Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters.

In 2019, Pope Francis issued a directive to the Universal Church that the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time – this weekend – be designated as **Word of God Sunday**. It is meant to remind us of the centrality of the Scriptures to our lives as Christians. We Catholics are sometimes caricatured as not knowing the Bible. While that is basically untrue, I think it is fair to say that most Catholics are probably more aware of the Church's teachings on a variety of issues – morality, the saints, Mass, etc. – than they might be about various aspects of the Old and New Testaments. But that doesn't have to be the case. As Catholics, we appreciate what are called the two "fonts" of God's Revelation to His people. The first is the inspired Word of God – the Bible – and the second is the Tradition of the Church and her ongoing instruction on the Christian life in light of the Scriptures. St. Jerome, who famously translated the Scriptures from Greek to Latin –the basis for the translation into all other languages – once said that "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ." So, how can we revive or deepen our knowledge of, and love for, the sacred Word of God? Allow me to offer a few suggestions.

In our **Weekly Bulletin**, there is a page that has the Gospel for the upcoming weekend along with some reflection questions. Preparing ourselves for Mass each Sunday by reading the Gospel is a wonderful way for us to enter more easily into the scene with Jesus. Coupled with the homily at Mass, hopefully we are then able to understand the lesson that Christ wishes to impart. Also, there are many online resources that can nourish us with a daily diet of Scripture. The **Hallow App** has become famous for offering a variety of spiritual programs. Among them is the famous **Bible in a Year with Fr. Mike Schmitz**. I know many people who have persevered with this program and have found that it was not only informative intellectually, but that it has also helped them spiritually. It has allowed them to see the whole of the Bible in its context and the message of God's Word in its entirety. We also have **FORMED**, the website/app that has, among many things, a great series of videos on various books of the Bible. If you haven't done so already, visit formed.org and take advantage of what's available and what might pique your interest.

When someone decides to take his or her discipleship more seriously, one of the first things they often do is to start reading Scripture more seriously. Odd as this may sound coming from a priest, I have advised them against doing that initially. Of course, I want people to read the Bible, but I caution that a good commentary, or introduction, is crucial to appreciating and understanding fully the meaning of various Books of the Bible. At minimum, Christians should read and reread the four Gospels, as these are the backbone of all Revelation – the Life, Ministry, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. If we are going to follow the Master, we need to know the Master. We need to know what He said, how He lived, what He did and how He approached a variety of people and situations. In short, if we say Jesus is the center of our lives, we need to know Jesus.

It's still January so, if you haven't made any resolutions or goals for 2026, perhaps delving into the Bible more regularly, and intentionally, would be a great one. I have no doubt it will strengthen your faith and bring you the abiding peace that can come only from Christ.

February 1, 2026

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:1-12a

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

- What is the meaning of being merciful? What is a merciful person like?
- Have you seen God or the glory of God with your spiritual eyes? Where? When? In what way?
- How does God view His children? What privileges do we have as His children?

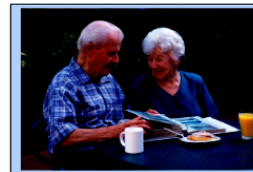

Charitable Donations



The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

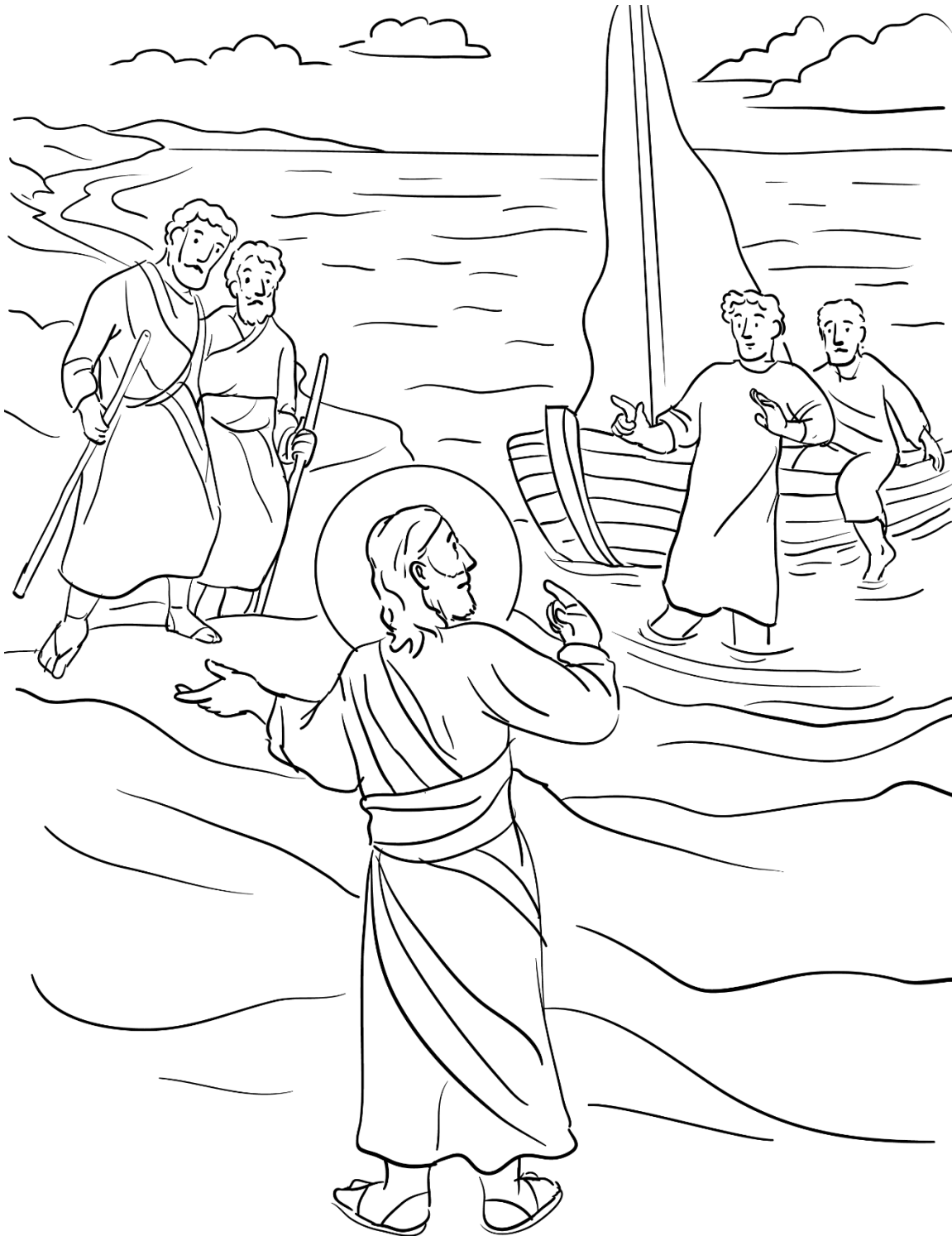

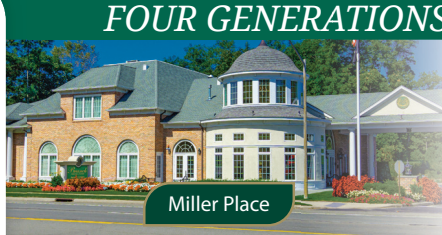
