A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

Having been marked with ashes on our foreheads – a sign of repentance – we have begun our Lenten journey. This weekend, we hear that familiar account of Jesus' journey into the desert where He is tempted by the Evil One. Satan has many titles, one of them being "Father of Lies." That is what he does – he lies to us in order to discourage us from staying united with Jesus. The devil's only desire is that we become separated from God. Just as he tempted our first parents, Adam and Eve, he never ceases to try to bring misery and discord in order that he might undo God's glorious and perfect plan for creation. How do we fight against that evil? Jesus gives us the perfect example – remain united with God by listening to HIS voice above all others.

The Lenten Journey is marked by Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. These are the three classic practices which we should already be doing regularly but now, in these days of Lent, with a concerted effort. As you are thinking "*What am I going to do*" for the next six weeks, allow me, as I've done before, to offer "Top 10 Suggestions for Lent."

1. What to give up for Lent? Start with sin. Is there some sin you struggle with – like gossip, watching inappropriate things on TV or online, being judgmental, or something else? What a great thing to give that up once and for all!
2. If you're able, park farther away from a store, and offer the extra steps for someone you know who is carrying a heavy cross right now.
3. Read the four Gospels – Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John – over the course of Lent. Reading a short passage each day will result in your knowing Jesus so much better by Easter.
4. Commit to saying the Rosary each day in Lent. Taking 15-20 minutes to reflect on Jesus' life and asking Our Blessed Mother's intercession is invaluable.
5. Download the "Hallow App" or another Catholic prayer app to help foster a deeper spirit of prayer.
6. Come to the Stations of the Cross at least once during Lent.
7. Join us for our Parish Lenten Mission. (Details are in this bulletin.)
8. Try to increase your financial support of our parish and other charitable organizations.
9. If you're not regularly getting to Sunday Mass, make it a point of doing so every week. If you already attend Mass each Sunday, try to go additionally once or twice during the week this Lent.
10. Write a letter each week – yes, a handwritten letter! – to someone you've lost touch with over time. Maybe a former teacher, coach, mentor, high school friend, or former neighbor. Let them know you're still thinking of them and are grateful for them!

When I was serving as Catholic Chaplain at Hofstra University, one of the rabbis there asked me if there was a traditional greeting for Ash Wednesday. Chuckling a little, I told him that there isn't any. After a thoughtful moment, he responded, "Then may you have a meaningful Lent." That's my prayer for you and your family – make this Lent meaningful!

Family Prayers for Lent

One of the real challenges that we too often find in our busy lives is finding time to be together as a family. It is especially difficult to find opportunities to pray together. Here are a few possibilities for praying as a family during Lent or at any other time of the year.

Prayer before Meals

Meals are a natural time to pray as a family. We can begin by simply saying, "Let's pray," or "Let's pause for a minute to give thanks." This can be a brief prayer. Brief prayer doesn't have to be without substance or power.

Praying at Other Times

In the Morning: It can be quite transformative of our family bonds, in faith, to pause very briefly to pray together in the morning. This might be a spontaneous prayer, such as while we are lying in bed. When we are rushing around one another in the kitchen and grabbing breakfast, it can be wonderful to pause to pray and simply ask the Lord to be with each of us in what we are about to do.

Other times: Such as cleaning up or in preparation for guests coming for dinner or for an overnight slumber party. We might share the responsibility for designing the family prayer for special occasions: birthdays, anniversaries, the beginning and end of a school year, the beginning of a new endeavor.

Simple Rituals

We can easily add gestures that bring powerful prayer to our family life. One of the simplest and most natural gestures is to trace a cross on a loved one's forehead.

Praying for One Another

The most important part of family prayer is perhaps the easiest to overlook: how we hold one another up to the Lord. Even when we are not physically together as a praying family, we want to pray for one another. May our Lord bless our praying, especially at home, in the community of our family, in these days of Lent.

