptions to the routine for a time but with a great result at the end of those labors.

At the start of the New Year, several more phases of the renovation will take place. This will include replacing the light fixtures, renovating the sanctuary floor, improvements to the reredos (the structure which holds the crucifix), and other cosmetic enhancements to the chapel. It is our hope that we will not need to close the chapel during this portion of the work, as we will likely be able to make a few adjustments to allow for Mass and other times of prayer

The final major work will take place, likely after Easter, which will entail closing the chapel entirely for about a month. This is when the existing pews will be removed, a new floor laid throughout the nave of the chapel, and the new pews installed. As you can imagine, those weeks will require changes to the normal schedule of Masses and other services. More information will be forthcoming as we approach Lent. Overall, our objective is to have the work done well, efficiently, and with as little impact as possible on the chapel's usual schedule.

This week, of course, we pause for our collective Thanksgiving celebrations. My heart is especially full of gratitude for the many generous families of our parish who help to make St. Gerard's the vibrant community of faith that it is. No matter where or with whom you celebrate this week, know that your parish family holds you in prayer. Please be sure to pray for your fellow parishioners as well.

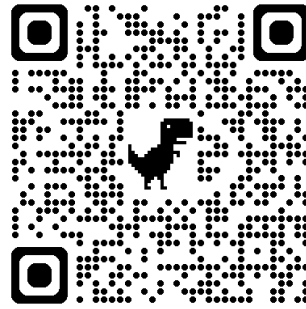

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

November 30, 2025

First Sunday of Advent

Matthew 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples:

"As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Reflection Questions

- What were people doing in Noah's day, and how does this contrast with the need for spiritual readiness?
- What does the "taking away" in verse 39 signify in the context of judgment, and how does this differ from other interpretations?
- What does it mean, practically, to be "ready" for Jesus' return?
- How can we apply the warning to "stay awake" in our daily lives?
- How does the unpredictability of the Lord's return (v. 42) challenge us to live faithfully each day?
- What qualities do Jesus say His servants will need to be ready for His coming?
- What is the significance of Jesus identifying himself as the "Son of Man" who comes with judgment?

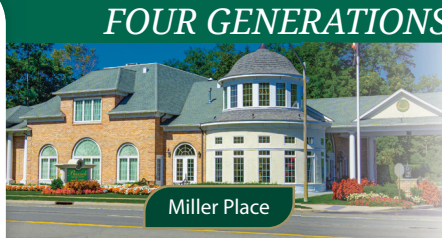