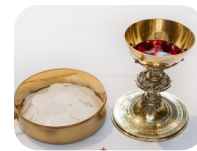

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

March 1, 2026

Second Sunday of Lent Matthew 17:1-9

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

Reflection Questions

- What does "After six days" refer to? What does the presence of Moses and Elijah signify about Jesus' authority and fulfillment of the Law/ Prophets?
- What does Peter's desire to build three shelters reveal about his understanding of Jesus' divine glory versus His future suffering? How did Moses' and Elijah's experience of suffering and God's glory in the Old Testament enable them to be witnesses to Jesus at this time?
- Why did God's voice from the cloud emphasize "Listen to Him," and what does this command mean for us today?
- How does the command to keep this vision secret until after the Resurrection shape our understanding of spiritual experiences and God's timing?
- How does this glimpse of Jesus' divine glory prepare the disciples (and us) for His coming suffering and future glorious return?

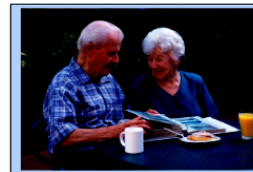

Charitable Donations



The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

Church Volunteer Requirements

As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete the following requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- Attend a Protecting God's Children class (this is a LIVE and interactive workshop with facilitation that is done in person or virtually via Zoom or like platforms)
- Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct, which is provided during the Virtus registration process.
- Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application background offered during the Virtus registration process.
- Read and review the [Diocesan Child Protection Policy](#)

To begin the process, register online for a LIVE workshop and create a Virtus account. To do this, you **MUST have an email you can access that is unique to you. You will also need to provide your social security number for the background check portion.**

Steps are as follows:

1. Go to www.virtus.org and select "First-time Registrant"
 - o If you already have an account, this is also where you can also sign in and access.
 - o If you are unsure if you have an account, please contact the Virtus helpdesk at 1-888-847-8870 for assistance before proceeding
2. Then click "begin the registration process"
3. Select organization via the drop-down menu **the organization is "Rockville Centre, NY - Safe Environment (Diocese)"**
4. Select "No" to the question, "Have you previously registered with VIRTUS Online?" (If your answer is yes, you must recover your login and will not be able to proceed)
5. Now you will be prompted to create a user ID and password.
6. Now you will fill out your profile. Answer the questions/fields to the best of your ability.
 - o Please be specific about your role/title (e.g. do not just state "volunteer," but state in which area, such as, CATECHIST, COACH, USHER, CHORALE, PARISH COUNCIL, ETC.)
 - o Please include **ALL** parishes/diocesan entities you will be volunteering in beginning with your primary one.
 - o Make sure to check off that you will be working with minors if you will be (religious ed catechists , CYO, music, altar servers **must** check yes for this)
- o During the process you will also have to digitally acknowledge our two codes of conduct. It is recommended that you also download, print, and review them asap.
7. At the end of making your profile, you will select which Virtus session you would like to attend
 - o Please make sure to see if there are any notes (like session conducted in another language) before committing to a date and location
 - o You do **NOT** have to register for a session being conducted in the parish in which you plan to volunteer.
8. Once you register for a Virtus session, you will be prompted to proceed to the Background Screening Platform
 - o Your email will be carried over from the Virtus application and you will need to create another account with this email and a new password (if your Virtus password is secure enough, you may want to use the same one, otherwise you will need to make a new password that is secure).
 - o Follow the prompts to include your name, social security number, contact information, and current address.
9. Once you have successfully completed the background check application, your full profile will be complete and all that there will be left to do is attend the Virtus workshop. Once that happens, you will be fully Safe Environment Compliant.

Please note, that in most cases you will not have to re-take Virtus and you may always access your profile via the credentials you provided at time of registration. **However**, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all those who remain in active ministry **be rescreened at 5 year intervals** whether volunteering or employed. You should be prompted via email when it is time to submit to a new background screening.
